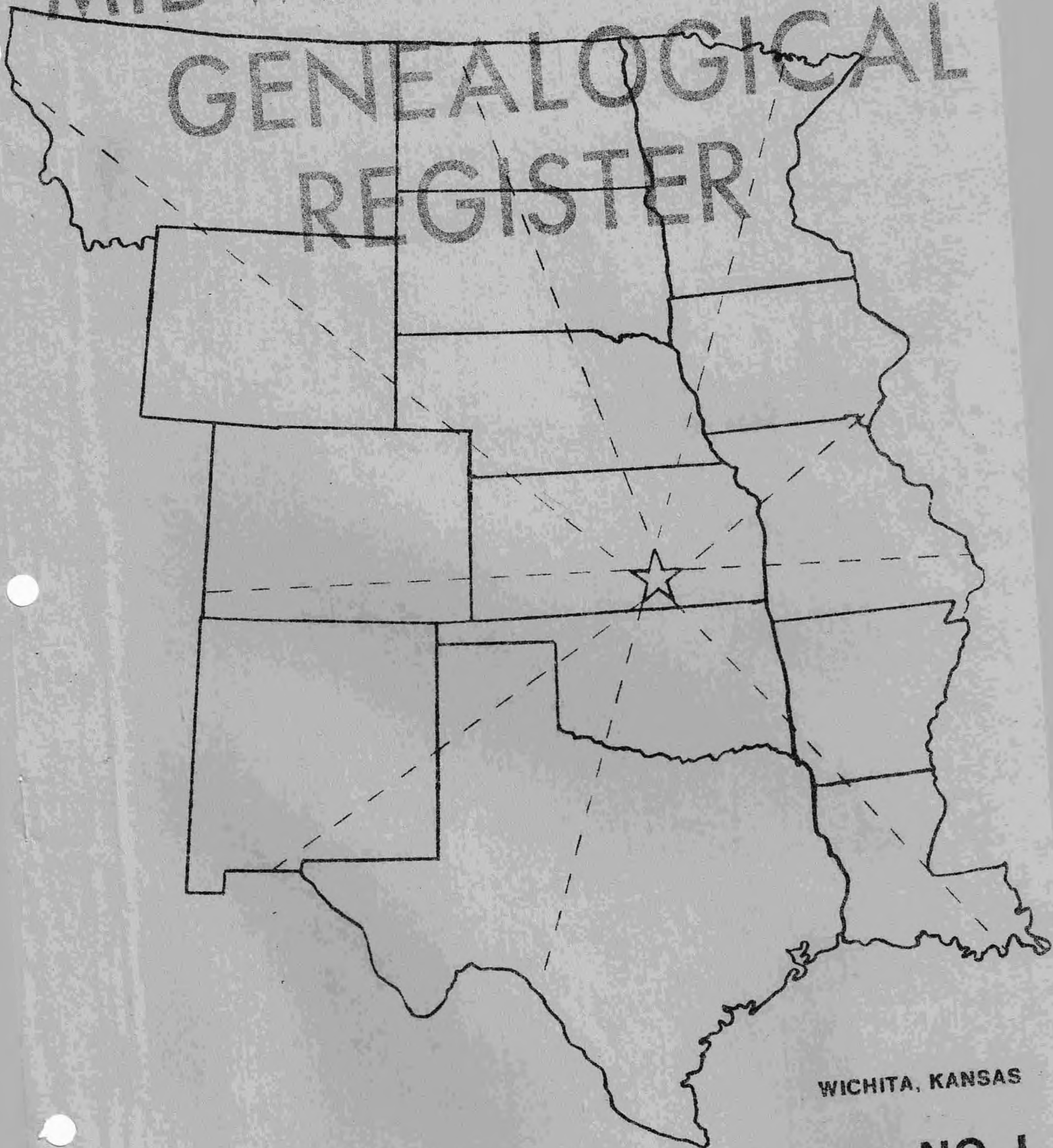

NORTH CAROLINA EMIGRANTS
ESTABLISH LONG QUAKER LINEAGE IN KANSAS
by
HARRIETTE (FITZPATRICK) HAMMER

A blustery April blizzard greeted a group of Quaker families arriving in Kansas from a warm North Carolina, in 1869. Some of their descendants still are to be found in numerous parts of Kansas.

In the "Old Timer's Column" published in the EMPORIA (KS.) GAZETTE of January 13, 1925, the following article appeared: "Reminiscences of a Quaker."--John Hammer, preacher in the Friends' Church is responsible for my father's coming to Kansas in 1869, said Jacob R. Perry, who lives on East Sixth Avenue. He came down through North Carolina where we lived, boosting for the new country out in Kansas; told us about the Friends Colony near Plymouth, Lyon County, where the Moons, Coates, Stouts and Carters lived.

We were homesteading in Perquimans County, North Carolina, at the extreme end of Dismal Swamp, with a colony of Quakers who had left the city of Philadelphia. They bought several hundred acres from the Cherokee Indians, and owned it in common as family land. When Rev. John Hammer and other Quaker ministers came down that way telling of the West, Jacob Perry's father decided to make a change. The climate had filled them all full of fever and chills and ague, and the family doctor advised the move.

