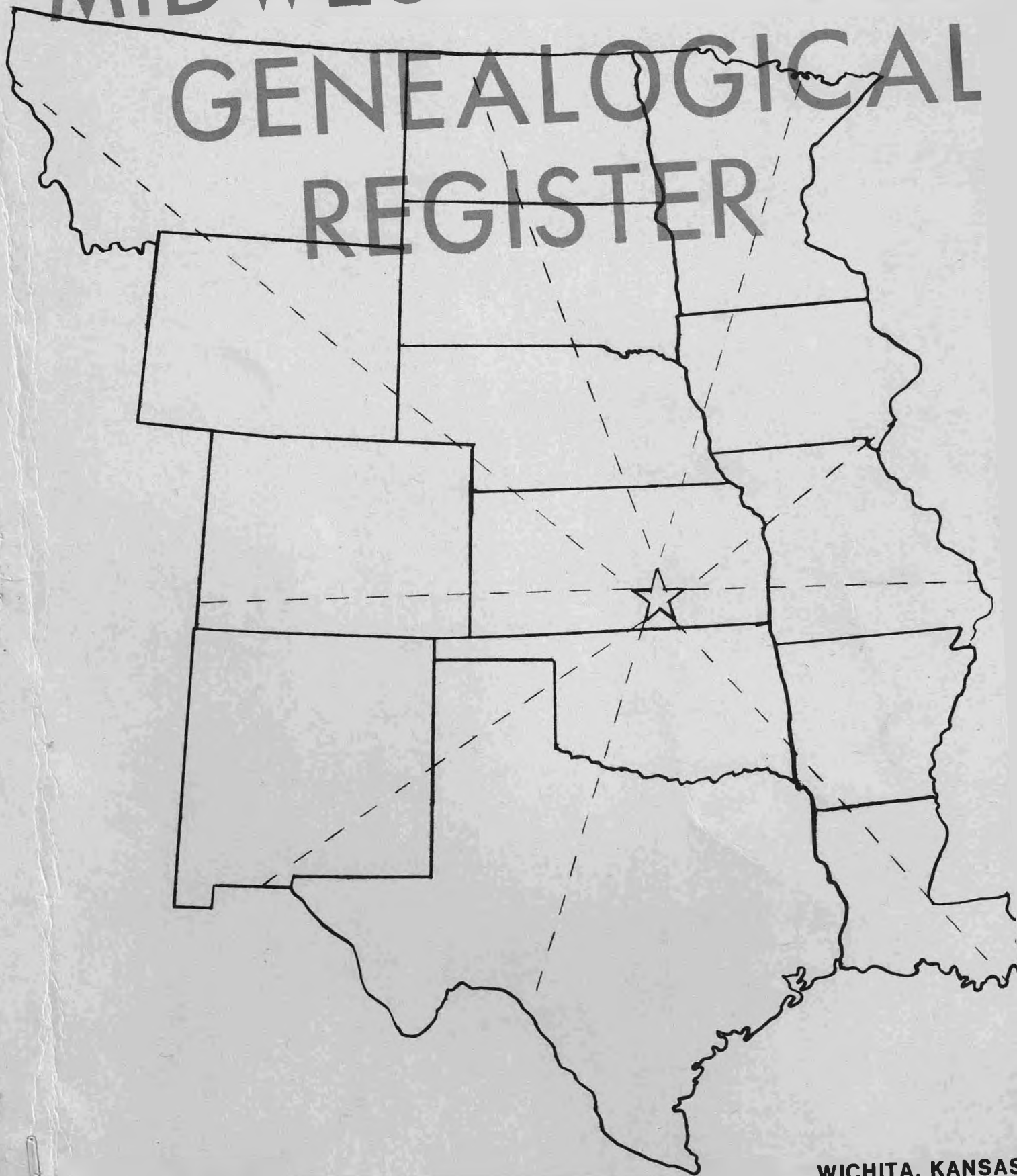

Mr. McKee is compiling a directory of old railway post-offices, established at the end of railway lines, and most of which were later discontinued when the railway extended further. Mrs. McKee has compiled a scrapbook of copies of pictures of pupils at the one-room schoolhouses within an eight mile radius of Edna. Most were pictures of the late 1890's and early 1900's and she has identified nearly all of the students pictured.

