We have added more Kansas cemetery records to our collection. Through the courtesy of Jimmie Kimrey, we have a copy of the Elk City Cemetery that is complete from the sextons' records. We have also added the Mount Hope Cemetery and, from Saline County, the Salemsberg Cemetery. We plan to continue to build the collection and encourage anyone with Kansas cemetery records in their personal collections to share them with us.

en in the second control of the second of th Here is a book that will become a prized Heirloom for ... descendants of those mentioned in it; particularly amazing after reading in the preface the Author's statement that she only became interested in Genealogy at the time of her oldest son's birth, less than 13 years ago.

The book covers the descendents of John Adam (Sanner) Sanders, son of Michael Sanner of Sommerset County, Pennsylvania. through their migrations from Pennsylvania to Ohio to Iowa to Nebraska. The change of names must have made research difficult but relationships not verified are carefully stated as opinions or family traditions.

The tremendous amount of background material, the personal histories, and the section of newspaper articles, paired with local news items concerning the Sanders family, make the book interesting even to those not connected with the family.

More than a fourth of the book is bibliography with court records, newspaper obituaries and a few personal letters copied in full. There are three separate name indexes; Sanders, Sanner and Allied Surnames. Brief lineages of Caldwell, Chappell, Cotton Gilbert, Griffen, Hughes and Plymate are included. I wonder if the Author plans to research and write about these lines as carefully as she has the Sanders line.

. Anyone contemplating writing a family history, or those just starting to collect their own records would do well to study this book, both as to arrangement and to the type of material to collect along with the bare bones of names, dates and places,

Excerpts from HISTORY OF BOURBON COUNTY, KS by T. F. Robley Published 1894 Submitted by Mr. G. F. Vandyke

Lieutenant John C. Fremont in June, 1842, left Chouteau's Trading Post on the Marias Des Cygnes River, in what is now Linn County, on his first Expedition to the Rocky Mountains. He was accompanied by Kit Carson as guide.

In the year 1837, by an order of Colonel Zachary Taylor, a Military Board consisting of Col. S. W. Kearney and Captain Nathan Boone, of the 1st. U. S. Dragoons, was appointed to lay out a Military Road from Fort Coffey to Fort Leavenworth, and to select a site for a new Post to be located about midway between these two points.

Their first choice was at the place of Joseph Rogers, a Cherokee Indian, living near Baxter Springs; but he asked 1,000 dollars an acre, and they were not authorized to pay this amount.

In a letter to Mrs. H. f. Wilson of Fort Scott, Kansas, J. C. Kelton, Acting Ass't. Adj't. General, states as follows:

"The site of the Military Fost at Fort Scott, was selected by the Board of Commissioners in 1837. Their report will be found in H. R. Doc. No. 278, 25th. Congress, 2nd Session."

The troops arrived at the new Fort in the evening of 30 May 1842. These troops consisted of Captain B. D. Roore in command, Lieutenant William Eustis, Ass't. Surgeon Dr. J. Simpson, and 120 enlisted men of A and C companies 1st. U.S. Dragoons.

These troops were soon replaced by a part of the 1st. Infantry. The Ufficers of this command were Major Graham, Captain Ewords, Ass't. Surgeon Dr. Mott. An Army Sutler came with the 1st. Inf., named John A. Bugg, who by virtue of his position, acted as Postmaster.

On the 13th of Sept, 1813, Hiero T. Wilson came from Fort Gibson and went into partnership with Mr. Burg in the Sutler business.

In 1849 Mr. Wilson bought out Mr. Bugg, who went to California. Mr. Wilson than became the Sutler and Postmaster, until he died 6 Aug 1892. He was married to Elizabeth C. Hogan, on 28 Sep 1847 and they had three children; Virginia T., Elizabeth C., and Frn ie W. Virginia - who is now Mrs. W. R. Robinson, was the first white child born in Fort Scott.

Sergeant John Hamilton of the Urdnance Dept., came with the first troops, and remained after his enlistment ran out. He superintended the construction of a good portion of the Military Barracks, Stables, etc., erected at Fort Scott in 1843 and 1844. At the time these buildings were erected, the western limit of the United States was the Arkansas River, instead of the Pacific Ocean.

In April 1853, the Post was practically abandoned. W. T. Wilson, John Hamilton and their families were at this time the only residents and constituted the entire population of Fort Scott.

