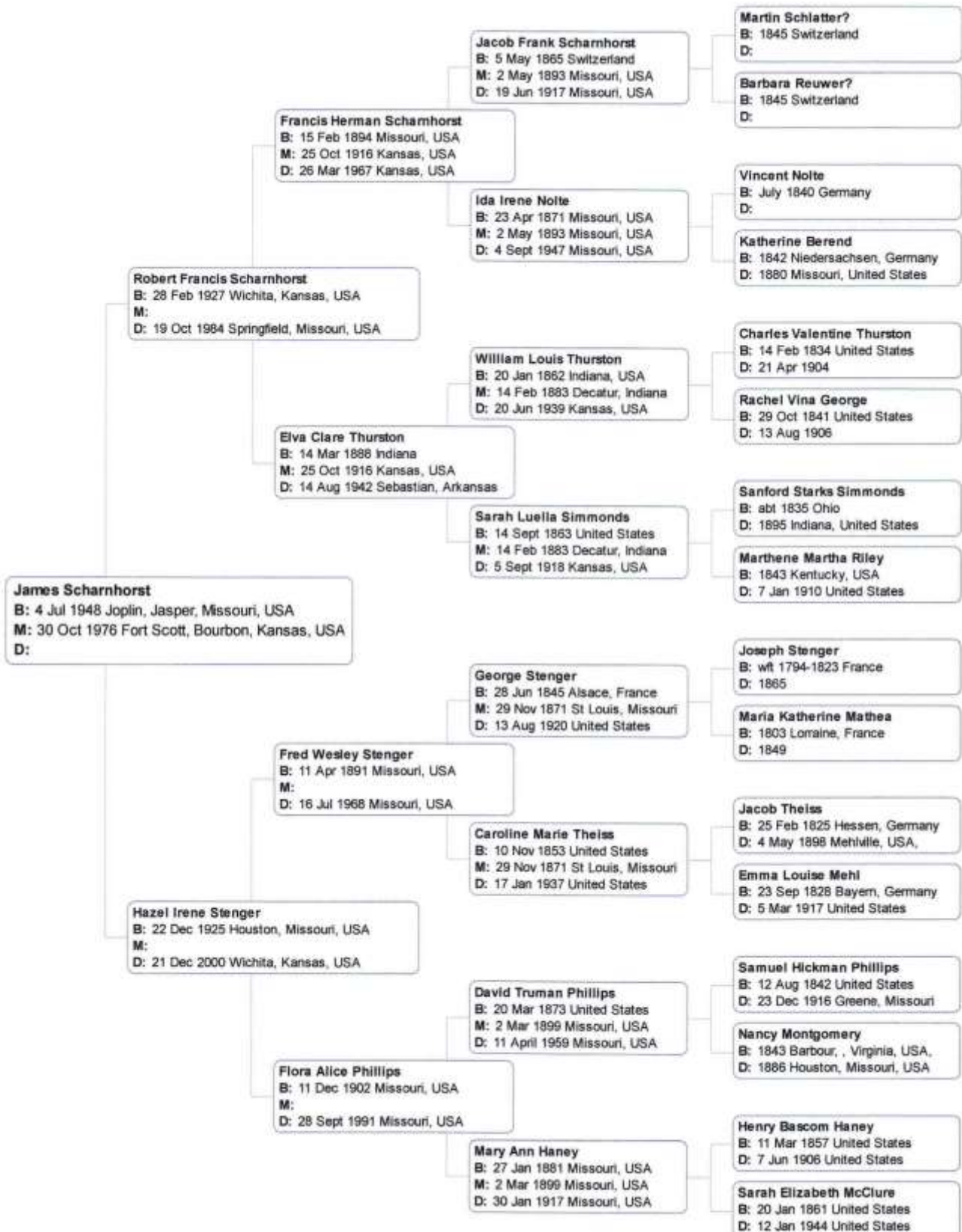

Smith Family Recipe

Jennie Mae Smith Decker is my mom, our family's inspiration and a legendary cook. She was born in 1914 in Muscotah, Kansas, was a youth during the depression in Waverly, Kansas and really grew up during WWII. Her first jobs were as a cook for several wealthy families in California, where she lived briefly while her husband, a sailor, was deployed in the Pacific Theater during WWII. At one of these fine homes, a repeat guest was "Old Gam" - Mr. Gamble of Proctor & Gamble, who always came into the kitchen to see "what Jennie is cooking tonight?" She is famous for her pies, cinnamon rolls and roast beef dinners. Her son, Larry, loves her pies so much he will polish off any remaining for breakfast when he is home for a visit. Her church always benefitted financially from her sought-after entries in their bake sales and bazaars, at times inspiring fierce bidding! Jennie was a legendary cook in the farm community of Tecumseh, KS, cooking for harvesting crews. She also was a school cook in the Shawnee Heights school district, where the students and teachers alike loved her baked goods, but her favorites to cook for are her children, grandchildren and great-grandchildren. Jennie's latest recognition was to win first prize in the Topeka, KS "Grandma's American Pie Baking Contest" in 2010, at the age of 96.

Note by Roy Hughes: Jennie is my aunt and I look forward to visiting with her this year as she turns 99.

Vanilla Pie with Variations

Piecrust for one pie:

- 1 1/2 cups flour
- 1 tsp. salt
- 1/2 cup Crisco
- 1 Tbsp. Sugar

Mix well together with a fork or pastry cutter until crumbly. Add ice water just until it holds together. Don't over mix once you have added the water or it will be tough. Roll out on waxed paper or pastry cloth. Transfer to pie pan and prick all over with a fork so it stays put and doesn't bubble.

Bake 425 degrees for 12-15 minutes. Cool.

Vanilla Pie Filling:

- 1 cup sugar
- 1/4 cup flour
- 1/4 cup cornstarch
- dash salt
- 2 eggs

Mix dry ingredients well and slowly add 4 cups of milk. Cook over medium heat, stirring constantly until thickened and bubbling all the way through. Remove from heat and add:

- 1 tsp vanilla
- 1 pat butter

Mix thoroughly and pour into cooked pie shell. Cool, garnish with whipped cream. Enjoy!

Variations:

Banana Cream - thinly slice ripe banana between layers of vanilla pie filling, but you must let the pudding cool first or the bananas will cook.

Coconut Cream - Grandma Jennie's most famous! - add 1 cup coconut to the filling and some coconut flavoring if you can find it.

Chocolate: (my kids favorite) Add 1/4 cup cocoa powder to the dry ingredients before you add the milk to the pie filling.

Butterscotch: substitute brown sugar for the white sugar-really yummy

Meringue: Not many people want to fool with meringue on top of a pie, but Grandma Jennie was also famous for her lovely meringue! She would use three eggs, using the three yolks in the pudding (instead of the two whole eggs) and save the three egg whites for her meringue. She would beat them slowly at first, then at a high speed, adding 1/4 tsp cream of tartar, 3 Tblsp of sugar and 3 drops of vanilla, or coconut flavoring instead of vanilla for a coconut cream pie. Beat this egg white mixture until it peaks when you pull the beaters out. Spread over the pie filling, being sure to close the gaps between the meringue and the pie crust. Bake at 450 degrees until it is golden.

Michel Family Recipe

My mother-in-law, Renate Anneliese Michel (rhymes with nickel) was born 18 July 1931 on the small family farm just outside the village of Albstedt in northwest Germany, near Bremen. She was the oldest of the five children, all girls, of Wilhelm Frederick and Johanne Auguste Henrike (Mehrtens) Michel. Her father Wilhelm, or Willi as he was called, was a brickmason by trade and also worked on the family farm with his wife. In order to be able to buy the food they couldn't grow themselves and other household items, Willi was required to join the Nazi party when Renate was a small child. Renate says the war did not affect their daily life as much as it did Germans who lived in larger towns and cities, although the stories you have heard about people who defied the Hitler regime disappearing after a knock on the door in the middle of the night are true. Her father was conscripted into the German Army early in the war but was able to stay away from the more dangerous postings. One night not long before the war ended, while stationed in Kiel, Willi was discovered listening to the BBC; he was ordered to the Western Front in the Netherlands but managed to survive until the war ended.