John Dreitzler is stricken with Apoplexy: was in Fatal crash Monday. Tiffin Ohio.

July 1st, 1933-- Tiffin Saturday was mourning the death of a third prominent citizen within a week--Mayor John Dreitzler, 51. He was stricken with apoplexy Friday while operating a wheat binder on his large farm near Fostoria, and died at 10:45 PM in the Fostoria Municipal Hospital without regaining consciousness.

It was believed the heat, and shock suffered Monday when he was severely shaken in an automobile accident in which Common Pleas James Harvey Platt and Dr. Henry L Wenner, prominent Tiffin Surgeon, were injured fatally, were contributing factors in Mayor Dreitzler's death. He attended funeral services for Judge Platt and Dr Wenner Thursday.

Physicians said Mayor Dreitzler had suffered from high blood pressure and that there were symptoms of paralysis.

Mr. Dreitzler was serving his fifth term as mayor and was unopposed for renomination by the Democrats. He was a graduate of Ohio Northern University, a former school teacher and a former Seneca County Clerk of courts. He was defeated when he sought election to Congress. He was a member of the Elks, Eagles, and Knights of Pythias Lodges, and of the Junior Order of United American Mechanics.

He was born 27 July 1881 at Fostoria, Ohio to Samuel L and Margaret E Kassing Dreitzler. Mr. Dreitzler leaves his wife Leila; daughters, Louise and Helen, and a son, Edward. A Brother, Samuel, Fostoria, is a commissioner of Seneca County.

The daughter of a former sheriff of Labette County, Marcus(Mark) and Josephine (McCamish) Hiatt, she was born 13 December 1879 on a farm near Montana in Labette County. Her Father served as sheriff from 1900 until 1920 and was a colorful figure in Labette County law enforcement annals.

Before her marriage to Daniel E O'Connell(son of Mark Anthony and Anna Johnston O'Connell) on May 7, 1906 at St. Paul, Kansas, she was a chief telephone operator in Oswego. Her husband was a grocer in Oswego from 1899 until his retirement in 1939. For many years

he operated the O'Connell and Maguire Grocery Store at the present Art Howard Furniture location. Mr. O'Connell died 18 march 1958.

She was a member of the Oswego Mother of God Catholic Church, the Alter Society, the Grange and the last charter member of the J. W. Club.

Survivors include a daughter, Mrs. Walter (Beulah) White, of Denton, Texas, and a son Mark O'Connell, Casper, Wyoming. William H. Fightmaster, son of James and Caroline Fightmaster, was born Oct 3, 1840, in Monroe county, Missouri and departed this life November 29, 1923, aged 83 years, 1 month and 26 days. When the Civil War broke out, he enlisted in Co. K of the 6th Iowa Infantry in July 1861. He served 3 years in defense of the Union and took part in a number of the fiercest battles; Shiloh, Missionary Ridge, Jackson, Miss, and Kenesaw Mt. He also took his share in many minor engagements and was mustered out of the service at Roswell, Ga., July 16, 1864.

After returning from the war he was united in marriage to Mary Elizabeth Padan Oct 16, 1864, who preceded him in death. To this union five children were born; Julian, Joseph James, Charles William, Henry Harrison and Peter Nelson, all of whom survive him except Charles W. who departed this life June 26, 1922.

