#### "SHACKLETT" Submitted

by Mildred Blubaugh

From information and records obtained from widely seperated places the following records are made. With very few exceptions all agree on names, dates and places.

John Shacklett, native Frenchman, born in France, in the year 1678 is the earliest member of the family which we have any record.

Ben Shacklett son of John, born in France 1710, came to America with his wife, Sarah Blancette, sailed from England in 1740 and settled in Fairfax County, Virginia. The record indicates that Ben was a fencing master. They had one son, John. After the death of his wife Sarah Blanchette, Ben with his only son returned to France where he married Catherine Tucker. Later with his second wife and son John, Ben returned to America.

- 3. John Shacklett, son of Ben, born in Virginia 1743, died 1809, married Barbara Quick, of German forebears, about the year 1770. Barbara Quick was born April 1746, died March 2, 1846, age almost 100 years.

Records indicate the Shacklett and Tucker Families were indignant over John's marriage to a German girl, presumedly, because of bad relations between the French and German people, and became estranged. John took his wife and the property inherited from his mother, Sarah Blanchette, and moved to Cheat River at the foot of Cheat Mountain in Fayette County Pennsylvania.

After her husband's death in 1809 Barbara Quick Shacklett, with her children moved to Meade Co., Kentucky in the Spring of 1810. At the age of 64 she made the trip, a distance of about 500 miles on horseback with her youngest son Jesse.

She is buried on the High Ground of Hill Grove, near Ekron, Meade County, Kentucky. One son, General Bland Shacklett, and Rachel, his wife are buried at Hill Grove, beside his mother.

A book, entitled "Early Times in Meade County, Kentucky" devotes considerable space with high tribute to the Shacklett Families. John Shacklett was a private in the American Revolution in Captain Nicholas Shinn's Company. He was a Ranger on the Frontier, 1778-1783.

The will of Ben Shacklett 1710, in Union Town, Penn Registrar and Recorders office in Will Book I, P 23, dated July 6, 1781 and probated July 17, 1784, names granddaughter, Sarah Quick, the daughter of Barbara Quick Shacklett, and grandson, Benjamin; Elizabeth Tucker, Jane Setterfield; Ann Stillwell and John Shacklett, my four children, utterly disallow, revoke and disanull all and every other former testament, will, Legacy, and bequeaths and executors in anyway before named. The will of John Shacklett, 1743-1809, is on file in the office of the Registrar and Recorder in Union Town, Pennsylvania, dated Sept 29 1809. He names his children, Sarah Jenkins, Benjamin Shacklett, Priscelia Horne, Katherine Davis, Mary Fulton, Hanna Hayden, John Shacklett, Blanchert Shacklett, Sophia Hayden and Jesse Shacklett, and, wife Sarah Quick Shacklett. Executors; Benjamin Shacklett and Charles Brownfield. The will was probated

The entries were written in the tax book crudely and haphazardly by different people. Some of the taxpayers were listed by last name only.

R. A. Davis is still paying the taxes on most of the lots in Wellington. The writing is improving but many letters are difficult to make out because of swirled and curved lines used to make capital letters which was found in English penmanship. There were still many "Unknown".