Among the very first settlers was Isaac N. Mills, who located near Marmaton in 1854. He was born in Kentucky in 1830.

W. R. Griffith, from Pennsylvania, also located near Marmaton in 1855. He was the first Superintendent of Public Schools. He died at Topeka, 12 Feb 1862.

Ephraim Kepley located on the Osage in 1854, and he build the first cabin on the Osage River in Bourbon County. He was born in North Carolina in 1825.

Robert Forbes and his brother David settled near Dayton in 1854, from Illinois. D. T. Ralston, John Guttry, Mr. McCarty, Mr. F. y, Mr. Mitchell and Mr. Coyle located in what is now Marion Township in 1855.

J. W. Wells came in 1855 from North Carolina. Dr. J. R. Wasson, from Tennessee, located on the Osage in 1855. Bryant Bangness settled on Drywood in 1855, from North Carolina.

Wiley and Jacob Bolinger moved in on Mill Creek in 1855, from Missouri. Jacob Gross came in with the Bolingers and settled on Mill Creek in 1855. William Hinton located on the Osage in 1855, from Kentucky.

Dr. T. K. Julian, from Tennessee, first visited Fort Scott in 1854. Then he and his son, T. B. Julian, came back to Bourbon County and settled near Mapleton in 1855. T. B. Julian afterwards moved to Uniontown.

Joseph Oakley, from New York, settled on the Marmaton near Fort Scott in 1856. He died after the War. Asa Ward moved in on Moore's Branch in 1856, from North Carolina.

Josiah Stewart located on Mill Creek in January 1856. His sons, John J. and Amos, came with him. John J. Stewart has always taken an active and prominent part in county affairs.

J. R. Anderson came to Bourbon County in 1856 and located near Zenia. Thomas Osborne, with his sons Robert and James, moved here from Indiana and settled on the Osage in 1855. John McNeil settled on the Osage in 1856. James and Timothy Hackett came in 1857.

George W. Anderson and his son Jacob settled in Marion Township in 1857. I. N. Crouch went into Franklin Township from Missouri. Joseph Oliver moved into Marmaton in 1857.

- J. R. Myrick located near Dayton in 1857. Joab Teague came in 1857 from North Carolina. Samuel Stevenson and sons, I. S. and S. A., came in 1856.
- M. E. Hudson, Wm. F. Stone, Adam Boyd, William Deeds, E. A. Roe, Wm. Baker, George Stockmyer, Micheal Bowers, Henry Bowers, E. P. Higby, Edones, D. R. Cobb, Ben Workman, David Claypool, Walker, Huffman, Hathaway, Kelso, Atwood and the Endicotts were all early settlers. Most came as early as 1855.

On the 10th of Nov. 1854, A. H. Reeder, first Gov. of the Kansas Territory, issued a proclamation for an election to be held on the 29th of Nov. The home of H. T. Wilson of Fort Scott was designated to be the polling place. The Judges were Thomas B. Arnett, H. T. Wilson and William Godfrey.

J. W. Whitfield, R. P. Finnekin and John A. Wakefield ran for Delegate for the Sixth District. Whitfield received the entire vote cast, 105.

March 8, 1855, an election was held and the votes were as follows: For Representative, Sixth District, Joseph C. Anderson 315; S. A. Williams 313; John Hamilton 36; and William Margrave 16.

William Barbee came here from Kentucky at the age of 29. William Margrave was born in Missouri, 17 Feb 1818. Samuel A. Williams was originally from Kentucky. He came first in 1854, and afterwards brought his family, about 6 months before the election, from Polk County, Missouri. He died at his home in Fort Scott, 13 Aug 1873.

The Legislature, at the request of William Barbee and S. A. Williams, who were both originally from old Kentucky, named this county "Bourbon" - especial brand not given.

McGee County was named for 'ld Milt McGee, who then was a member of the Legislature, from Vestport, Missouri. Anderson County was named after one of our first Representatives, Joseph C. Anderson. Wilson County was named for Col. H. T. Wilson, of Fort Scott.

Some of the first Officers of Bourbon County, after it's organization, on the 31st of August 1855 were: Samuel A. Williams, Probate Judge; H. T. Wilson and Charles B. Wingfield, County Commissioners; B. F. Hill, Sheriff. John F. Cottrell was Constable; J. J. Farley County Clerk and Thomas Watkins Justice of the Peace.

