- 2. That I will speak with courtesy to all employees of a vital records office, or of a public library, when requesting to see any vital record or library book, and that when finished with such record or book, I shall express my thanks to the person attending to my requests.
- 3. That I will not tear, erase, mark, or remove any public record or library book, and will refrain from mutilating, defacing, or otherwise destroying any part of such public record or library book.
- 4. That when I have finished viewing any public record or library book, I will return it to the proper or designated place.

This pledge is freely made by me upon penalty of forfeiting my membership in this Society.

YOUR MEMBERSHIP CARD IS YOUR LIBRARY CARD!

Our Society's membership has grown by leaps and bounds, and with volunteer help taking turns working in our library, it is impossible for each of us to know every member by sight and/or name.

Books cannot be checked out at any other library without the proper indentification and card, so please be understanding of the fact that our Society Library has become large enough to necessitate the same procedure. The Board of Directors instituted a new policy that anyone checking out books, MUST show their membership card at that time. A wife or husband may check out books for their spouse at the same time, just write the number of your spouse's membership on the back of your own card, then you always have it with you, too.

If another member asks you to check out books for them to save time and gasoline bring their card with you so that the books will be checked out in that person's name and not your name. REMEMBER only THREE books can be checked out on one membership card!

It is nice to do favors for each other, but it is inconsiderate to expect another member to limit their own book borrowing to accommodate a favor for you, so if you are the one asking the favor, provide that person with your card and save them the embarrassment of having to ask you for it, or arriving at the Library and learning that they can not check out books for you and themselves on their own number.

(If you are ill and unable to get to the Library for material contact the Librarian or Assistant Librarian at their home and they will endeavor to provide delivery of material to you.)

VERMILION COUNTY MUSEUM: A TAPESTRY FROM LONG AGO

A room waits...much as a room waited in 1876 for the return of it's mistress, Stella BARKLEY. Stella BARKLEY, loving one man but betrothed to another, died in 1876 before her marriage. Her effects, sold at auction after her parents' death, are displayed in the STELLA BARKLEY COSTUME ROOM of the Vermilion County, Kansas, Museum.

A part of the trousseau of Stella is displayed in glass-doored cases. Other personal effects trace the life of the young girl from story book to report card to the February 17, 1876, gold and satin announcement of her funeral.

An only child, she was engaged to George COOPER, her father's choice, but she loved Ben BOWMAN, of whom her father disapproved so heartily he would not allow him in the house. Despite her heart's wishes, Stella's elegant trousseau was assembled, but never worm. She died shortly before the wedding date of Scarlet Fever. Her parents sealed the trousseau in a trunk and after their death, all their goods, including Stella's trunk, were sold at auction.

Stella BARKLEY was a cousin of Mrs. Everett POTTER's grandmother. Mrs. POTTER lives near Pretty Prairie and submitted this to us.

RESEARCH: BARTON COUNTY, MISSOURI

While on a recent business-pleasure trip, your Editor stopped by the Barton County, Missouri, Historical Society and Museum. Mr. Max Lucas (no relation) was quite generous with his time, and we had a marvelous visit. For a small group, they are producing a fantastic amount of accomplishment and activity.

At the present time they are preparing information from the old ledgers of one of the original funeral homes in Lamar, Missouri, for publication. They are also compiling for publication, all the cemeteries in Barton County. They have a small-newspaper-size 48-page publication compiled and written by Marvin L. VanGilder of the History of Barton County, Missouri 1855-1972 with biographies, etc., of settlers for sale at the low price of \$3.00 (not indexed). I have found this magazine most informative and VERY interesting.

RESEARCH IN THE LDS LIBRARY - SALT LAKE CITY

Sooner or later every genealogical researcher hears the statement "You have to go to Salt Lake City. All of the answers are there. All you have to do is go there, look up your personal name, and they have the complete history of your family, right down to you and your children." Of course, this isn't quite true! So we have to ask ourselves "Why go 'way out there and spend quite a bit of money on travel, etc.? What's Salt Lake City got that we can't better find someplace else?" Well, there are several good reasons why a trip to Utah can be productive.

The Church of the Latter Day Saints and their Library have the largest genealogical holdings of any place that I know of. Their religious stress on the sanctity of the home and family make it imperative that we research our family and its history. In order that this may be done, the Mormon Church has, and is, gathering all of the records of the past that they can find available and are bringing them together and storing them for future generations. These records are then made available to Church members and non-members alike. The chief advantage of research in their Library then, is the great quantity of many diverse records available in one central place.

