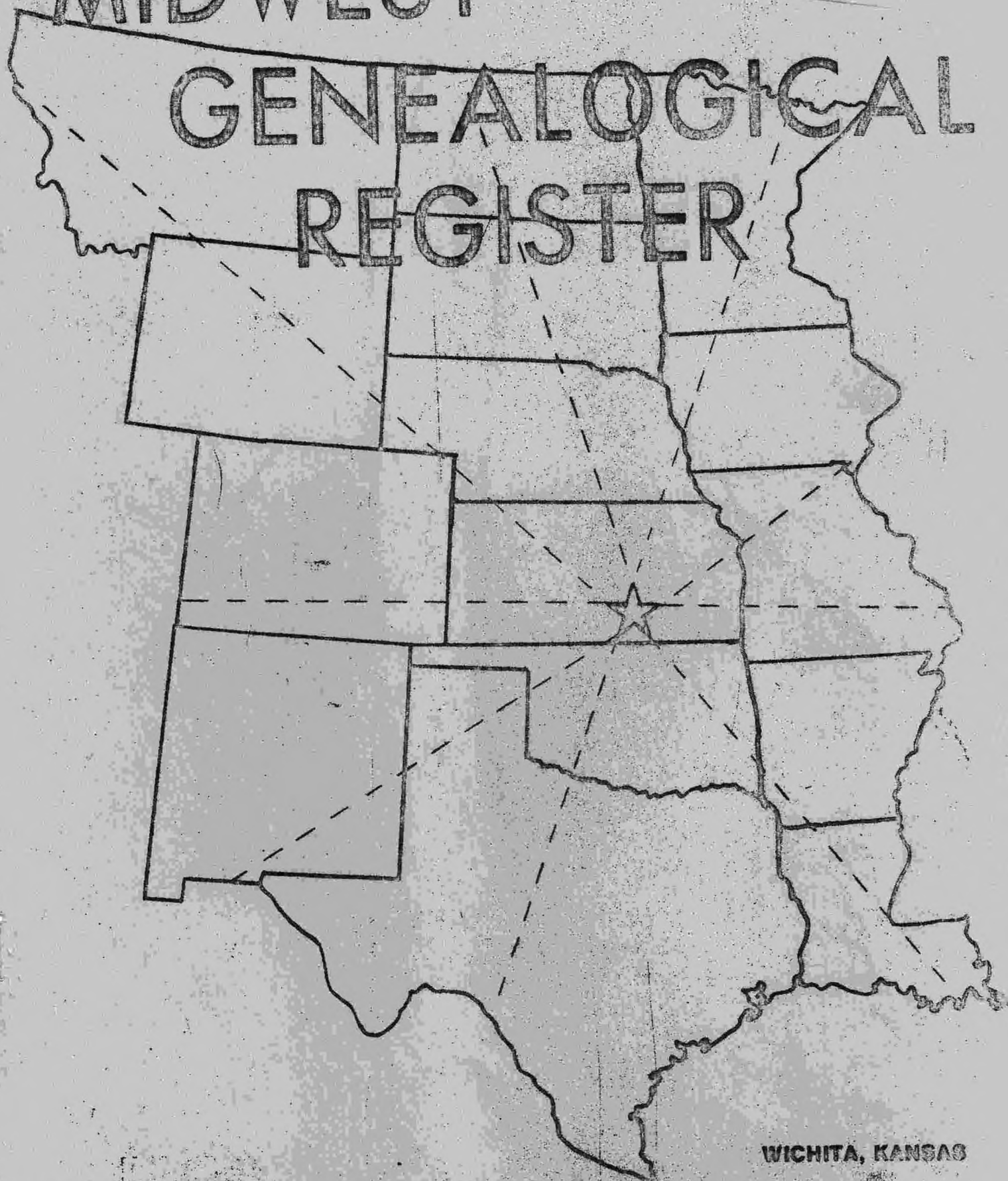

The Ridge Runners is a quarterly published Feb., May, Aug., & Nov., Sub. \$12.00 per year. Back issues are available as follows: Vol I (166 pgs) \$5.00, Vol II (260 pgs) \$8.00, Vol III (249 pgs) \$8.00, Vol IV (321 pgs) \$10.00. All Volumes are bound and indexed.

