

There's quite a program scheduled that I'm sure you've heard about And we will all appreciate it if you'll come and help us out.


So come to meetings often and help with hand and heart, Don't just be a member, dig in and do your part.

REVIEWS

THE SOURCE, A Guidebook of American Genealogy, Edited by Arlene Eakle and Johni Cerny, Ancestry Publishing Co., Salt Lake City, 1984, 786 pp, \$39.95.

This book is an incredibly comprehensive reference book in which no important aspect of American genealogical resources is omitted. If your genealogy library were to have only one book, this is the one to have. The book is divided into three main sections: Major Record Sources, like family traditions, church, census, court, land and military records; Published Genealogical Sources, like city directories, newspapers, indexes and biographies; Special Resources, like immigrant origins, urban ancestors, Native American, Spanish American, Black, Asian American and Jewish American records, the computer, and Heritage and Lineage Society records. There are in addition 8 appendices, a glossary, and bibliographical and subject indexes.

Some topics are covered in detail which are not readily found in other reference works, notably the chapters on cemetery research, church records, and newspapers.

Proportions given to various topics seem strange at times. Main example: 126 pages given to business and employment records (of most use surely for recent generations where other types of records are readily available and more likely to help ascertain relationships), but only ten pages to probate records which are the main way to establish relationships in the US prior to the 1850 census. It seems as though more space should have been given to what to look for and how to abstract both probate and land records—which are the real "bread and butter" of genealogical research.

This book probably should not be recommended to the beginner as his first introduction to research. The first chapter reviews a dozen such books on pages 4-6 for beginners, and one of them would be better. Of course, if he doesn't first read this book, he has no way of being aware of the list.... My fear is that the total novice would be totally overwhelmed by the detail and terminology in this book and might as a result be scared off completely, feeling it is all beyond him. The chapter labeled "Introduction" is definitely not reading for the beginner: prior genealogical research knowledge is required to understand it.

This book is written very clearly. Heading and subheadings are good: they are clear and frequent. The chapters are extremely well organized. It has abundant examples and pictures to illustrate the points made. The pictures, however, are frequently several pages away from the text that refers to them, and the figures and tables are confusingly numbered the same way.

The style of this book is without much humor or warmth; it is strictly business. However, any of this book's drawbacks are minor, in view of the size and scope of the work done. THE SOURCE is an awesome and valuable reference book. Reviewer: John Schunk.

THE FAMILY DETECTIVE: A Manual for Analyzing and Solving Genealogical Problems in England and Wales, 1538 to Present Day, by Colin D. Rogers, (Honorary Editor of Lancashire Parish Register, lecturer; written papers on Population Studies for University of Manchester), University Press, Dover, NH, 1983, 146 pp., \$9.95. Cloth.

This book is organized around the need to solve problems rather than around records. Three basic problems concern search for parents, marriage and death. The author tries to answer, "How do I find out? What can I try next when that doesn't work?" This is a manual for the amateur genealogist, a guide to drawing up family trees, especially for searchers living away from London's great centers of reference.

For the beginner there is description and advice about basic research methods. It gives professional insight into documents to which the public is usually denied access.

There are five sections to the book: where to start; looking for parents (birth certificates, census 1801 to present day and church baptisms 1538 to present day); looking for marriages (marriage certificates 1837 to present, marriages in churches 1538 to present); looking for deaths (death certificates 1837 to present, church burials 1538 to present, probate records and wills 1858, how to find wills before 1858); and alternatives.

This book would be useful to family historians and biographers, lectureers, librarians and archivists. There is an index. For more information write: Patricia Cantor, Manchester University Press, 51 Washington St., Dover NH 03820. Printed in Great Britian.

4 Robert Early Rose 9-12-1889 to 9-27-1969 Mo. & Kansas Anna Elizebeth (Spitznogle) Rose 5-21-1898 to 1-6-1947

Robert Early Rose was the youngest son of Theodore Freelinghuyson Rose and Ann Eliza (James) Rose a well known Northern Missouri family. His ancestor lineage is:

- 1. Benjamin Rose 1774-1833 Virginia, North Carolina, Tenn. Mary "Polly" North Carolina, Tenn.
- 2. Vinson D. Rose 1819-1865 Tenn., Mo., Ill.
 Nancy Jane (Winn) Rose North Carolina
- 3. Theodore Freelinghuyson Rose 1845-1910 Mo., Ill., Kansas Ann Eliza (James) Rose 1855-1937 Mo., Kansas

Robert Early Rose, farmer, was born September 12,1889 in Carroll County, Missouri. He was 5 ft. 11 inches tall, had black hair and blue eyes. He attended school at District 133, Twp. 76, Sumner County, Kansas to the grade of 8. Politics: Republican.

Robert's father died in 1910 on a farm near Milan, Kansas. He took care of his blind mother until he was 29 years of age. Later he worked for a telephone company in Minnesota and later in the oil fields.

Sometime in 1915 he met Anna Elizebeth Spitznogle who was residing with his brother Walter Joseph Rose near Anson, Kansas.

Anna was 18 years old, black hair, brown eyes and beautiful. They were married at Emporia, Kansas, Lyon County, October 11, 1917.

They began their marriage at the old home place near Milan, Kansas. He farmed 240 acres, mostly wheat, oats, corn and raised cattle, pigs and horses. Each spring he raised a lot of chickens and sold them in Wellington. He always had several gardens. They had plenty of food during the depression years and helped relatives in the city. Anna his wife was a sturdy pioneer and was remembered for her kindness and loving personality. She was an excellent cook and seamstress. Robert was a strict disciplinarian and successful father. He raised eight law abiding citizens.