There are over 155,000 volumes of books, over one million rolls of microfilm, and over 40,000 rolls being added each year. The Church of Latter Day Saints have prepared a depository in a granite mountain about twenty miles south of Salt Lake City in which the vital records of over a billion people are stored. Copies of these records are some of what we will find at the LDS Library.

Since this article is for the purpose of preparing a person who has never before been to Salt Lake City, and to make it easier to know what to expect on your first visit, a few general remarks about the area would be appropriate.

Salt Lake City, the State Capitol of the State of Utah, lies on the west slope of the mountains. There are three main routes to travel by car from Wichita. One route, over the mountains west out of Denver; another route, from Garden City, Kansas, through Grand Junction, Colorado; and the third - and I think the best route, is to Denver, Colorado, north to Laramie, Wyoming, and then west to Salt Lake City. This route is Interstate all the way and I have found that it is easier and faster to drive.

After you arrive in Salt Lake City, you will find the people to be the best and the friendliest in the world. They will do all in their power to make your stay there enjoyable and happy. You will be helped and encouraged to work on all phases of family research. Motel rooms are readily available, and the food is good, and low-priced; however, do not expect to always get coffee, tea, or cokes. Caffeine and nicotine are taboo to Mormons and no good Mormon will drink coffee, tea, or coke, nor will they smoke.

The center of the City and the lives of the Mormons is Temple Square, and you certainly should include a tour of this on your agenda. All of the streets in the city are referenced from Temple Square. To locate lodging, there are a number of good motels on west North Temple Street within walking distance of the Library, but regardless of where you find lodging, North Temple Street runs from east to west along the north side of Temple Square and the Library. West Temple Street runs north to south along the west side of Temple Square. South Temple Street runs east to west along the south side of Temple Square, and Main Street runs north to south along the east side of the Temple. All of the streets in the

city are numbered north, south, east or west from Temple Square. The LDS Library is located in the west wing of the Church Administration Building, just across Main Street east of the Temple. There are many good parking lots in the area. There is one just across the street north of the Library. The charge was \$1.00 per day.

Now that we have arrived in the city, have oriented ourselves, and located lodging, what should we do now? Well, if we get there on a Sunday, we might as well do some sightseeing, or stay in our room to watch the Tabernacle Choir on television. The Library won't be open on Sunday, but bright and early Monday morning we can go to the Library. The hours are 7:30 a.m. until 10:00 p.m. every weekday except Saturday and Monday. On these days the Library closes early: 5:00 p.m. on Saturday and 6:00 p.m. on Monday.

We enter the Church Administration Building from North Temple Street, or through a beautiful garden and mall on the south. The Library is in the west wing of the building, and as we enter the Library doors, we meet the guides and information desk. It is well at this point to introduce yourself and you will be given a guided tour. The various parts of the Library will be explained. The volunteer help, all members of the Church, will gladly assist in getting you started work.

On the first floor is the card catalogue, which is the heart of any library. There are ample desks and chairs available so that you might pull a card file and go through it in detail. On the north side of the room is the shelves of family genealogy books, and a great number of them! However, before you go to the card catalogue and family genealogies, I would first suggest another step.

On the fourth floor is located the archives of family sheet and patron sheet ledgers, containing more than eight million family groups, and the Computer File Index, all of which are open to the public. Also located here is the Temple Index Bureau files which must be searched by Church personnel - a \$1.00 fee per search is required. In all probability if an item is in the Temple Index Bureau files, it will also be on one or both of the other, also.

As you get off the elevator on the fourth floor, there will be an information desk immediately in front of you. The personnel there will be most helpful in answering any questions. On the west side of the room are the shelves containing ledger books of family sheets. These sheets will contain all available information on any family that any member of the Church has researched, endowed, baptised, or sealed into the Temple. Do not be surprised if you find a sheet on your grandfather's family that is now sealed into the Mormon Church by a cousin whom you did or did not know existed.

These ledgers will contain millions of names filed in alphabetical order by dates; that is, James Smith born 1801, will be ahead of James Smith born 1805, and both of them will be filed ahead of Robert Smith.