Genealogy coverage is from Virginia, North Carolina, Kentucky, Tennessee, Indiana, Illinois, Missouri and Arkansas.

Vol. V includes a bibliography of published county records of Kentucky by counties, including some which have been compiled and typed but not actually published. Some Cemetery records compiled on a large scale for a given county.

These books will be found in various libraries and most will be found in any of these major collections: KY. Hist. Library, Frankfort, Ky.; DAR Library, Washington, D.C.; The Genealogical Lib. Salt Lake City, Utah.

Also included in Vol V: Transcripts from: JEFFERSON CO. TEN. Will Book I, 1792-1810; BUNCOMBE CO., N.C. Second & Third Terms of Court 1792; Abstracts from EARLY MISSOURI NEWSPAPERS; FAUQUIER CO., Va. Biographical sketches; Books to Loan and Periodicals. General information on research with warnings not to pass up a book just because name looked for is not in index. Marriage names are not always included in index.

This paragraph is worthy of exact quote: "Published records are excellent to use in beginning research in a county. Their indexes help locate ancestors in a specific locality. However, the reliability and completeness of such records varies greatly. For that reason, and in order to obtain more data, photocopies of the original documents should be procured."

BICENTENNIAL NOTES

After General Burgoyne's surrender to General Gates at Saratoga in October, 1777, the fighting then moved south.

General Gates became Commander of American Forces in the south. As he led an attack on a British outpost in Camden, South Carolina, Cornwallis suddenly confronted him. In the battle that followed on August 16, 1780, James VEATCH, serving as a soldier in the South Carolina Militia received wounds from which he died October 29, 1780.

This James VEATCH's grandfather emigrated from Scotland to America where James VEATCH and his father were born. By lineal descent I am eight generations from this James VEATCH who served in the Revolutionary War.

The patriots paid dearly for their victory. Estimates of American battle deaths range from 4,435 to 12,000. The cost of the war has been estimated at \$101 million. Historians do not know the cost of the war to Britain in the battle deaths and money.

* * * * *

" A REVOLUTIONARY WAR SOLDIER"

John Linn (or Lynn, Linn) came to America, arriving in Charleston, South Carolina, December 20, 1772 on the ship Dundee, Captain Gillies, from Larne, Antrim County Ireland. The Dundee was one of several ships arriving that week with Irish passengers - "over 1000 souls". He and his family were a part of a large group with the Reverend William Martin from Kellswater Congregation in Ireland. Ballymony was the center of the Reformed Presbyterian Church in that area. Rev. Martin was the first Covenanter Preacher ordained in Ireland. His members, who came with him settled on Rocky Creek, Chester District, South Carolina. His people took up bounty lands and all tried to settle in that same area.

John Linn received a grant of 200 acres later known as Henry Moffats "Cherry Place". He acquired more land so his will, dated 19 March 1814 and gave to his eldest son 120 acres and to Henry 126 acres "as well as other property I have already given to him". His youngest son Mathew Malcom a fine horse and his share of all property sold at public auction. The three daughters; Jean McGuire, Mary Minnis, and Jonnie Barber had already received some portions.

John Linn (1737-1820) married in Ireland 10 December 1770, Janet Malcom (1747-1813). Her parents were Henry and Margaret Malcom of Ballymena, Ireland. They wrote their son-in-law a letter dated 30 May 1773. Their first child Jane (Jean) was born 22 August 1771. She married my paternal Gt. Gt. Grandfather, John McGuire 1772 in Lisneskia Parish in County Fermanagh, Ireland 2 May 1793. He died 1833, Sparta Illinois. John Linn Served as a private in the South Carolina Troops (DAR Lineage Book) He is buried in Pauls Cemetery near Chester, South Carolina with his wife and some of his children.

