How many are familiar with the TRI-STATE TRADER? The newspaper is published by Mayhill Publications, Knightstown, Indiana. It is devoted to hobbies, antiques, auctions and collectors primarily in the states of Ohio, Illinois, Indiana, Kentucky, Michigan, west Pennsylvania, north West Virginia, Tennessee and Wisconsin. If you can manage to get through all the interesting glass, antiques, flea markets, etc., you will find the genealogy section. Willard Heiss writes a column-Genealogy* on general information as well as one called Serendipity with news on bulletins, quarterlies and newsletters. BOOK REVIEW

"JOHN SKELTON OF GEORGIA" by
John W. Skelton, Colonel USAF(Ret)

This book was printed by Baily Printing. Inc. Charlottsville, Va., and contains the John Skelton family history with many allied families, including: ALBRIGHT, BROWN, DARDEN, ERTSBERGER, HARBOUR, HUDZIETZ, RAY WATSON AND WILL-1675-1969. It contains 975 pages, 8½xll inches - indexed. Limited edition. Printed on durable paper bound in style R=53 McBee Binder. It is a beautiful printing and assembly job, clearly designed with each chapter separated by heavy colored paper. Eight chapters constitute the work concluding with "OTHER SKELTONS".

Col Skelton was assisted by his wife, Dorothy Simmons Skelton, B.A. & M.A., University of California, was a research analyst during the World War II and an Λ rt educator. She is well qualified as a collaborator.

The book is easily followed and very well documented, representing records of the John Skelton family compiled from authentic scources during fifty years of continous research by contemporary descendents.

Descendents who are interested in joining Historical and Patriotic Societies will find definite references conveniently placed on the family page to provide the required scources of legal proof for membership.

The direct descendents of John Skelton and his wife Rebecca Harbour Skelton, are eligible to join many Societies including, Colonial Dames of the XVII Century, Huguenot Society,, Sons of the American Revolution, and Daughters of the American Revolution. Information is also given about many descendents who served in the Confederate Army during the Civil War.

This book has no complex numbering system, but dates and scources of information are numerous. It is well worth the time to look it over, it is very interesting.

This excellent Genealogy is distributed by Col. John W. Skelton, Lotus Lakes, Brightwood Virginia, 22715--the price is \$30.00 and should be well worth that to any Skelton or any of the many allied families.

Kansas Centennial 1861-1865 by B. Close Shackleton, Pittsburg, Kansas

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GIRARD, CRAWFORD COUNTY, KANSAS (County Seat)

Although the town of Crawfordsville was laid out in 1866, on the banks of Lightning Creek as the first county seat, declared so by Governor Crawford, the city of Girard by petition was so named in 1868. Crawfordsville had a store, post office, blacksmith shop, a schoolhouse and four or five cabins, in which the families of the town lived. There was a mail and stage line between Osage Mission and Crawfordsville in early days. The United States troops were stationed at Crawfordsville during the Joy and the Leaguers troubles over the Neutral Lands. The troops were sent after the leaguers had driven off the engineers and the hands at work grading on the railroad south of Ft. Scott and burned their tools. Crawfordsville, located 16 miles east of Osage Mission (St. Paul) lost its promise of a city and county seat, when Girard was petitioned and given the county offices in 1868.

Girard saw its beginning as a city inthe summer of 1868. Laid out near the center of the county, the incorporators were: Dr. Couch, Dr. Charles H. Strong, Dr. B. F. Hepler, S. D. McIntosh, Levi Hatch, Col. J. Alexander and E. J. Boring. Dr. Charles H. Strong christened the town, giving it the name of his home town in the state of Pennsylvania. The town of Girard is laid out with a public square, surrounded with stores and other business houses.

The postoffice was established early in $1868\ \mathrm{with}\ \mathrm{Dr.}\ \mathrm{C.}\ \mathrm{H.}\ \mathrm{Strong}\ \mathrm{as}\ \mathrm{post-master.}$

A schoolhouse was built in 1870 and that summer Miss Margaret Hill taught the first school, for which she received \$40 per month.

The Methodist church was the first to begin the work of preaching the gospel. Rev. Robert Stocker preached the first sermon in a frame building on the north side of the square. In 1873 Rev. McWhirt bought the school house, which had been built in 1870, and it was dedicated as a house of worship.

Soon after the advent of the Methodists, the Presbyterians erected a church of brick and stone. Then came the Christian and Episcopal churches.

The Girard Press was started by W. H. Warner and Eli Wasser in 1869. In August 1872, a big wind storm blew the walls of the new court house down, falling on a house demolishing it.

The Girard Mills were built in 1870. The Crawford County Mills were built by a stock company. They were sold in 1875 to Frank Playter and B. C. Redlow in 1876, resold in 1876 to C. D. Patterson.

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WALNUT (GLENDALE), CRAWFORD GOUNTY, KANSAS

Walnut is located on the main line of the Katy railroad, also served by a branch of the Santa Fe, which made the place an important center for shipping stock and farm produce to market in the early days.