After you have checked out all your lines of research in the Family Sheets, then go to the Patron Sheets. These are basically the same type of records, but they may not have the completed Church work and have been put on the shelves for informational purposes. Checking all of the Family and Patron Sheets can not be done in a day, and depending upon how many lines you are researching, it probably will take several days. Any sheets from any of the books will be photocopied for you at a charge of five cents per copy. There is no limit on the number of sheets you may have copied, they only ask that you bring not more than two ledgers to the counter at a time if other people are waiting.

Of course, it is evident why this start is best. In many instances, family sheets can be located which can put you in touch with someone who has worked on your families many years before. These sheets will give the name of the submitter, dates and references. In many instances a lot of hard searching can be by-passed.

Now that you have exhausted the Family and Patron Sheets, the next step is the CFI or Computer File Index. We will take this up later.

RESEARCH: A GUIDE FOR BEGINNING GENEALOGISTS

I agreed to write this column with the understanding that I would answer no letters personally! Send your queries and/or questions to the Editor.

You have joined a genealogical society and decided you want to compile a family history. Just joining the society isn't a guarantee that you will be successful. You must learn to do the research yourself. Few able researchers have time or inclination to do another's research. The fun is in learning to unearth facts for one's self.

You were probably given a four-generation sheet and told to "get your homework done". You can see that the four-generation sheet should contain your name, the names of your parents, grandparents, and the names of your great-grandparents. You may or may not already know all this data. Maybe you know names but no exact dates.

We will now explain what research is---it is finding new data (maybe only to you) about people. The research isn't much good unless you can prove that it is true or at least cite where you got your information. Such proof and citings is called documentation. Let us begin documenting right away. Begin with your own name. How did you come to possess such a name? You inherited it from your parents. Now you must prove that. There are several ways to such proof but the easiest would be a birth certificate. This may be secured by writing to the Department of Vital Statistics of the state where you were born. A birth certificate costs about \$3.00.

If you were born before 1912, there may not have been birth registration in your state. In that case you may have to resort to Church records, baptismal certificates, school records, testimonials or affidavits of older people who can remember when you were born. Money spent on a birth certificate is not wasted as it is the first proof used in establishing one's age for Social Security.

Your birth may be recorded in the family Bible. In that case, get a copy of the page of births and also the title page of the Bible which should show that it is older than you are. The Social Security Department has ways of dating the inks, indelible pencils, and pen types. They do not accept ball point pen writing unless it is for a recent birth.

You may be lucky enough to have a newspaper clipping telling about your birth. Always have all newspaper clippings copied on white paper as newsprint soon crumbles and articles are thus lost.

You may have to have a census film after 1900 read for you. This may be done by contacting the National Archives of Census Records located at Pittsburg, Kansas. There is a charge for this service. You may find your family in the 1900 census. A copy of this will assist in proving your age and parentage.

The next step is to see if the birth certificate carries the name you now bear. If you are a married woman, you will need to prove how you achieved the name you now use. For this you will need a copy of your marriage certificate. If you have been divorced, you will need a copy of the final decree. If these documents have been lost or destroyed, you may receive copies by sending to the Dept. of Vital Statistics of your state. Adoption and death certificates are filed at the same place. The cost of a copy of any of these is about \$3.00 each.

RESEARCH: A guide for beginning genealogists - Continued You may also receive a certified copy of your marriage by writing to the Department of Marriage Records of the county in which the event took place. I always enclose a self-addressed stamped envelope and a check for \$2.00. I have never failed to get the document requested or my check back.

Now that we have proven who you are, let us next take up the next generation, your parents......if you have a birth certificate, their names should be on it. This proves that they are your parents, but doesn't prove much beyond that. One should try for marriage certificates for the first four or five generations. After that one may have to rely on printed or other matter for proof of marriages. Do not worry if the date isn't what you thought it was. People forget! Just recently a friend said she was married in 1928. I had been present at the wedding and said it was in 1929. We looked at her certificate and it was 1929. She had simply forgotten the year. Also, remember we are researchers, not judges. Even recorded marriages are not always right. I was researching a couple who were married about 1850. Descendants of the couple insisted that Grandma was Louisa, while the Court records called her Elizabeth. In digging for the truth, I found that Louisa and Elizabeth were twins. The minister who married them married J. R. to Louisa and recorded it thus on the certificate in the family Bible - - but he forgot and in making his report to the Courthouse, he put Louisa as a witness and Elizabeth as the bride.....It never bothered Uncle J. R. He went happily through life married to Louisa spiritually, unaware that he was legally wed to Aunt Elizabeth!