THE ANN MADDY EPISODE

Ann MADDY, after losing her husband who was a soldier in the Revolutionary War from from Virginia, by accidental drowning in the Shenandoah River, immigrated with her children to Monroe County, and settled on what is still known as the "Charles Maddy Place" near Saltpeter Cave, near Greenville. Here she reared her family. She had a considerable estate in Virginia, which it became necessary for her to return to settle up. She rode horseback through the mountains and wilderness, crossing the Allegheny Mountains alone. After transacting her affairs and recovering her money, a considerable sum, she proceeded on her return and in doing so, she stopped over night with a settler in the wilderness. During her stay she incidently disclosed the fact of her carrying on her person considerable funds. On the next morning, the gentleman of the house told her he knew a direct route through the hills that would save her a great part of the distance and volunteered to show her the near cut. They proceeded for some time until they came to a wild place and a great cliff, where the man stopped, told her to give him her money and declared his object to be, to secure the money which she carried on her person in her clothing, and to murder her. She declined to give up the money. When he demanded her to take off her dress, it being his purpose to secure it and the money therein and then throw her over the cliff. She requested him to turn his back as she did not desire to undress in his presence. This he did, turning his back to her and facing the precipice, whereupon she gave him a sudden push with all her strength sending him over the cliff and into the ravine below, where he was instantly killed, thus saving her own life as well as her money. She then proceeded on her journey and arrived at her home in safety.

Mr. James¹ MADDY was of English descent, married the Dutch lady, Miss Ann MORRIS, as figures in the above episode, just after the Revilutionary War. They formed the tree which sent forth its branches over the country. To this union there were ten sons and one daughter born, which are now scattered over the country generally, but there are more of their descendents found in Ohio than elsewhere, although many are found in Iowa, West Virginia and also in Summer County, Kansas.

The book "US MADDYS" was published by Miss Olive Maddy of Oskaloosa, Iowa, in July of 1950. It is found in many libraries in the United States.

I REMEMBER GRANDPA

Louis Marion HAMILTON was born May 19, 1867, near Alton, Illinois, the oldest of nine children born to Byron HAMILTON and Jemima Miranda SIPPY.

Louis was my great-grandfather whom I remember with much love and affection. I recall the pleasure of sitting on his lap reading to him from my first grade reader and his long yarns about seeing Jesse James when he was a boy. He loved to talk of the past and I only wish now I could recall half of his stories.

The story was told to me recently by my mother who sat at his bedside when he died in 1957. Grandpa's mind wandered a great deal the night before he died. He told about the first stagecoach into Alpena Pass, Arkansas.

It was a hot, dusty, sultry summer day. Everyone was watching for the stage and the crowd was excited and noisy. The children played tag. Finally they could see a speck of dust far off and a bugle sounded. The people watched and watched as the stage grew nearer. Dignitaries with top hats got off the stage and mounted a platform built for the occasion. Welcoming speeches were made and the ladies of the town brought covered dishes and a large dinner was spread out. After awhile, the dignitaries got back on the stage and rode off in a cloud of dust. The stage was pulled by four white horses.

(This must have been in the 1870's.)

Grandpa lived a varied and full life. He was a coal-miner, a preacher, a farmer, a carpenter. He was very religious and believed an education necessary for his ten children. He was twenty when he married fourteen year old Mary Elizabeth HANCOCK. They celebrated their 70th wedding anniversary in 1957, a few months before he died. He was completely blind in one eye and had dim sight in the other but he still walked to church on his 90th birthday to put his 90 pennies in Sunday School. His last years were spent at Mulberry, Kansas, and is now laid to rest in Sheffield Cemetery, Arcadia, Kansas.

BIOGRAPHICAL RECORD
OF
GRANVILLE G. ADKINS
Submitted by, Wm. Adkins

Granville Adkins was born in Owens County, Kentucky, 25 December 1832. He married Madalina (Della) Patterson, 16 December 1856 in Platte Co., Missouri. There were two children born to this couple, both died in infancy.

The career of this Gentleman is Historical and sensational. He was the son of Ed. G. Adkins of Welsh descent, his ancestors emigrating to Virginia before the Revolutionary War, in which both Grandparents of our subject took part on the side of the Continentals.

