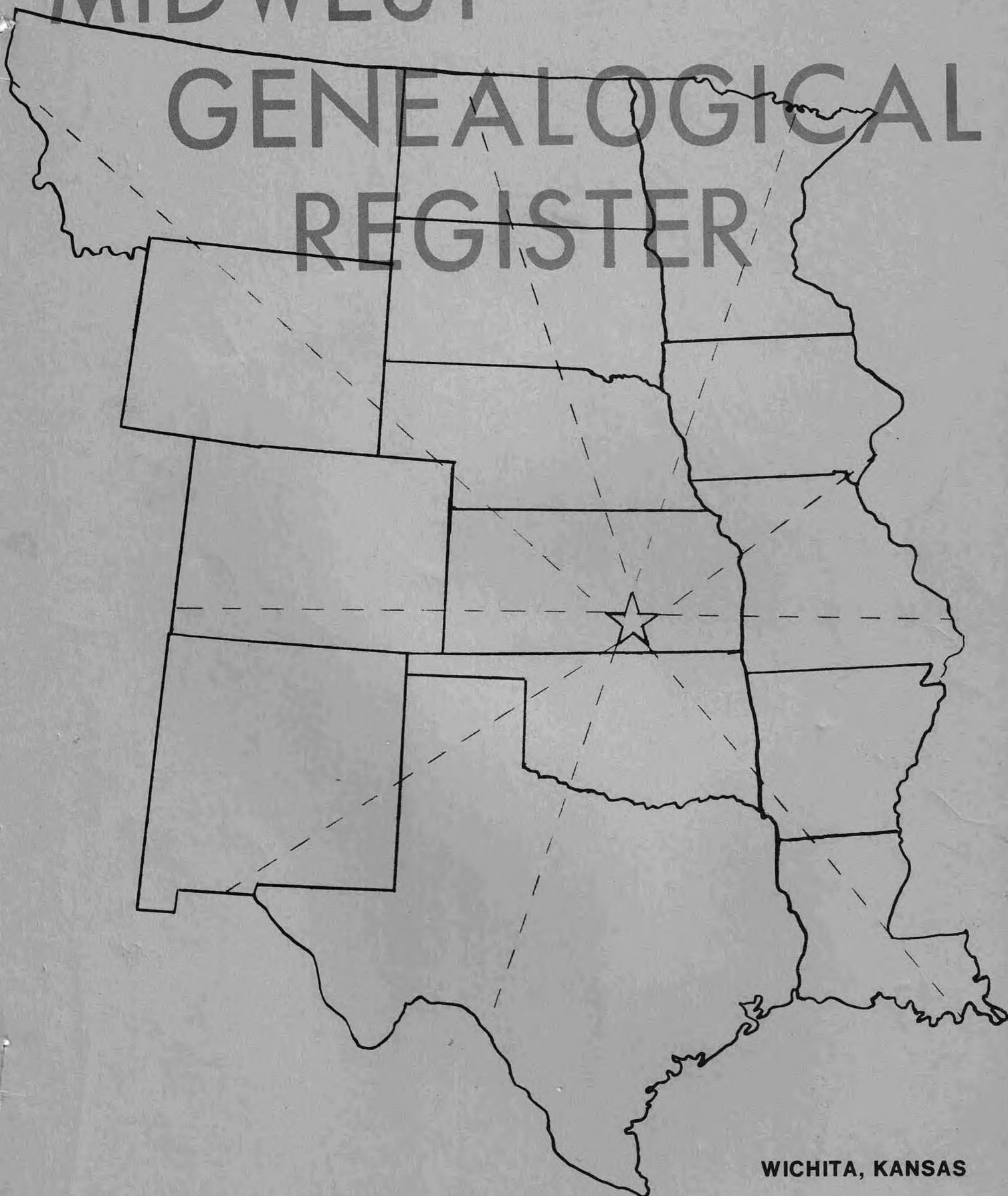

WHEN THE PRAIRIES WERE NEW  
(Abstracts from the book)

The Story of early pioneering in BELL TOWNSHIP, RENO COUNTY KANSAS.

The Earliest Days

First government survey of S. W. Reno Co., 1867 by Samuel L. Smoot First Settler to file on homestead, Lewis M Thomas, Sec 8 Twp 22 Range 5, November 1870. End of Civil War 1865 Soldiers could become owners by living on a quarter section for five years, by 1873 all good land in Eastern Reno County was taken. Petitions for organization of Reno County, 1871, official in 1872. 1873 first homesteads were seen in Bell TWP., many from the Union Army, some from the south, others from Wisconsin, Pennsylvania, Ohio, Indiana, Illinois, Iowa and Missouri. A few Germans just over from the old country, along with six or seven families by covered wagon from Tennessee, their settlement known as the Tennessee Settlement, near the present site of Lerado. To the east in Loda TWP., a group known as the Ohio Settlement. The Tennesseans named their postoffice Neatherland, after a small town back in Tennessee.

