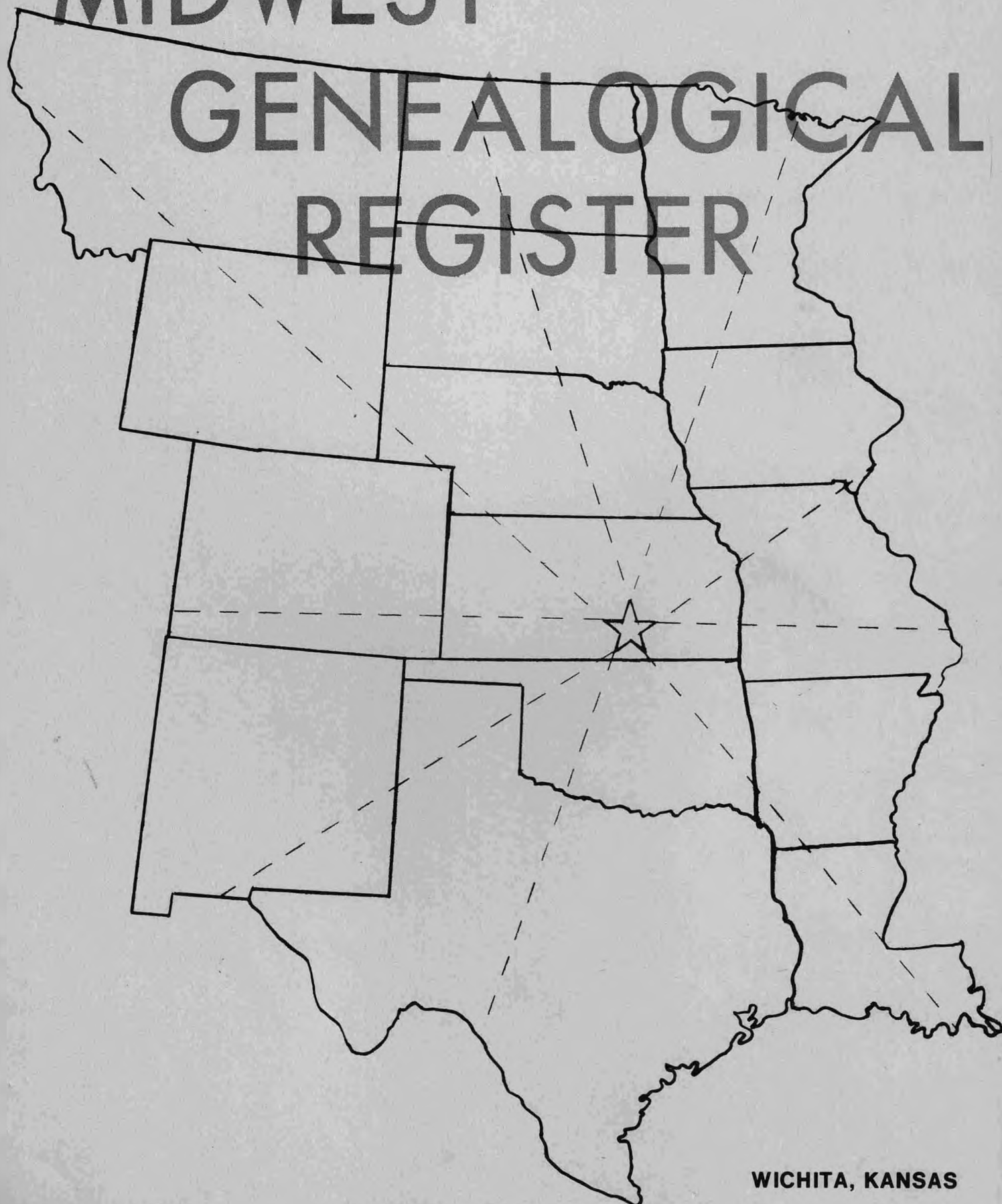

The library is receiving some new magazines that should be of interest to members.