The Father then settled in Kentucky where he farmed in the summer and operated a mill the year round until 1833, when he moved to Lewis County Missouri. There he followed the trade of farming and erected and operated a mill on Sugar Creek between the towns of Monticello and Canton, owning at this time one thousand acres of valuable farm land. In 1812 he removed to Platte County where he engaged extensively in raising hemp.

Mr. Adkins mother, whose maiden name was Eliza Garvey, was born in Virginia and died in Leavenworth, Kansas in 1878. She was buried at Platte City, Missouri. Mr. Adkins Sr. passed away in 1849. Mrs. Adkins was the mother of five sons and two daughters, at this writing all had passed away except Granville G and his Sister, Mrs. Howard Conley of Leavenworth, Kansas.

Granville G. Adkins was reared in Lewis County Missouri until 1842 when his parents moved to Platte County where they gave him all the Education that was to be had at that time.

We find Mr. Adkins was freighting for the government from Fort Leavenworth through the Indian Reservations. In 1850 he emigrated westward, the trip across the plains taking ninety days. He traveled by covered wagon drawn by a team of oxen. The party landed in Sacramento, California where they mined for six months at the end of which time they returned by way of the steamer "eureka" which cruised along the coast of Mexico and the Gulf States, landing in New Orleans, from there back home to Platte County Missouri.

In 1856 Mr. Adkins went to Kansas where he took an active part in the Border Warfare. At the close of these troubles Mr. Adkins returned to his farm which he sold in a short time and moved to Lexington, Missouri where he set up a wholesale and retail grocery store. He followed this occupation until war was declared between the North and the South. He then enlisted in Cavanaugh's Company under Joe Shelby's command. He was in the battle of Pea Ridge where he was wounded.

Upon returning home he found his wife very ill. She died a short time after the war. This was a very colorful and interesting family of the early days.

Here rest the bodies of FRANCIS BAILEY, aged 35; APOLLOS J. STEPHENS 27; WARREN B. ROBINSON, 24; CHARLES H. GOFF, 23; members of the Spencer Grey's, company A, 2d Reg't Indiana Volunteers, who fell at the battle of Buena Vista, Mexico, Feb. 22 and 23, 1847.

'The Soldier is his country's stay in day and hour of danger.'
'How sleep the brave who sink to rest, by all their country's wishes blest?'

JOHN T. LEWIS, aged 21; MARTIN HOWARD, 18; JOSEPH MORGAN, 19; LAIKEN CUNNINGHAM, 22; members of the 'Spencer Greys, 'died in the Mexican campaign, 1846-47; also HENRY W. WALKER, aged 37; THOS. J. TYLER, 19, of the same company, who returned home and died of disease contracted in the service."

NEW ALBANY, INDIANA

REV. JOHN MATTHEWS, D. D., Professor of Theology on the Presbyterian Theological Seminary at New Albany, Ia. Born in Guilford County, N. C., Jan. 19, 1772; died in New Albany, May 18, 1848, at the age of 76 years and 4 mo. "Blessed are the dead which die in the Lord from henceforth; yea, saith the Spirit, that they may rest from their labors; and their works do follow them."

NEW ALBANY, INDIANA

LEONIDAS SHACKELFORD, of Glasgow, Missouri, born Jan. 7, 1833, died Aug. 5, 1852. In whose memory this monument is erected by his brothers and sisters. Without earthly friends, he died in a strange land, realizing in full a sainted mother's prayer, that a precious Bible which she had given him would be his guide through life, and in death his consolation. Prov: verses 17 to 23.

ZANESVILLE, OHIO

Sacred to the memory of JOHN MCINTIRE, who departed this life July 29, 1815, aged 56 years. He was born at Alexandria, Virginia, laid out the town of Zanesville in 1800, of which he was the Patron and Father. He was a member of the Convention which formed the Constitution of Ohio. A kind husband, an obliging neighbor, punctual to his engagements; of liberal mind, and benevolent disposition, his death was sincerely lamented.

ZANESVILLE, OHIO

Sacred to the memory of WILLIAM RAYNOLDS, a native of Virginia, he emigrated to Ohio in 1804, and settled in the town at the foot of this hill, where he departed this life Nov. 12, 1844, aged 50 Years.

