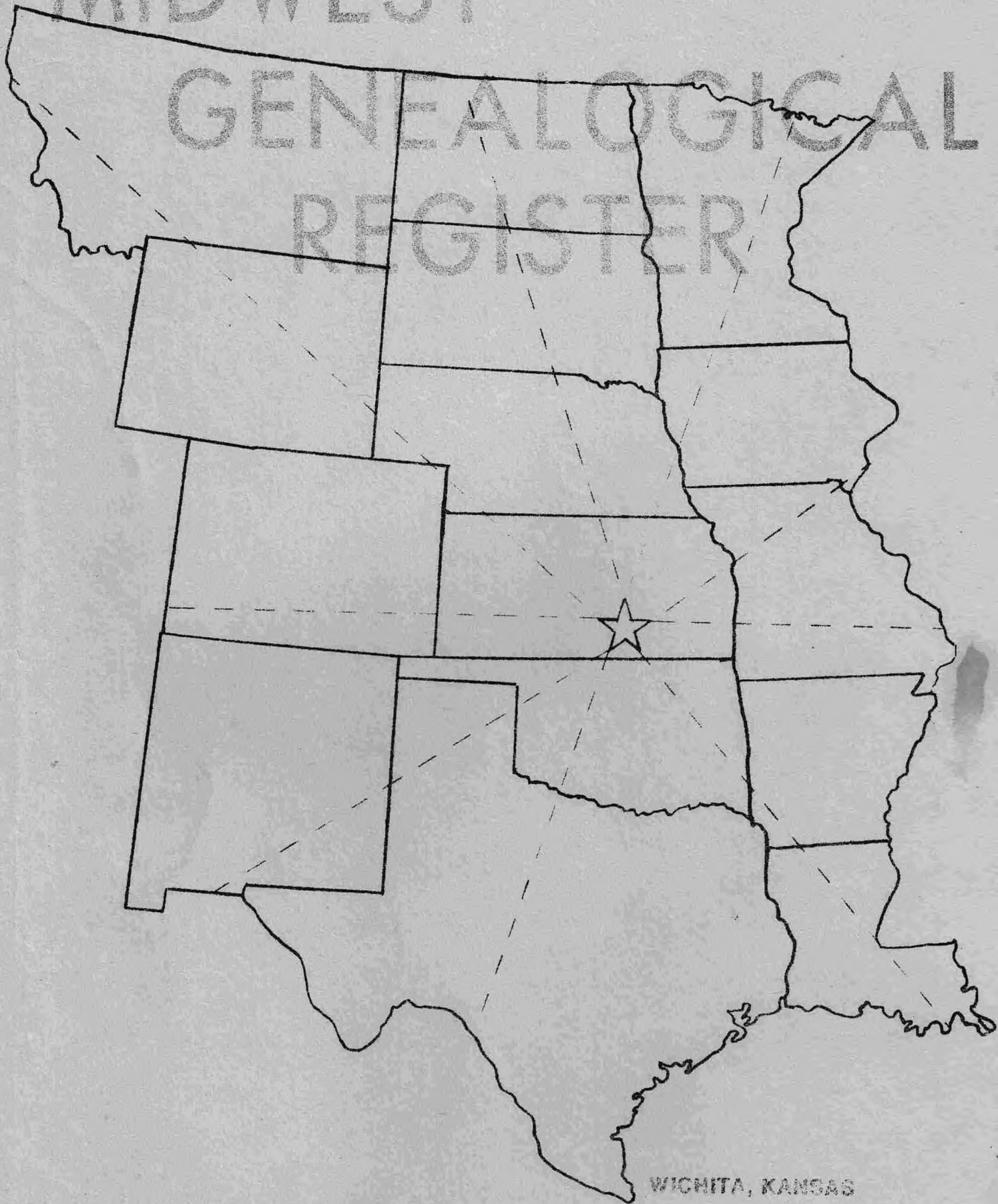

Rural Emlenton, Venango County  
Pennsylvania

" I WILL LIFT UP MINE EYES UNTO THE HILLS, FROM WHICH COMETH MY HELP."  
Wrote the psalmist.

In the calm majestic grandeur of the mountains there is peace and tranquility for the tired soul, spent by cares and duties of life.

The Big Bend Methodist Church was built and organized by John Middleton and Elisha Lawrence, in 1835.

At that time there were only four members. The above named gentlemen and their wives.

Regular services have been held from its organization up to the present time.