M-166 Genealogical Aids Bulletin is an exchange from the Miami Valley Genealogical Society of Dayton, Ohio. Four issues a year contain records and some queries. There are around 40 pages.

M-167 The Schuylerite is published by the Schuyler-Brown Historical and Genealogical Society at Rushville, Ill. Their collection is housed in a new addition, The Heritage Room at the Schuyler County Historical Museum, an old jail. The magazine has many interesting accounts of earlier days, some records, family histories and queries. It contains about 50 pages and is published quarterly.

M-168 Johnson County Genealogist is a new exchange published by a newly formed society, Johnson County Genealogical Society at Shawnee Mission, Kansas. It is around 50 pages of records and queries.

M-169 Alabama Genealogical Society, Inc. Magazine of Epes, Alabama is a quarterly of about 40 pages. It has census, cemetery and family records as well as queries.

- 1861-1865- Civil War.
- 1866-1869- Dexter and vicinity occupied by Indians. Occasional trappers and hunters with few squatters settling on claims.
- 1870-Settlers filtering in; sod houses on Grouse Creek. Dexter started by group from Eureka. Post Office established.
- 1871-First house built and occupied by JAMES MCDERMOTT. First mail arrived overland from Eureka. Dexter Township organized.
- 1872-First school house built. Masonic hall built by DEMPSEY ELLIOTT and Masonic membership. Rough lumber from Grouse Creek trees and finish lumber hauled overland from Thayer Kansas by ox team.
- 1873-Several box houses erected and frame business houses. Capt. James McDermott elected to State Legislature.
- 1874-Grasshopper year. Lodge instituted in spring and on Oct. 22, 1874 lodge chartered with 17 members the greater number Union soldiers.
- 1875-Dexter Town Ass'n formed and town platted: PETER G. SMITH, Pres., James McDermott, sec. CARTER BROS. saw mill established. Lodge gives consent for establishing lodge at Cedar Vale. DAVE PERRY sells Civil War sword to lodge for \$1.50 for use of Tyler.
- 1876-First Masonic funeral held for DILLON HAWORTH.
- 1877-Flood year. H. C. MCDORMAN brought in first steam thresher pulled by yoke of cattle.
- 1878-FRANK LESSERT, Osage Indian, initiated.
- 1879-WESLEY TREVITT first school teacher became a member of lodge, transferring membership from Highland, Kansas.
- 1880-WALDSCHMIDT flour mill erected; also BULLINGTON MILL, north of Dexter. WALT WILLIAMSON made lodge furniture from Grouse Creek walnut trees. Town incorporated
- 1881-J. D. SALMON, first Mayor; H. D. HOOPER, city clerk; W. E. MERYDITH, city treasurer; J. V. HINES, police judge; SAM NICHOLSON, marshall; and J. T. RIGGS, RUDOLPH HITE, G. M. HAWKINS, S. H. WELLS and JAMES NICHOLSON, councilmen.
- 1882-THOS. RAYBILL pioneer doctor from Lezett became a member from Lodge No. 280 of Indiana.
- 1883-Lodge gives consent for a new lodge at Burden. CHAS. JONES withdrew to become 1st Master, also H. P. SNOW and JAMES H. WOODS, Senior and Junior Wardens. LOUIS LaSARGE, Kaw Indian made Master Mason.
- 1884-Dexter Eye, first newspaper established. W. G. SEAVER, editor. Dempsey Elliott, Charter member and Lodge's 1st Treasurer Masonic funeral held. Dexter Coronet Band with GEO. SHELBY leader.
- 1885-Flood year in Kansas. First Bank organized. BEN WELLS walked 9 miles to lodge, never missed a meeting all winter.
- 1886-First Railroad comes to town. Dexter and Burden Lodges met at grove at Torrance, June 24, St. John's Day. HENRY BRAN\* SON arranged the meeting.