Who, though formed in an age when corruption ran high,
And folly alone seemed with folly to vie;
When genius with traffic too commonly strain'd,
Recounted her merits by what she had gain'd,
Yet spurn'd at those walks of debasement and self,
And in poverty's spite, dared to think for himself.

ZANESVILLE, OHIO

Man goeth to his long home, and mourners go about the streets. Within this case lieth the mortal part of DAVID HARVEY, who was born in the parish of Hogen, county of Cornwall, England, June 21, 1746; arrived in Fredericktown, Md., June, 1774, and voted for the Independence of the United States; supported the war by furnishing a soldier during the term thereof, according to an act of the Assembly of that State. Arrived on the bank of the Muskingum River, at Zanesville, Ohio, 10th of Dec., 1800. Died May, 1845, aged 69 years.

PUTNAM OHIO

WILLIAM WELLES, born in Clastenburg, Conn., 1754. Among the pioneers of the North West Territory, he shared largely in their labors, privations and perils. In 1790, he located at Cincinnati. As Commissary he was with the army of St. Clair,

Book Review

"BLUE RIDGE MOUNTAIN KINFOLKS"

This book is a record of Ancestors, Descendents, and Relatives of the Author and his wife, including the families of: Fisher - Gilbert - Hall - Hartley - Hill - King - Kirby. Published by the Author, Larry King, 1976 of 1001 Lincoln St., Manchester, Tenn., 37355.

A book of very good records of ancestors and descendents, including many more than those listed above.

Four principal discussed in detail are the Hill family of Grayson Co., Virginia, the Fisher family of Wythe County, Virginia, Lawson family of Stokes County North Carolina, the Hartley family of Rappahannock County, Virginia. The second four principal Families are the Kirby Family, Surry County, North Carolina, Hall family of Grayson County, Virginia, the Gilbert family of Patrick County, Virginia and the King family of Wythe County, Virginia. Other ancestors are mentioned in the text of the book.

Records of individuals are in order by generations, first ancestor discussed first and then on down the line.

The material for the book was gathered from all possible ancestors and their descendents, court house records, census records, military, historical, immigration, migration, church, cemetery, family, and all other records available. About 2500 letters to the adult relatives asking for material on themselves and their entire family. Many relatives helped in accumulating the material used in this book.

The book starts with Michael Kreiger the first known Hill family ancestor, who was born in Germany ca 1718. Kreiger came over to the United States on the boat "Snow Fox" and landed at the port of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, 12 October 1738, Chas. Ware was commanding the boat. They came from Rotterdam, Holland but last from Plymouth, England. Kreiger took the Oath of Allegiance and was ca 20 year of age.

The book is indexed very well by listing the Surnames first and then all of the given names of that particular family, which makes it very easy to check.

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and was wounded in its memorable defeat. In 1800, he settled in Zanesville, subsequently he removed to Putnam, where he lived respected and beloved by all who knew him, and died universally lamented, on the 26th of Jan., 1814.

PUTNAM, OHIO

DR. INCREASE MATTHEWS, born in Braintree, Massachusetts, Dec. 22, 1772. Died June 6, 1856. "Blessed is the man in whose spirit there is no guile." Psalms XXXII: 2. Dr. Matthews emigrated to Marietta, Ohio, 1800. In the spring of 1801 he removed to Zanesville, and the same year bought the land which forms the cemetery, including the town plat of Putnam. For some time he was the only physician in the county. Among the early pioneers of the valley of the Muskingum, his many unostentatious virtues, and the purity and simplicity of his life and character were known and appreciated.

GOSHEN, OHIO

DAVID ZEISBERGER, who was born 11th April, 1721, in Moravia, and departed this life 7th Nov., 1808, aged 87 years, 7 months and 6 days. This faithful servant of the Lord labored among the Moravian Indians, as a missionary, during the list sixty years of his life.

MARIETTA, OHIO

GEN. RUFUS PUTNAM, died May 4, 1824, in the 87th year of his age.