As you record dates about your parents, it is well to begin to put a little 'meat' on your research. Where did they live? What school did they attend? What did they do? What kind of people were they? What did they look like. This latter can best be achieved with photographs. Maybe the house in which they lived is still standing and can yet be photographed. Did either parent ever serve in the Armed Services? If so, one should secure a Service Record. This may be done by writing to the Adjutant General, State House, in the state from which the individual served. So far, I have never been charged for this information.

If your parents are living, find proof of their births. If they are dead, get proof also of their deaths. You may have a box of obituaries which would state both the birth and death dates, maybe the marriage dates and (just maybe) the parent's names. If you have such an obituary have it copied on white paper with the statement, if you can, the date and name of the publication from which it was clipped.

Pump any living ancestors or friends for as much information as you can. Remember if you write to enclose a self-addressed stamped envelope. It is better to interview the elderly in person if you can, as it may be hard for an old one to write. Also, your questions may help him/her to remember more.

Do not be surprised if you run into one who will say in effect "I consider all family data as personal and refuse to pass it along just to anyone." OR 'My dear, aren't you afraid you may find something you'd rather not know?" Remember again that researchers are not looking for scandal or family skeletons but do not let such information deter you from your search for truth--I will assure you that the good things will outweigh the bad ten to one!

Be sure to record where your parents and ancestors are buried. Locate the cemetery if you can.

Now you are up to your grandparents. We will discuss how to do your research from this point in our next issue. TO BE CONTINUED......

FORD FAMILY HISTORY

Samuel Richard FORD was born about 1815 in Virginia and his wife Rebecca BOAT-WRIGHT, also born in Virginia, about 1817. According to one of their daughters, Rebecca BOATWRIGHT was part Cherokee Indian. By 1837, they were living in Rockingham Co., North Carolina, where their oldest daughter, Mary Ann, was born. By 1850, they had moved to the Feters Creek District of Stokes Co., North Carolina. The family moved to Albany, Clinton, Co., Kentucky, about 1852, and finally settled in Glens Fork, Adair Co., Kentucky, in 1860.

Children of Samuel Richard and Rebecca (Boatwright) FORD were as follows:

Mary Ann FORD born: 10 Nov 1838 North Carolina John W. FORD born: ca 1844 North Carolina Martha Jane FORD born: ca 1848 North Carolina William Edward FORD born: 1 Mar 1850 North Carolina born: 16 Dec 1854 Adaline Frances FORD Kentucky Eliza FORD born: ca 1855 Kentucky Samuel Richard FORD born: 8 Jul 1858 Kentucky Nancy Ellen FORD born: 16 Sep 1860 Kentucky

Six of these children grew up to raise families and five of them moved in or near Anthony, Kansas, between 1878 and 1893. The sixth sister, Martha Jane had died in Kentucky by that time, and her family remained there.

Mary FORD married Sherrod W. BEARD in Travisville, Fentress Co., Tennessee, 1 Apr 1855. Sherrod was born 8 May 1833 in Clinton Co., Kentucky, the son of Christopher Greenup BEARD and grandson of John C. BEARD. Sherrod served three years in Company C, 1st Kentucky Cavalry Volunteers of the Union Army during the Civil War. At first he furnished his own horse and equipment. On or about 12 Jul 1863, he lost his horse in pursuit of MORGAN in Indiana. He became exhausted by severe marching and was ordered abandoned by the Company Commander. He later rejoined his outfit.

While Sherrod was in the Army, Mary butchered a hog with only her little sister, Adaline, to help her. They hid most of the meat, but a band of guerilla soldiers rode by, demanding that they cook supper, so they had to use some of the fresh pork. Another time, Mary held a young filly in the woods all night when they heard that Confederate soldiers were nearby.

Sherrod and Mary BEARD were the first in the family to move out West. They left Clinton Co. about 1878 for Harper Co., Kansas, and homesteaded six miles east of Anthony, in Silver Creek Township.

William Edward FORD and his wife, Lucretia HANKLA lived at Hammonville in Hart Co., Kentucky, in 1875. They moved to Sumner Co., Kansas, about 1880 for a few years, and then settled in Harper Co., near Anthony by 1882. Lucretia (Hankla) FORD died of childbirth 4 Feb 1892. "Bill" FORD raised his family by himself with only the help of his 12-year old daughter, Lizzie. After his family was grown, he then married Mrs. Eliza PHILLIPS.