The city is near the northwestern corner of the county. It was originally platted in 1870 by the Katy railroad as Glendale, but the town itself did not appear until about 1873 when J. M. Goff, father of George Goff and T. T. Perry of Girard, purchased the town and laid out the city as Walnut. The town was located 8 miles northeast of Osage Mission and one mile west of Walnut Station on the J. B. Mudd farm. The Catholic church built there two years previous was on the townsite, having been established in 1869 at the farm house of John Mudd by priests from Osage Mission.

The postoffice was established in April, 1870, with Thomas Jones as post-master. J. M. Goff was the first mayor in 1877.

Among those who were instrumental in building the town was W. H. Holeman, former editor and bank president, who came to Walnut in 1880 as a principal of the schools. He later edited the Walnut Journal and finally became president of the Walnut State Bank.

Early settlers were: John Kaylor, Aaron Boyle, Ezer Dillion, Moses Arnold Reed, J. F. Daggett, William T. Blain, Anna N. E. Nagel, Henry Wrestler, Frederick Martin, Fabious Robins, J. Miller, Ira Boyle, H. Burns and B. Shackelton.

Benjamin Shackelton was born in Waverly, N.Y. Sept. 15, 1815. He and his wife, Lavina Miller, moved to Illinois in 1856, from there to Osage, Kansas (St. Paul) in 1869, and from there to Walnut. Mr. Shackelton came from Illinois with his mother, wife and four children in a covered wagon drawn by oxen team. The children were Fremont, Wilmot, Della and John Wesley. Fremont and Wilmot attended the Osage Mission public school in 1874. Benjamin's mother, Anny Maria Shackelton, died in 1876 and was buried at Osage Mission. The homestead is a 160-acre tract located one mile south, one-half east, two miles south and one-half mile west of Main Street in Walnut. The original "squatters' shack" is part of the present house.

The Walnut cemetery was founded in 1870 and gives the appearance of being well kept. Within the fenced premises are many old tombstones with their records of births and deaths of the early settlers of Walnut. Graves of several soldiers add the Civil War days: Emmanuel Damerell, Co. B 32, Illinois, Voluntary Inf., born 1845; Corporal Jehile S. Tucker, Co. K 96, Illinois, Inf.; First Sergeant Harmon T. Hurst, 10 Towa Inf.

AFMA (RUST), CRAWFORD COUNTY, KANSAS

Arma was incorporated as a city of the third class May 18, 1909. Located 5 miles west of the State line, 9 miles north of Pittsburg, 7½ miles east of Girard. The U.S. Highway (National road from New Orleans to Winnipeg) passes through Arma.

The Missouri Pacific Railroad in 1870 and the Joplin and Pittsburg Railroad in 1907 gave residents access to any portion of the county carrying freight and passengers.

The land was originally in the Cherokee Strip (sold to the Cherokees by the U.S. under provision of 2nd Article of Treaty of 1835) but was taken over by the government in 1866, when U.S. Grant was president. In 1867 through the Sec. of Interior, it passed into the hands of J.F. Joy of the American Emigrant Co. (chartered in Conn.).

"All of Section 5, twp. 29, range 25" which includes the original townsite was granted to the Missouri River, Fort Scott and Gulf R.R. Co. under federal grant in 1870, included 640 acres. The original site contained less than 200 acres. In 1878 William F. Armacost acquired the land through mortgage closure on the railroad which reserved the "right of way".

Before the incorporation of Arma, it was known as Rust, a small coal camp laid out in 1836. The name of Arma came from one of the owners of most of the land north and east of the camp at the time of its incorporation - W. F. Armacost.

Arma is situated in the center of a rich bituminous coal deposit, of this section which is practically inexhaustible.

The first postoffice was located in Clem Brown's general store about one mile east of Arma corner on the south side of the road. Mr. Brown was the first postmaster when Arma was still known as Rust. Evans Morgan was one of the early mayors.

Early settlers: Elmer Siple, Jess Fry, Tom Richardson, Sam Gardner, Ben F. Rhoda, W. A. Delapp, E. Elliott, G. Forrester, Sam Haslam, Wm. Cote and Milton Siple, Wm. M. Close.

Crawford County, Kansas (contd)

Mr. Wm. M. Close brought his bride, Mrs. Clara Volk, to Arma when it was still known as Rust. They settled on a farm, leased from the Western Coal Co., one-half mile south of the Arma corner on the west side of the road. When the coal camp showed signs of booming, Mr. Close left the farm and built a home in town. He became the town carpenter and contractor and built many homes during the boom. Children of Wm. (Bill) and Clara Close were: Orval H., Coy Edith, Virgil M., Gertrude L., Martha E., Raymond A., Bertha M. (died when two years old, buried in Mulberry cemetery where both Mr. and Mrs. Close also are buried), and B. Close Shackleton b. June 30, 1908.

Mr. Close was born in Terre Haute, Indiana Sept. 28, 1868, died October 14, 1941. He came to Kansas in 1877 when nine years old, with his mother, four brothers and three sisters. They settled on a farm near the Union Center community.