He is also survived by four grandchildren; Myrtle Aldene, Lela Mae, William Don and Franc Joefay and one great grandchild, Mary Kathleen Lightfoot. Two brother and three sisters survive him; John F. of Cherokee, Okla., George W. of this place, Mary E. Dumas of Peoria, Ill., Martha A. Dumas of Unionville, Mo., and Malinda Liley of Lemons.

He was a member of the M. E. church of this place. Mr. Fightmaster moved to Putnam county in 1874 and has lived in the immediate vicinity up to the time of his death.

Mr. Fightmaster was a soldier-citizen of the highest type. He embraced the right on all moral questions and stood four square for Justice and righteousness in civil Government and for the endorsement of our laws, and assisted greatly in making his community a better place to live and to get a place to rear and train children in good citizenship. He will be greatly missed by all good citizens. His funeral was preached by his pastor W. A. Pollock at the Methodist church in Lemons, Saturday, Dec 1, and his sacred remains laid to rest by the side of his beloved who had gone on before.

John O'Donnell, who lives with his brother and sister at Lemonville, died suddenly, Tuesday noon of last week. He had been working in the hay field and came in shortly before dinner. He lay down to rest, complaining of feeling badly, and a few minutes later when called to dinner, was found to be dead. The funeral occurred the next day and the interment took place at the Catholic cemetery in this city.

Excerpts from History of Bourbon County, Kansas

Taylor and several prisoners with him intended to get Mr. Ury and Joe. After capturing the men folks he moved Newt and the two girls out into the corner of the yard preparatory to burning the house. Just then George Pond, James Pitts and Fred Carpenter, a scouting party from the 3rd Wisc. Cavalry, ran onto them and commenced firing. In the fight that followed, Mr. Ury was hit by two balls, and his wounds were found to be very serious. His leg had to be amputated and he lingered until the 2nd of July, when he died.

The summer before this happened, this same Taylor captured a man by the name of Tom Whitesides from the house of Mrs. Beal's, east of Fort Scott, and killed him by firing twelve shots into him. After the war Taylor was elected sheriff of Vernon Co.

About June 1, 1864, a dozen or more bushwhackers made a raid into the county, and captured Rev. Mr. Harryman, Mr. Potter, and two or three colored people. The robbers took alarm at the approach of some parties and hasily left without their prisoners.

In October, 1864, what is called the Price raid took place. General Price passed up from Arkansas through Central Missouri, in the direction of Lexington, on the Missouri River.

About 1,050 men were assembled from various points around Fort Scott. The most of these were formed into the 24th Regiment of State Militia, with Isaac Stadden, Colonel; Lt. Col. John Van Fossen; Major Joseph Ury; Adjutant A. Danford; Quartermaster J. Thomas Bridgens; Surgeons, B. F. Hepler and S. O. Himoe.

The companies in the 24th were officered as follows: Co A, John F. White and C. B. Hayward; Co B, W. C. Dennison and R. D. Lender; Co C, J. B. Skeen, Thomas Barnes and C. B. Maurice; Co D, J. C. Hinkley and Robert Stalker; Co E, H. T. Coffman, R. Adams and W. P. Gray; Co F, J. C. Ury, J. B. Cabiness and S. Streeter.

Lt. Colonel George P. Eaves, of Uniontown, had a battalion of

While the Union Army was fighting Gen. Price's troops, guerillas under the command of Jo Shelby were at work in Bourbon Co. They shot and killed Andrew Stevens and shot at W. H. Green in front of the Knowles & Green store at Fort Lincoln. They then plundered the store and burned the building, and the residences of Mr. Knowles, Mr. Green and Mr. Hopkins. After robbing the Hopkins, they robbed all the families as far west as Primms and Armstrongs, and burned out the Dick Stafford place.