Adaline FORD married Rufus COLLINS, son of Aaron COLLINS and Catharine AARON, in Adair Co., Kentucky. They made a trip to Anthony in a covered wagon about 1882 with their four children, but decided to return to Kentucky. When the Cherokee Strip race was announced, the family traveled to Anthony again--this

time by train. Rufus and his oldest son, Manuel, both made the run in the Cherokee Strip race, and homesteaded near Manchester, Oklahoma, in Grant Co.

Rufus COLLINS took his family in a wagon to see the new homestead and the dugout where he and his sons were living. He built a fire of buffalo and cow chips and cooked flapjacks in suet, flipping them up and catching them in the skillet. He then cut the flapjacks in pieces so they could all have a taste, only Adeline refused to try them. She later admitted the smell of the burning buffalo chips nauseated her. In Kentucky she always had cedar wood for her stove.

In 1909, Rufus sold his farm to his son Manuel and moved to a farm near Anthony. He ran a feed store in Anthony and later farmed west of Attica.

Young Samuel Richard FORD married Mandella HOLT, daughter of William B. and Betsey HOLT in Kentucky, and took his wife and four children to Sand Creek in Grant County, Oklahoma. However, his wife and two children died and were buried in Fairview Cemetery there.

"Dick" FORD took his two surviving children back to Kentucky, and married a young widow, Myrtle Judd McCLISTER, who had a little girl Grace by her short marriage to Mathew Jackson McCLISTER. After their marriage, they returned to Sand Creek, Oklahoma, for a few years, and then settled in Anthony, Kansas.

The youngest daughter of Samuel Richard and Rebecca (Boatwright) FORD, Nan, married Charles Smith PAGE, Jr., son of Charles Smith PAGE, Sr., and Mary Jane ROWE in Adair Co., Kentucky. They went to Harper Co., Kansas, in 1881, but returned to Kentucky. In 1883, they again moved to Harper Co. the trip taking 35 days in a wagon pulled by horses, and lived in a dugout for a time. From 1886 to 1889 the PAGE's lived on a claim near Trinidad, Colorado, while Charley hauled freight. In 1889 they moved back to a ranch in Harper Co., Kansas, and by 1903 settled on a ranch at Medicine Lodge, Kansas, in Barber County.

Samuel Richard FORD, Sr., died in Adair Co., Kentucky, in 1885 and his wife Rebecca (Boatwright) FORD died there in 1890.

HOW TO PRESERVE OLD NEWSPAPER CLIPPINGS

Newspaper clippings can be a valuable documentation asset for genealogists, so we requested and received permission for the following article. We would like to add that after using this procedure, you might want to have your clipping encased by the laminating machine located in our MHGS Library.

Are those old newspaper clippings that you've been holding on to for so many years turning yellow and threatening to crumble? Experts at the National Archives, who have the same problem, suggest the following method of preserving old newspaper: Mix two teaspoons of magnesium carbonate and a quart of club soda in a large plastic dish. Sandwich the clippings between two pieces of screen or <u>Pellon</u>, a material sold in most fabric stores, and soak for 30 minutes. Mop up the excess water with blotting paper and allow to dry overnight on more blotting paper. After using this preservation technique, store the clippings in a well-sealed flat plastic bag.

The following charts are numbered to correspond with the forms printed by the Everton Publishers, Inc. To find the parents of any given person, double the number to find the father, add one to the father's number to find the mother. Any numbers omitted is where the researcher has a gap in his/her chart.

Please, PLEASE! Proofread your charts before submitting them, particularly charts done on a typewriter. It is easy to transpose letters and/or numbers in the dates....also, make SURE the names are on the correct lines by remembering the rule that - the male name is always an even number, female name is always an odd number.

Of course a researcher is elated to find their surname on the pages of a publication, and want to call it to everyone's attention, but to mark on the pages is not to make a good impression of one's self OR their surname.

Use a bookmark, or make a note of the pages, have them copied, then make notes and underlinings on your own copy, but DO be considerate of all other researchers who will read that particular publication later.

IT IS NICE TO BE IMPORTANT, BUT MORE IMPORTANT TO BE NICE!!!