B. Close Shackleton, author of "Handbook on the Frontier Days of Southeast Kansas" Kansas Centennial 1861-1865, trained in Missionary and Educational Work in Kansas City and Hartford, Conn. She returned and spent five years as Director of Religious Education in the Crawford County Larger Parish. en it is a strong to be load some of

MONMOUTH, CRAWFORD COUNTY, KANSAS

The town of Monmouth, so called after Monmouth, Illinois, was laid out by Lafayette Manlove and was the third town laid out in the county. Located six miles west of Cherokee. L. Manlove built the first building. Ralph Warner built a residence, as did Dr. Moore, who later represented Crawford County in the state scnate. Monmouth was started in the year 1886. A postoffice was established in this year with L. Manlove as postmaster.

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A narrow-gauge railroad was laid in the year 1879 from Cherokee to Parsons and passed through Monmouth. The good farm land and the fact that the whole south end of the county was underlaid with an abundance of excellent coal made Monmouth a desirable location in the early days.

In 1869 A. M. Chadsey built a store room and put in a stock of general merchandise. The mail was carried on horseback from Osage Mission (St. Paul) via Monmouth to Pleasant View, 45 miles and back, one a week in 1869.

The first Sunday School in the county was held in the log store house of Lafe Manlove, at Monmouth in 1866. Rev. Isaac Thorp was elected as superintendent. Many people traveled for miles to attend this school.

The first murder and lynching in Crawford County occurred on April 25, 1866. An account of the murder and lynching:

Ralph Warner, a settler across the creek south of Monmouth, was the owner of. a large herd of cattle. While at Ft. Scott on business, Mr. Warner met the Tippie boys who lived in Linn County. They were considered hard characters and were accused of robbing their uncle of several thousand dollars a few weeks before. They immediately wanted to buy Warner's cattle and a trade was made which amounted to several thousand dollars. A. 1 1 4 4 - 1

The plan of the Tippie boys was to buy the cattle and rob Mr. Warner of the money the same night. Two of the Tippie boys came down and stayed several days, and in the evening, just before dark, paid for the cattle and started in the night with them for Ft. Scott.

Mr. Warner, having been warned by his neighbors about the slick deals the Tippie boys played, gathered the men of the neighborhood as fast as he could after the deal to prepare for the attack, thinking it would be that night. Just at dark two men were seen coming toward the cabin, but the men lying under the wagons outside, supposing them to be the neighbors, paid no attention to them.

The first to attract attention was the firing of the guns in the house. Two other brothers had walked in on the waiting crowd and began their work of death. Warner's brother-in-law, Lem Channon, had his pistol apart cleaning it, and he at once closed with the foremost robber, and was shot with it in his arms. A man by

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the name of William Lamb did the best he could and shot off the thumb of one of the robbers. The women held on to Mr. Lamb so as to prevent his doing effective work. Mr. Warner ran to the woods with the money and the robbers after him but he escaped.

A posse was sent after the men with the cattle to arrest them as accomplices. Through the lightning flashed and the thunder roared, the men rode on through the deluge of rain and overtook the men and the cattle near the present site of Farlington. No trace of the rest murderers could be found and was evident that the men with the cattle would have to suffer as accomplices.

It was decided that they should have a fair deal. As there was no law or office (before the county was organized) Jacob Miller was elected judge, and others appointed to prosecute and defend, and so the trial began.

Men were sworn and witnesses examined with as much form as in a properly constituted court. Men paced the room with Winchesters, while outside a group of armed men stood guard as they expected a band of robbers would try to liberate their fellows.

The outcome of the trial was that after hearing the evidence the jury decided that these men were accomplices and the crowd was then asked to form a line, and when the command should be given for those to step forward three paces who favored hanging, nearly every man made three steps.

The procession started for the timber, where the Monmouth cemetery is located and the two men were hanged until dead, and were buried under the tree where they were executed.

The cattle were afterward turned over to the uncle, who claimed that the purchase money was stolen from him by those who were hanged.

PLEASANT RIDGE, CRAWFORD COUNTY, KANSAS

In the spring of 1860 the town of Pleasant Ridge was laid out by five men from Osage Mission (now St. Paul). The site of this town lies one and a half miles southeast of the intersection of 4th and Broadway in Pittsburg.

This site was on what is now Section 33, Township 30, Range 25 E, near the present site of Pittsburg and in connectionwith George Dosser's claim now thickly covered with business houses in said city.

A schoolhouse was the only building erected and in it one term of school was taught. Pleasant Ridge was laid in ashes by the soldiers who were sent to drive out the settlers in the memorable autumn of 1860.

McCUNE (TIME), CRAWFORD COUNTY, KANSAS

McCune lies 4 miles west of Monmouth. The town was laid out in 1879 by Isaac McCune and is located on the Frisco railroad.

The first building erected was by J. T. Sherfick, and afterwards used as a hotel. I. V. McCune built a store building which was occupied by J. D. Rogers with a stock of general merchandize.

At the time McCune was laid out, a postoffice was kept by W. Welch, and the city was named "Time". This was about a half mile north of the present townsite and was moved into town, J. F. McCune appointed postmaster. The name was soon changed to McCune.

Miss Mary Ball taught the first school, followed by Daniel Hollinger, who later went to Florida.