"I can't remember how many children there were exactly: there was a whole brigade of us tar heels anyway," laughed Mr. Perry. "I guess we came on the only railroad there was, through Portsmouth, Norfolk, Louisville and then Kansas City to Lawrence. There we took the stage. It was the 5th of April and the cold, drizzly rain and sleet nearly froze us, for we were from the south and tender as little plants. The stage was so full that two of the bigger brothers had to ride outside with the driver." Finally an old farmer by the name of Cox, who lived on the Carney place, started to take them to Hammers. The family stayed a couple of months with John Hammer, renting rooms until they could find a homestead. Finally they got 80 acres--all that was allowed a man who had not been a soldier-- in Chase County, without a building on it. They made a dugout in the hillside the next winter, with native timber chopped and hauled from the Indian reservation.

"Jacob Perry went to school at Fruitland. The teachers were Tabitha Cone, Mahlon Oliphant and Augustus Mann. Mann had 60 pupils enrolled, from six to twenty-three years, and S. C. Moore who now lives in Americus had 56 to 60. A young fellow from Americus organized a singing school which the Morgan and Pettijohn girls attended, among others. We drove to town 17 miles to Emporia right across the country and detoured at only

one place, the Plowman farm a mile west of Ruggles. We passed just two settled farms, Sunny Slope, and the Rev. Mr. Fierry's place. The pond was right where Rice Brown's house now stands. The Wybly and Hinchley families bought and sold stock. One of the girls did domestic work for the Fithians, known all over the country as the "Iceman Fithian." Also, George Peters of the Old Peters Hardware Store. Jacob Perry began preaching about 1880. First Church at Toledo in Chase County. Mrs. Perry was a Kirkendall born on Phenix Creek in Lyon County 14 Feb. 1861. He preached in 35 counties in Kansas."

(Plymouth is located west of Emporia at the edge of Lyon County.)

* * *

The Rev. John Hammer, the Quaker minister mentioned in the article, was born in Jefferson County, Tennessee, 14 March 1827, married in Green Co., Tennessee 4 April 1846, Narcissa, daughter of Henry and Keziah (Perkins) Lewis.

He was descended from a long line of Quakers: His emigrant ancestor was James Hamer (Hammer) Sr., who came from Wales with his wife, Margaret, and their children: James Jr., Adam, Margaret, Marv and Deborah, sometime around 1710, and received a land grant from William Penn in 1713, in the Manor of Gilbert, Philadelphia, named in honor of William Penn's mother who was a Gilbert.

James Sr. died before he could build on his land, and James Jr., as the eldest son, inherited the land. When the New Providence MM was established, he gave a portion of the land to the church for the Meeting House and Burying Ground. Adam, the second son, remained in the area and also owned land near his brother. He and his wife Elizabeth, had among others, Abraham born in Providence Twp., 1731, who in 1759 received a certificate to go to Cane Creek MM, N. C. which at that time was in Orange County.

Because of the trouble that the protestors (The Regulators) of times imposed upon them by the British government, Governor Tyrone of the N. C. Colony and his assistants, broke up Orange County into several counties, and Cane Creek MM, was still located in Orange Co., but what is now Alamance County. Abraham Hammer's farm was located in the northeast part of Randolph County, originally part of Orange.

Abraham married probably after coming to North Carolina, Rebecca, her last name is not recorded, but her first name is recorded in the Monthly Meetings of Cane Creek MM. Their first child was Elisha born in 1761. The others were: Isaac, Abraham Jr., John, Mary and Rachel.

The second child of Abraham and Rebecca Hammer was Isaac who was born 20 Nov. 1763. About the time of the Battle of

Guilford Courthouse in 1771, when Isaac was 17, the Tories tried to impress him into the British army. Because he resisted, he was struck over the head with a sword, receiving an injury, the scar of which he carried the rest of his life. After the British imprisoned him, his mother entreated them to release her son, protesting that he wouldn't make them a very good soldier as he was and would remain a Quaker. They were evidently impressed and released him.

Isaac Hammer married his first wife Lydia Mendenhall in Guilford County in 1784 and had by her, four sons: Josse, Elisha, Aaron and Jonathan. After her death in 1794 or 1795, he with his four sons left North Carolina and moved to Green County, Newhope MM, Tennessee, where he was received on certificate from Friends. In 1798 he married for a second time, Hannah, daughter of Aaron and Charity (Mendenhall) Mills, in Lost Creek Meeting House, Jefferson County, Tenn. Seven children were born to them there: Lydia, Hannah, Charity, Rachel, John, Nathan and Laban.

The third son of Isaac and Lydia Hammer, was Aaron born 30 Aug. 1792, and married (1) Rachel, daughter of Samuel and Keziah Ellis in Green Co., Tenn. After her death in 1825, he married 26 April 1826 Mary Neal. He had only one daughter by Hannah, and by his second wife Mary, he had eight children, the first of whom was Rev. John Hammer born 14 March 1827.

The 22nd of September, 1860 Aaron and Mary Hammer and their two youngest children were given a certificate from Newhope MM to remove to Kansas MM. Their son John had married Narcissa, daughter of Henry and Keziah Lewis, 4 April 1846 in Newhope MM, and six children were born there. On 23rd of Nov. 1861, John and his family received a certificate to move to Kansas, and he settled near his father in Flymouth about 17 miles west of Emporia, Kansas on the Lyon-Chase County line. He became a well-known Quaker minister, traveling back to the Eastern Monthly Meetings, encouraging people to come to Kansas and take up land.

The following are records taken from Rev. John Hammer's Family Bible, published in Philadelphia, Penna., 1845, by "The Bible Association of Friends." The Bible is now owned by Edna (Lowe) Lawton, who is the daughter of William H. and Calista (Hammer) Lowe, and granddaughter of Rev. John Hammer. Mrs. Lowe resides in Seal Beach, Ca.