- 1892-Dexter Bank robbed by Dalton gang.
- 1893-Opening of Cherokee strip

- 1906-First cement sidewalk layed in front of Lodge hall. BILL ROSE catches 84 pound catfish in Grouse Creek.
- 1907-First auto in Dexter, JOHN RIGGS owner, it had buggy wheels and chain drive. JOHN D. MAURER, Past Master and first initiate died, Masonic funeral. Dexter piped Helium Gas in homes.
- 1908-Money panic. Farmers and Merchants State Bank organized. ROY CATLIN ships 15 cars of Walnut logs cut from Grouse Creek timber.
- 1909-Several stone arch bridges built on Grouse and Plum Creeks.
- 1910-Henry Ford starts agency.
- 1911-MASTER DR. ROY D. WILLIAMS called to near Maple City to see sick patient, got lost and stayed in barn all night, studied Masonry till morning.
- 1912-First electric light plant built by FRANK GULICK.
- 1913-First Chautauqua held (continued each year for 19 years).

- 1915-New modern school building erected. JOHNSON B. DANIEL Masonic funeral held.

- 1932-Depression year.
- 1933-BENJAMIN M. BROWN, Past Master, Masonic funeral held.

- 1935-Old lodge hall where we met for 49 years torn down.
- 1936-Big Cottonwood at Bank corner (landmark) cut down. Old settlers night held at lodge, Maple City lodge visitors.
- 1937-Lodge holds Past Masters night. LEVI SHRADER, Past Master funeral held Masonic.
- 1938-Lodge pays off indebtedness on hall.

KOONTZ-(KOONS) RECORDS

The following article, submitted by Mrs. Mitts concerns three diaries of her great-grandfather, ISAAC KOONTZ (KOONS), who was a missionary in Minnesota; a teacher and minister in both Missouri and Kansas in the late 19th century.

Isaac Koontz and his wife SARA (PEARSON) left Illinois soon after they were married in December, 1866 and settled in Sibley County, Minnesota. They fought Indians in the Indian Massacres there. In 1869 they went back to LaSalle County, Illinois, then migrated to near Mt. Vernon, Missouri. He had a teacher's certificate issued to him in Lawrence County, June 3, 1871 to teach second grade. He remarks that the people were indifferent to education and he became very discouraged with teaching. He wanted to enter the ministry since 1856, but circumstances would not allow it. In March 1872, he and his family moved to St. Clair County, Mo. He mentions several people by last names and several Methodist Evangelical Conferences he attended, however, he was of the United Brethren Church. In November, 1872, at Butler, Mo. he passed his exam of the ministry. He traveled on horseback from Missouri town (Concord; Weaubeleau; and Wheatland) until he and his family moved to Wichita, Kansas in about 1875. He taught school there until about 1877, then he homesteaded 160 acres near Sego in Reno County, Kansas. Isaac Koontz started several E.U.B. churches in and near there. A conference was held near Kingman in 1891. The men from the Kingman district were:

Isaac Koontz traveled extensively selling Bibles and mentions several people by last names in the Kingman, Arlington, Pretty Prairie and West Eureka (no connection with the Eureka of today) area.

Isaac died December 5, 1908 in Wichita, Kansas. Sara died Feb. 13, 1929, in Wichita, Kansas. Both are buried in Highland Cemetery.

Sara Pearson Koontz's mother, DELILAH PEARSON, born in Montgonery County, Ohio, June 29, 1825, moved from Illinois with her smaller children to Cloud County, Kansas. She homesteaded 160 acres in Aurora township. Her husband, JAMES PEARSON, had died in 1869 in LaSalle County, Illinois. They had six children in all; four sons and two daughters. Delilah Pearson died at Sulphur Springs, Kansas, December 5, 1912.

MRS. MARY AMANDA TAYLOR

Coalgate mourns because of the passing of a Mother-in-Israel-one oldest and most beloved of her pioneer citizens.