The picture is Renate's school picture from 1942. The day before the picture was taken, Renate's teacher had instructed everyone in the class to be sure to wear their Hitler Youth shirts the next day for their photos. Renate chose to say her shirts were dirty and couldn't be worn for the photo. Civil disobedience was the best way, really the only way, for the German people to express their true feelings.

Sponsored by her mother's half-sister, Adele (Dühne) Wolf, who had immigrated to the United States in 1909, Renate immigrated to St. Louis in 1951. Tante Adele insisted that Renate had to learn to speak English immediately, because she was now living in the United States. Not long after immigrating she got a job working for the Pflagers, who lived in the wealthiest area of St. Louis at the time, at 47 Westmoreland Place. In 1957 she met Dick Boll at a German dance in St. Louis; they were married in 1959. Their only child, Rich, was born in 1963.

The recipe is Tante Adele's recipe for German potato salad, I copied it from my mother-in-law's recipe card exactly as it was written... enjoy! Let me know if you try the recipe and I'll pass along your comments to my mother-in-law.

German Potato Salad

In a large bowl, slice about 5 pounds boiled potatoes, sprinkle layers with salt & pepper to taste. Top with one bunch of sliced green onions & parsley (optional).

In a large skillet, fry ½ to 1 pound cut-up bacon. When crisp, remove to paper towels. Add 3 to 4 cups of water to the bacon fat, then vinegar and sugar to taste, and 1 tsp dry mustard. Bring to a boil, thicken with flour, simmer 5 minutes, stirring constantly. Pour over sliced potatoes, stirring well, then add the crisp bacon and stir again.

For thickening the sauce, put 3+ tbsp. flour in mason jar, add ¾ to 1 cup cold water and shake. No lumps!!

This is a hit & miss recipe, one can use less bacon grease. Taste the sauce while it simmers and adjust to taste. Smoked bacon works best.

No need to refrigerate if serving the same day.