First mail service by whichever settler made a trip to Hutchinson bringing back the mail for all the homesteaders to Uncle Sammy Pooteet's home on the S. E.  $\frac{1}{4}$  of Sec 22, about 80 rods of present Lerado store. In 1874 J. Frank Martin was made the first postmaster; once a week service by regular carrier, in the Martin home S.W.  $\frac{1}{4}$  Sec 14, south of Lerado Cemetery on the corner. Other postmasters of Neatherlands were 1876, A. M. Webb, 1878 Wylie Brown (postoffice moved to Buffalo), 1879 C. L. Ely, 1881 O. S. Jenks, 1873 Joshua Jones homesteaded N. W.  $\frac{1}{4}$  Sec 14 (where Hanley Jones lives) (Hanley not a relative). Joshua had several sons among those still there. Joshua started a store, other stores started on the four corners and they named the little trading post Buffalo.

Early businessmen were, Dr. Wylie Brown, first Doctor; Cal Ely and Andrew Gardenshire, from Tenn., groceries, dry goods, hardware. Sam Mateer, blacksmith; A. D. Martin Blacksmith Helper; C. S. Jenks, druggist; Wanda O'Neal and a sister-in-law, dressmakers; Frank and Will Jenks, Grist Mill.

By January 1st 1876 all the homestead and timber claims in the four north tiers of Bell TWP were taken and settlers began to take the 2 south tiers, in a year or two all these were taken. These south tier sections were in Osage Indian Tract and cost \$1.25 per acre.

When the Prairies were new, cont'd:

Al Updegraff of eastern Reno County claimed he killed eleven wild turkeys with one shot on a hunt in the west part of the county. He was afterward killed in a street fight in Dodge City, Kansas.

Jean Hanson, a settler in 1873 succeeded in capturing a wild horse. Early freighters were in the neighborhood in 1870-71-72 on their way to Camp Supply (Okla. Army Post) and Medicine Lodge. George Foster from Hutchinson found no houses between Hutchinson and Castleton, and Medicine Lodge, no houses at the ford where Kingman now is. Eldon Wadkins, whose parents settled in Loda TWP 1874, when 14 years old had an experience with Worth Deisher and Will Camp, two young horsemen, who were killed later that year by Indians while hunting Buffalo in the Indian Territory about 35 miles north of the present Woodward, Oklahoma.

#### FATED BUFFALO HUNT

On August 1874, 10 men, James Custer, Jim Crippen, Crippen's father, from near Hutchinson were three of them. Custer and Crippen were professional buffalo hunters, others were J. B. Thatcher, William Bowles, Will Camp (who was a brother of Mrs. Noah Bellew and an Uncle of Mrs. Nort Bowles), A. V. Flemming, all living in what is now Miami TWP., Worth Deisher, whose homestead was on the N. W.  $\frac{1}{4}$  of Sec 8, now owned by A. B. Bradshaw, two Van Eman boys, R. C. and A. W. whose father homesteaded the S. E.  $\frac{1}{4}$  of Sec 6, now owned by Ralph Bradshaw. The party led by Crippen was attacked by Indians and every man killed. With Crippen were his father, William Bowles, Will Camp, and Worth Deisher. When the news reached Hutchinson, Captain Collins organized a company of militia, went down scouting around taking Bob Van Eman one of the surviving party with them for a guide.

#### FIRST HOMES ON THE PRAIRIE

There were three kinds of homes to be found on the prairie, sod house, dugout, frame houses, all small. The settler had six months after filing to establish a residence. The dug out was the poorest, but in the eyes of the law it was a residence. They were a hole in the ground with brush hauled from Barber county, or from the creek bed for a roof. The sod house was fresh plowed sod laid one slice on top another with the covered wagon cover or brush for a roof. The frame houses were only one room, about 12 by 14 feet square. Soon better houses were built. in the 1880's the Frank Martins lived in a very good house, five or six rooms, painted white. By the 1890's more houses were built and some of them are still standing today.

A few years after the Civil War, about 1868, the cattlemen from Texas made their appearance with their big herds of Texas Longhorns. They came over the old Chisholm trail through Wichita on up past the eastern edge of Reno County then to Abilene on the Union Pacific RR. First appeared the Chuck wagons which was two wagons with a trailer wagon behind. Each wagon was drawn by a 4 horse or mule team. They would pass the Martin home by 10 AM and then by 4PM the last of the big herd was by. The herds traveled 10 to 15 miles a day.