On May 27th, 1882, plans and specifications for the erections of an M.E. Church, for the Big Bend Appointment, Scrubgrass Township, Venango County, Pennsylvania were drawn up as follows:

Said church to be forty-six feet long by thirty-three feet in width, one story high. Stone work to consist of a wall two feet and four inches at lowest point ranged work from the ground. No stone to be over one foot thick with one with one stone four feet by six inches in front of door with steps on three sides, eight inches by twelve inches wide, sufficient for the entrance. Wall to be laid in fresh lime mortar. The sills white oak nine inches by eleven. Sillings, white oak to be placed on stone piers every nine feet. The ground joice, 2x10 inches. White oak framed one inch above the top of sills. The floor to be yellow pine. Studing 2x6 in 18 feet long with double plate. 17 feet in the clear from floor to ceiling. The upper joice to be 2 inches by eight inches, rafters 2 in x 6 inches. Rafters studing and joice to be No. 1 hemlock to be placed 16 inches from center to center; Battentrobate siding of first class pine sided up on inside with inch hemlock to plaster on sprucken out. Hemlock sheeting pine shingles 16 inches long, four inches to the wether first class. Building to contain eight windows, hung on waits and one double door with transsum, roff one-third pitch and cornice to project thirty inches, with bed and crowned moulding.

Belfrey Base seven by seven feet, hight twelve feet studing fram four val-leys and half pitch roof and finished up accordingly design or droft, a lader recess in the wall from the floor to belfrey, inclosed by door.

Plastering to consist of three coats, two coats under the wainscot and cae-ing and one hard coat finish.

Painting to consist of three coat work of pure white led and linseed oil. Stage for pulpit to be eleven x fourteen feet seven inches high. Altar to be one foot one inch above the stage high black walnut rail three by six inches in a molded form. The balusters to be turned with a three by four inch bass to be placed twelve inches from center to center stand for pulpit six by eight feet.

The stage and balaster to be built on corners of a quarter circle of three feet in diameter (pulpit) each. Pew: The pews to be made of pine 13 inches wide, ash backs  $1\frac{1}{2}$  in. thick by 17 in high pattent ends, the style of pews windows door and transum as in the grant graft.

Wainscot to be ash and cherry; to extend up to windows to the cross isle and from cross isle around the pulpit 4 ft cleare from the floor; with a round cap and cove molding of ash and cherry and the same to continue around over the doors, and the windows, The pew, and wainscot to be oild and varnished Two brick flues, 16x24 in projecting down from ceiling 6 ft, each and finished according to draft The church to have three isle; center isle  $3\frac{1}{2}$  ft side isles 2 ft; 30 seats (24 front and six side seats) all surfaced timbers to be a Nol dry and all work done in a good workmanlike manner Motion to adjourn sec- mot carried to adjourn to meet on tuesday 30th of may 1882 at Jas W Ogden. (The pulpit to be as in grant church with two small building Coal house and water closet 6x10 Pattent siding same as church and stone corners Painted the same as church three coats.

(The above information was taken from the original minutes and copied as accurately as possible.)

The Big Bend, known then as the M.E. CHURCH, was dedicated on the 15th of October, 1882, by Reverend Jno. Pete, P.E., Jno. Lusher, paster at Milers-town, and Rev. Wm. Bransfield, pastor of the charge.

On Saturday, October 14th, 1882, the first services were held in the church. This was the time of the first quarterly meeting on the charge after conference.

The first sermon was preached by Reverend J.L. Stratton, of North Washington, from the words; "Receive Ye the Holt Ghost." In the evening Reverend G. H. Hall preached to a respectable audience, after which about \$ 400.00 was raised to free the church from debt.

The contractors received \* 1591.00 for building the church. \$ 25.95¢ was paid extry for glass.

The furnishings of the church, the insurance, etc., cost \$ 110.68¢  
Entire cost \$ 1727.63

We the trustees - are satisfied that all business has been properly done - and the accounts are correct.- Carried - by all present James Ogden & A.S. Nicely having left before business was done.