On November 9 commissions were issued to Wiley Patterson, Cowan Mitchell, Henry Miller and D. Guthrie as Justices of the Peace. J. J. Farley, County Clerk, was appointed Register of Deeds.

November 1855, the Board of County Commissioners met and divided the county into townships as follows: Little Osage, Timberhill, Russell, Scott, and Drywood. The townships as they now exist are: Osage, Fredom, Timberhill, and Franklin on the North; Scott, Marmaton, Mill Creek and Marion through the Center; Drywood, Pawnee and Walnut on the South.

About the close of the year 1855, B. F. Thompson and Branham Hill were appointed Justices of the Peace; Alexander Howard and William Moffatt Constables; and H. R. Kelso as Coroner in and for Bourbon County.

The County of McGee, organized at the same time as Bourbon, included what is now Crawford and Cherokee Counties, and was all Cherokee Neutral Land.

Fort Scott was incorporated as a town Aug 30, 1855. The first Board of Trustees consisted of H. T. Wilson, A. Hornbeck, Thomas Dodge, R. G. Roberts, F. Demint and Thomas B. Arnett.

A, Hornbeck was a merchant. He came from Missouri and went back there after two or three years residence here. Dodge was an Indian Trader, and had been all his life. Thomas B. Arnett opened and kept the first hotel in Bourbon County. It was in the house on the west corner of the Plaza, known afterwards as the Fort Scott, or Free State Hotel. W. R. Griffith ran for State Auditor in 1856.

The county officers at the beginning of 1857 remained about as they had been in 1856, except Blake Little had been elected to succeed. William Barbee, who died sometime before.

Mr. wittle's son John H. and daughter Mary were living in Ft. Scott with him. He left here in 1859 and went to Arkadelphia, Arkansas.

Sprattsville was near where Dayton now is. It never advanced further than the Survey stakes for corner lots. It was located by W. W. Spatt.

Mapleton was first located in 1857. The town company were J. C. Burnett, E. P. Higby, Mr. Morton, B. B. Newton, S. W. Cheever and D. Scott. This company soen alterwards abandoned the town project and was dissolved. Afterwards a new company was organized by Mm. Baker, Dr. S. O. Himoe, A. Wilson, John Hawk, James Huffnagle and M. E. Hudson. This company first called the town Eldora, but after a time the name changed back to Mapleton.

Rayville was located by the two Ray brothers. It was on the Osage about half way between Ft. Lincoln and Mapleton.

Slaves were bought and sold in this county as late as August 1857, when the records of the county show that Wiley Patterson purchased a Negro Woman Slave of James M. Rucker for \$500.00.

Dr. John H. Couch, with his family, arrived May 30, 1857. He was born in Lexington, Kentucky, 8 Apr 1827, and went from Kentucky to Monroe, Wisconsin, where he married Lillis Andrick.

John G. Stuart came 1 Jul 1857. He was born in Halifax, N. S., Feb. 10 1834. T. W. Tallman and family arrived on the 23rd of April 1857. Dr. A. G. Osbun came 1857. Gov. Wilson Shannon married for his second wife, Miss Sarah Osbun, sister of Dr. Osbun.

The following named persons also came to Ft. Scott in 1857; W. I. Linn, J. C. Sims, Jr. Bills and family, C. P. Bullock, S. B. Gordon, Joe Price, Gov. E. Ransom and his wife and son-in-law Geo. J. Clark and family, the notorious Geo. W. Clark, register of the Land Office, Tom Blackburn, Charley Bull, Charley Dimon, Orlando Darling, Joe Ray, W. B. Bentley, J. S. Calkins, J. E. Jones, A. R. Allison, J. N. Roach and family of girls, John Harris and family, H. R. Kelsoe and family.

About the 1st of June 1857 a party arrived at Ft. Scott, which had been made up at Lawrence, Kansas, consisting of: Norman Eddy of Indiana, Geo. A. Crawford of Lock Haven, Pennsy., D. W. Weir of Indiana, and E. W. Holbrook of Michigan. Their purpose was to organize a Town Company.

W. C. (William Calvin) Puffenbarger died at his home in the east part of the city Saturday March 7, 1914, at the ripe old age of 73 years. For many weeks his life had been hanging in the balance and the end was not entirely unexpected. Funeral services were conducted from the family residence at 2 o'clock Sunday afternoon with Rev. Fred M. Bailey of the M.D. Church in charge. Interment was made in the Oswego 1 40 Cometery.