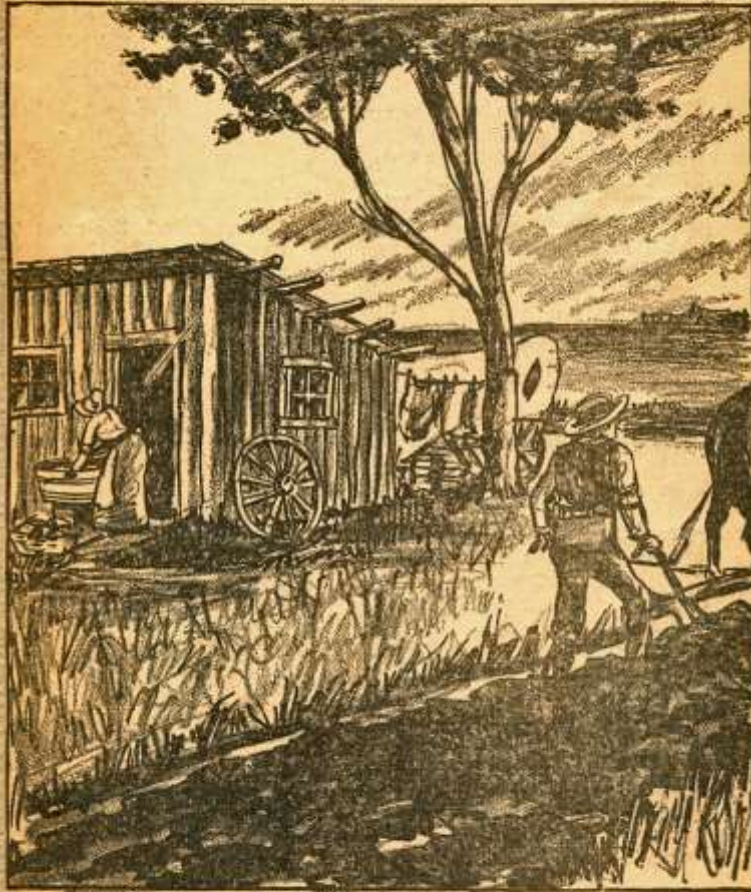

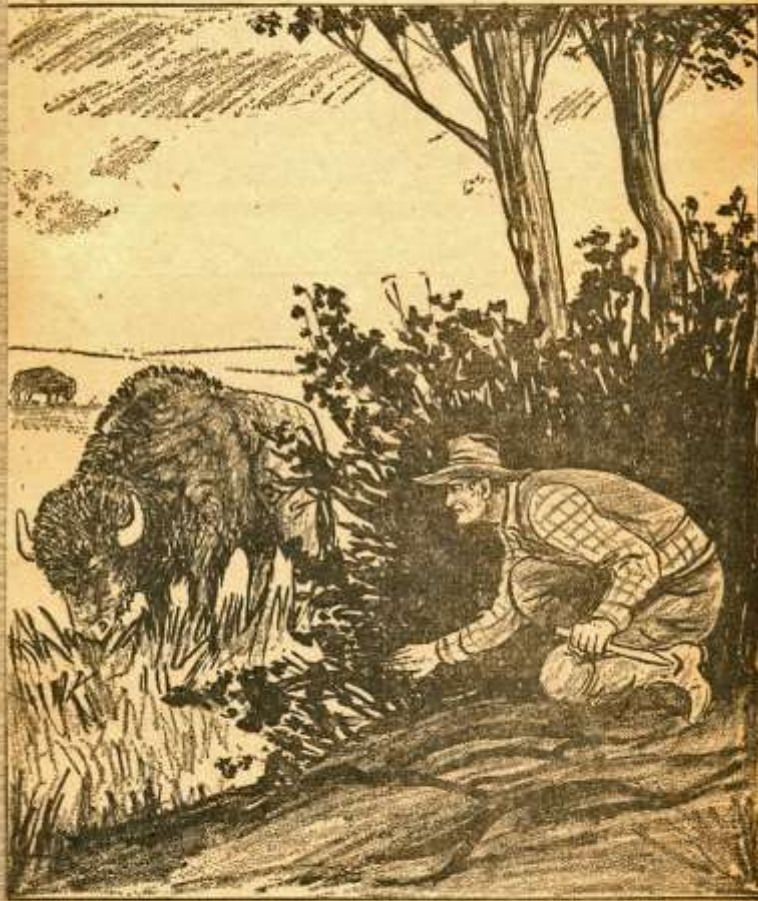
LAND for the taking was available for Wichita's first bride and bridegroom and they took a quarter section of fertile soil located in the Chisholm creek bottoms in what is now northeast Wichita and there the bridegroom, John Ward, built a two-room home. That was following his discharge from the army. The home was a small frame structure at Hydraulic avenue and Thirteenth street, one room of "lean-to" design with no basement and very low foundation. The interior was not plastered, but "sealed" that is finished with wood. One of the first precautions when the home was being erected was the plowing of a fire guard through the rank prairie grass.

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WICHITA HISTORICAL PANEL NO. 75

One Settler Hamstrung Big Buffalo on Site of Wichita

Two Rivers Made Present City Area Watering Place for Herds in Early Days

WICHITA was the "Happy Hunting" area for the Indians for many years since it was, with the two rivers, a watering place for buffalo. And, as the white settlers moved westward from the Missouri river, it was for a few years the favored hunting spot of trappers and settlers from east of the Flint hills. This is recalled by A. J. Ralston of Towanda, 95, who arrived in this section in 1868. He says that several men, to his knowledge, killed buffalo on the present site of Wichita. Dan Cupp of Towanda shot a buffalo and Jim Blankenship of that area slipped up on a big buffalo here and hamstrung it. But, this before 1868.