The amount of money for M.E. Church, in E. Lawrence, hands \$23.00 - He was request to recit all - that- may yet be paid- for church

## BI-CENTENNIAL NOTES

### FROM OUR MEMBERS

#### PATRICK CAMPBELL, REVOLUTIONARY WAR SOLDIER

PATRICK CAMPBELL is said to have been a soldier in the army of General Braddock, a statement which cannot be confirmed as the British War Office advises that the papers of Braddock's Expedition cannot be found. After the French and Indian War he returned to the Youghiogheny Valley and settled on Sewickly Creek in what is now south western Westmoreland County. The date of his settlement there is not known, however this area was at that time a part of Cumberland County, and we can assume it was about 1760. This assumption is based on the fact that in the Boquet Papers the name of Patrick Campbell appears on a list of Militia in the lower town at Fort Pitt 30 June 1761. On 15 Nov. 1762 Col. Henry Boquet, Commander at Fort Pitt, granted Patrick Campbell permission to settle on Big Sewickley Creek. The document was recorded at Carlisle, the seat of Cumberland County, 27 Aug. 1788. The tract is described by metes and bounds.

Patrick Campbell was a Captain of Rangers on the Frontier during the Revolutionary War, 1778-1783. His wife was Jane (Campbell), who was the mother of his children. They came together to Westmoreland County. The acquisitions of several other properties in the Sewickley Creek area (South Huntington and Sewickley Townships) are on record.

After the death of Jane (Campbell) Campbell, Patrick Campbell married Mary, widow of Peter Studebaker. In an agreement 19 March 1796, before their marriage, each waved dower or courtesy as to the property of the other spouse.

Patrick Campbell died intestate in 1804 and by an order of the Orphans Court of Westmoreland County his property was divided among his seven children: John, Robert, William, James, Elizabeth, Mary, and Thomas.

I am descended from Patrick Campbell through his son Robert, who married Elizabeth Boone. Robert Campbell died of injuries suffered in the War of 1812.

#### RAUSCHS AND THE REVOLUTION

The United States gained in population by one more on 19 Oct. 1736 with the arrival of Johan Adam Rausch in Philadelphia on the Brig, John. Oaths of Allegiance to the government were taken on this day. He came from the Palatine seeking religious and political freedom.

Married to a Susanna Schlern in 1740, they became parents of a

large family. This is one of the few families thought to have had nine or ten sons in the Revolution.

They are believed to have been in the famous German Regiment (8th Virginia) formed by the Rev. Peter Muhlenburg. Rev. Muhlenburg was a personal friend of Patrick Henry and George Washington. Tradition say that in January of 1776 Rev. Muhlenburg preached a great sermon in the old church at Rude's Hill in the Shenandoah Valley. Reaching the end of his sermon he threw aside his clerical robes and underneath was wearing the full dress uniform of a Continental Colonel. It was thought that many of the Rausch brothers joined at that time. They are often listed as Balser, Philip, John, Jacob, Samuel. George and Jonas were with General Washington at the Battle of Yorktown.

This family was prominent in the Shenandoah Valley of Virginia, and later descendants were pioneer settlers in Ohio. The Johan Adam Rausch family is now believed to have over 100,000 descendants. Literally translated Rausch means to "root out or to dig". This they seem to have done well.

#### BLASE FAMILY HISTORY

HENRY LOUIS BLASE, the first of our Blase Family to come to America, arriving in Philadelphia 21 Nov. 1846, aboard ship Louise Marie, was born at Reineberg near Lubbecke, in the Kreis of Minden, Germany, year of 1809. Henry Herman, the second son, lived with his father in Phila. and learned the trade of boot and shoemaker.

In 1878, Henry Herman moved his family of wife, Elizabeth, sons, Louis, Albert and Charles to Wichita and took up the boot and shoe business again. His shop and residence were where the new City Hall now stands. Shortly after they came here, his wife and eldest son Louis died from diphtheria. Six years later he married again and to Mary Gloeser. Two more sons, Oscar Henry, and Franklyn, were born. Henry Herman continued to work in the shoe business until in 1914 he was a victim of a streetcar accident and died. His wife Mary had preceded him in death by two months.

Oscar Henry Blase, the son, continued to live and raise his family in Wichita. His wife, Bessie, was the mother to three sons, Oscar, Jr., William, Eugene, and three daughters, Bessie, Patience, and Ruth. He was engaged in the building industry all his life, and helped construct many outstanding structures in the city. He was also active in political and Labor Organizations. He passed away in 1959.

The eldest son, Oscar, is retired from City of Wichita, William is working and living in San Jose, Calif., Eugene is living in Houston, Tx., eldest daughter, Bessie, married Hayard Chance and lives in Derby, Ks., Patience married Lyle Hilleary and lives in Wichita, Ruth married Andrew Sullivan and lives at Haysville, Ks.