We refer to Mrs. Taylor, the sainted wife of M.R.H. Taylor, Sr., who died Friday of last week and whose funeral and burial came Sunday.

At the First Baptist Church the funeral service was solemn, impressive, beautiful. The floral offerings were lovely, and the services conducted by the Rev. W. B. Allstock of Spiro, assisted by Revs. H. T. Wiles and O. S. Snell, was full of pathos and religious fervor. The funeral procession was a long one following the hearse out to Coalgate Cemetery, forming a line more than a half mile in length.

Mrs. Mary Amanda Taylor, the beloved wife of M.R.H. Taylor was born April 11, 1855 at Independence, Miss., (the daughter of Sally Martin and Thomas Powers), and passed from this life to her reward, at her home in Coalgate Jan. 30, 1925 at 11:40 A.M., age 69 years, 9 months, and 19 days. In all appearance Mrs. Taylor was feeling in good health and was preparing dinner for herself and husband when the end came. She had finished the preparation of the noon meal and the summons came for her to go home.

Miss Mary Amanda Powers was married August 19, 1875 to Mr. M.R.H. Taylor (Mike Rufus Howard Taylor b Feb. 12, 1852 d Apr. 1940, the son of Mary Ann (Polly) Gooch b Feb. 28, 1824, and Riley Taylor b Jan. 4, 1816) in Independence, Miss., and to this union was born 8 children, only three of whom are living. In 1886 they moved from Mississippi to Conway, Ark., residing there until 1896 when they moved to Durant, Indian Territory, coming to Coalgate in 1904 this being their home until Mrs. Taylor's death.

(The 8 children of this family were: Riley b August 25, 1876- March 20, 1899; Lelia J. Sept. 8, 1877-Sept. 18, 1878; Sallie Feb. 21, 1879-Oct. 11, 1918; Annie Sept. 6, 1880-Mar. 1951; M.R.H. "Jack" Apr. 4, 1882-Feb. 8, 1938; Mattie L. Dec. 22, 1889-Aug. 19, 1894; Angus May 9, 1892-Aug. 19, 1894; Irene July 13, 1899.)

Mrs. Taylor professed faith in Christ when a girl of about 16 years, and through life was truly a devout child of God. She united with the Baptist Church nearly 49 years ago, and at her death was a loyal member of the First Baptist Church, Coalgate.

She leaves to mourn her loss, her husband, three children, Mrs. R. (Annie) Sullivan, Ada; Jack Taylor, city; Mrs. Harry (Irene) Waller, Ponca City; eight brothers and sisters, T. F. Powers, D. S. Powers, Mrs. R. H. Jones, Mrs. P. H. Jamison, Mrs. E. T. Chisler, Miss Alice Powers, all of Conway, Ark., and J. M. Powers, city, also 15 grandchildren and one great grandchild, together with a great host of friends who will long miss her from their lives.

This cemetery is located 8.25 miles south of Canton, on the Canton-Hesston black top road. The legal description is SE 1/4 NE 1/4 Sec. 4, T 21 S, R 1 W, 6 P.M. An 1884 Atlas of Meridian Township, in which the cemetery is located, shows that the surrounding land belonged to George Schneider; by 1921 the surrounding land was owned by J. M. Simpson. An Evangelical Lutheran Church and a parsonage are shown for the same location in 1884 and the Spring Valley Post Office was located about a quarter of a mile to the west. The cemetery is also known as the Simpson Cemetery but Schneider Cemetery would be more appropriate because it was originally Schneider land and the oldest grave is that of Franklin Schneider for 1876. The cemetery is a long, narrow strip of land along the west side of the road. Graves are clustered at either end of the strip but none are located in the center; possibly the church was located in this central area but more likely the church was north of the cemetery and the central area was not used because it is lower ground and therefore wetter. Inscriptions were copied on 26 May 1972 by Darrell A. Russel, assisted by C. L. Russel of Canton, Kansas.