MARIETTA, OHIO

Sacred to the memory of COMMODORE ABRAHAM HIPLE, whose naval skill and courage will ever remain the pride and boast of his country. In the Revolution, he was the first on the seas to hurl defiance at proud Britain, gallantly leading the way to wrest from the mistress of the seas her scepter, and there wave the star spangled banner. He also conducted to the sea the first square rigged vessel ever built on the Ohio, opening to commerce resources beyond calculation. He was born Sept. 26th, A.D. 1773, and died May 26th, 1819, aged 85 years.

MARIETTA, OHIO

Here lies the body of his Excellency, RETURN JONATHAN MEIGS, who was born at Middletown, Connecticut, Nov.--, 1766, and died at Marietta, March 29, 1825. For many years his time and talents were devoted to the service of his country. He successively filled the place of Judge of the Territory North-west of the Ohio, Senator of Congress of the United States, Governor of the State, and Post Master General of the United States. To the honoured and revered memory of an ardent Patriot, a practical Statesman, an enlightened Scholar, a dutiful Son, an indulgent Father, an affectionate Husband, this monument is erected by his mourning widow, SOPHIA MEIGS.

MARIETTA, OHIO

In memory of DOCTOR SAMUEL HILDRETH, a native of Massachusetts, who died at Belbre, August 6th, A. D. 1823, aged 73 yrs. Death is the good man's friend-the messenger who calls him to his Father's house.

MARIETTA, OHIO

MARTHA BRAINERD, daughter of DR. JOSEPH SPENCER, JR., and grand-daughter of MAJ. GEN. JOSEPH SPENCER, officers in the army of the Revolution in 1775, the latter a member of the Continental Congress of 1778, born at Lebanon, Connecticut, Jan. 18, 1782, married in Virginia to STEPHEN RADCLIFF WILSON, May 20th, 1798, died at Marietta, Jan. 10th, 1852.

NORTH BEND, OHIO

Here rest the remains of JOHN CLEVES SYMMES, who at the foot of these hills made the first settlement between the Miami Rivers. Born at Long Island, state of New York, July 21, A. D. 1742; died at Cincinnati, February 26, A. D. 1814.

SPRINGFIELD, ILLINOIS

NINIAN EDWARDS, chief justice of Ky., 1808; governor Ill. Territory, 1809 to 1818; U. S. Senator, 1818 to 1824; governor state of Ill., 1826 to 1830; died July 20, 1833, in the 59th year of his age.

PASCAL PAOLI ENOS, a native of Windsor, Conn., emigrated to the valley of the Mississippi in 1816; with three others founded the city of Springfield in 1824, and died A. D. 1832, aged sixty-two. The pioneers acknowledge his virtues.

Erected by the Whigs of Springfield in memory of JOHN BRODIE, who departed this life on the 3d of Aug., 1844, in the 42d year of his age. (Second monument)-The grave of John Brodie, a native of Perth, Scotland, who departed this on the 3d of Aug., 1844, in the 42d year of his age. "Far from his native isle he lies, wrapped on the vestments of the grave."

(In the old graveyard), Sacred to the memory of REV. JACOB M. EARLY, a native of Virginia, and for seven years a resident of Springfield, Ill., combining in his character splendid natural endowments, a highly cultivated mind, undaunted moral courage, and the graces of the Christian religion. Eminent in the profession of his choice, and successful in his ministry, he enjoyed a large share of the respect and affections of an extensive and respectable acquaintance. Though called suddenly from life, he met death with a calm and amazing fortitude, in the certain ~~hope~~ of a blissful immortality, through our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. He was born Feb. 22, 1806, and died March 11, 1838, aged 32 yrs. 18 days.

JACKSON, ILLINOIS (vicinity of the colleges.)

COL. HARDIN was much esteemed, and represented this district in congress, from 1843 to 1845. Being at the head of the Illinois militia, he was requested, by the governor of the state, to take the command of a regiment of Illinois volunteers. He at first declined, not fully approving of the Mexican War. But being overpersuaded, and desirous of obtaining the approbation of all classes of his fellow-citizens, he finally consented. Tearing himself from his wife and children, he embarked, with regiment, for Mexico; but as in many other like instances, it proved with him, that "The paths of Glory lead but to the Grave."