Another raid was made on Oct 22 in the neighborhood of Marmaton, under the command of Allen Matthews and Major Courcey. The alarm was given and about thirty Home Guards quartered in the church, were scattered out in squads along the roads leading into town. But guerrillas left the main road and charged across lots into town, firing on any man they saw. They murdered Col. Horatio Knowles, Daniel M. Brown, Dr. L. M. Chadwick, Joseph Stout, Abner McGonigle and Warren Hawkins. Nelson Ramsey, Wm. Holt, brother of Judge Holt, Rev. Wigmore, and others were repeatedly fired on, but they slipped away into the ravines near by. The guerrillas robbed and burned the stores of Aitkin & Knowles and Cobb & Jones, and the residence of Mrs. Schoen, widow of Lt. Schoen, of Co E, 10th Kansas, the Methodist church and other buildings.

Lt. Roush reported the affair to Col. Stadden at Fort Scott, who ordered out a force in pursuit, On their way out of the county, they killed a Mr. Simons near Cato. In a statement made by Little Bear, Chief of the Osage, Matthews and about twenty of his men were killed, in a fight with the Osage, at a crossing on the Verdigris River, near where Independence now is.

In July of 1865, J. S. Emmert, County Clerk, left among the records of the county an itemized account of the Expenses of housekeeping, from which the following extracts are made:

½ bushel apples, \$1.50; one doz. beets, 50¢; 4 lbs. butter, \$1.25; 4 doz. eggs, \$1.30; 4 heads of cabbage, 50¢; 12 lbs of sugar, \$3.00; 5 lbs of coffee, \$5.00; ½ gal kerosene, \$1.00; one bushel potatoes, \$2.00; 6 bars of soap, \$1.00; 2 chickens, 80¢; 1 peck of onions, 75¢; ½ lb of tea, \$1.50; 50 lbs flour, \$3.50.

The Kansas troops had been or were being mustered out, and the people of our county were turning their attention to the pursuits of peace. Among the largest business places were: Dry Goods-Wilson, Gordon & Ray, A. McDonald & Bro., J. F. White, J. R. Morley & Co., Wm. Roach, Rosenfield & Co., Sanderson & Thomas, Shannon & Seavers, A. J. Lagore, and Jones & Cobb. Groceries-Linn & Stadden, G. R. Bodine, A. Cohen, Ernich & Lender, E. M. Insley, Van Fossen Bros., Parker & Tomlinson, and Pennington & Secrist. Bankers - A. McDonald & Bro. Hardware - C. F. Drake and Rubicam & Dilworth. Book Store - S. A. Manlove. Livery Stables - Benj. Files, P. Clough, H. Dimon, S. A. Olds, and Chas. Walker. Watch Maker - D. Prager. Tailors - R. Blackett and J. Winter. Harness Maker - Hartman & Co. Cabinet

Maker - S. O. Goodlander and Wm. C. Weatherwax. Plasterer - A. Coston. Shoemaker - John Crow. Wagon Maker - John A. Bryant. Blacksmiths - W. H. Dory, Moses Boire, C. J. Neal. Drug Stroes - D. S. Andrick & Co., and W. C. Dennison & Co. Barbers - Ed Henderson and Joe Barker. Carpenter - C. W. Goodlander. Masons - John Higgins and Billy Shanuehan. Physicians - B. F. Hepler, J. H. Couch, J. S. Radfield, S. O. Himoc, L. M. Timmonds, J. C. Van Pelt, etc. Lawyers - Too many as usual. The rest of the fellows kept saloons.

There was no census, even approximate, of the population of Fort Scott in 1865. There was a large "floating population" of refugees and indiscriminate and indescribable people, white and black, who had practically no home or residence anywhere, to the number of 1,000 or more. The actual number of bona fide citizens was probably less than 1,800. The tax roll of the city bears less than 400 names.

The close of the year 1865 is deemed the fitting period to close this volume of the History of Bourbon County. It is the closing point of an Era. Old "Time" here rested his scythe for a moment, and turned the sand in his glass.

CEMETERY, located on Highway 281, 1 mile south of the Russell, Barton County line on the east side of the road. The Cemetery is small and well kept.