Robert Early Rose was Superintendent of Seventy Six School, District 133 Sumner County, Kansas. He retired from farming near Riverdale, Kansas in 1951. He was well known and liked by all who knew him.

He died September 27, 1969 at his home in Wellington, Kansas. He is buried in Milan, Kansas Cemetery, Ryan, Twp. Summer County Kansas.

Vol. XVIII No. 1 (1983) has an article on Harrison and Tyler Boone on page 20. I would like to add a bit of information.

BIOGRAPHICAL AND HISTORICAL RECORD OF PUTNAM COUNTY, INDIANA - 1887 has a sketch on Squire Boone:

"Old Squire Boone, brother to Daniel Boone, now living in the township (Washington) once lived in a house which stood on the ground now occupied by that in which Simeon Stoner lives. On the 3rd day of July, 1837, his house was struck by lightning, by which two of his children were killed. Three years later his wife presented him with twin boys whom he named Tip and Tyler. Some time after that, in the same house, two of his daughters were married on the same day."

It is easy to imagine the excitement twins caused on November 9, 1840 and one can almost hear Squire shouting "Well, Tippecanoe and Tyler too!!!!" It was the slogan of William Henry Harrison in his campaign for President. Harrison had been governor of the Indiana Territory and was known for his victory as an Indian fighter at Tippecanoe. He served only one month as President; Vice President John Tyler then became our tenth President. Of the twins, Tyler seems to have kept his name but Tip is referred to in the family records as Harrison Boone.

It is not unusual to find as many as five lines from George Boone III (the immigrant ancestor) among members of the Boone family. Twins Harrison and Tyler Boone have three lines as follows: Ref: Spraker, THE BOONE TAMILY

MARRIAGE NOTICES FROM KANSAS TERRITORIAL NEWSPAPERS, 1854-1861

The following marriages are reprinted with permission from the KANSAS HISTORICAL QUARTERLY Vol. 21, Summer 1955. This is a partial reprint; the remainder will be published in the next two volumes of the REGISTER.

The files of the Historical Society's territorial newspapers are remarkably complete, however in some instances there are only scattered issues. This fact and negligence in reporting marriages to the newspapers necessarily cause this list to be incomplete, but it does bring together marriage records from all parts of territorial Kansas for the first time.

The recording of marriages has been required of the counties of this state since the start of county government in 1855, and many of them have such records from their beginning. One notable exception is Douglas county where records were destroyed in the Quantrill raid of August 21, 1863. Since 1913 marriages have also been recorded in the division of vital statistics of the state board of health at Topeka.

KUGIG

The Kaypro Users Genealogy Interest Group was formed to assist the genealogist who chooses to computerize his genealogy work and who finds Kaypro is his choice of machine. According to Alice W. Peterson, Coordinator, KUGIG is "a users' group of 120 users and apparently the only national users' group created to help those with a particular computer to learn how to do genealogy on their machine. Learning computer is no less a puzzle than learning genealogy and sharing our successes and problems we are making great strides in taming and organizing our hordes of genealogical data. We have found that the soft ware that comes with the Kaypro is very helpful in organizing our data and not one of us has bought a word processing or database management program to replace the ones that are 'bundled' with the Kaypro.

"We share a newsletter by computer disk at least four times a year and our group is producing mew programs every month. We hope to eventually get applications for all standard forms used by family historians available to all Kaypro owners. We now have four different styles for family sheets databases, a cemetery database, a land deed database, a probate database, and a census database, and a Surname index to the families being researched by our members. We have now learned how to enter our data once into a family sheet database and get it to work processing for written history and into 8 generations pedigree charts without reentry."

Historical Sketch

Early in the year 1902, several Masons living in Valley Center and vicinity prepared a petition addressed to the M. W. Grand Lodge of A. F. & A. M. of Kansas, praying that a lodge be established in Valley Center. Their petition was kindly received by the Grand Master, M. W. Perry M. Hoisington, and at the Forty-sixth Angel. nual Communication of the Grand Lodge held in the city of Fort Scott on February 19-20, 1902, a charter was issued for a lodge to be located in Valley Center and to be known as Valley Center Lodge No. 364.

Accordingly, on March 17, 1902, R. W. Brother Thomas G. Fitch, Grand Senior Warden, acting as Grand Master and assisted by Bro. W. H. Harrison, Past Master of Emporia Lodge No. 12; Bro. Fred H. Stuckey, Past Master of Albert Pike Lodge No. 303; Bro. John M. Chain, Past Master of Wichita Lodge No. 99; Brethren Thomas C. Wilson, Daniel E. Boone, Isaac T. Ault and William F. Steadman instituted the lodge. Thirty-one of the thirty-six applicants for the charter were present on this occasion.

Herewith is an extract from the minutes of the first meeting of the lodge:

and Avenue B was purchased with the idea of building a lodge home sometime in the future.

At various times in the ensuing years the proposition of building a lodge home was discussed but not until the year 1925 was anything definite done. At the stated communication held on February 16, 1925, a committee consisting of Brothers: Adrian P. Wright, Wm. P. Vallance, Travis C. Parkinson, Louis Bright, Oscar K. Winters, Walter S. Cooper and John F. Wadsworth, was appointed and instructed to plan the building and ascertain the cost. A committee consisting of Brothers: Samuel L. Gardiner, Paul E. Wilson, Charles W. Rickard, Harry H. Sullard and T. Todd McCluggage was appointed to finance the building. At the stated com-munication of the lodge on April 6, 1925, the building and finance committees reported that a working agreement with the Valley Center State Bank could be entered into and a corporation be formed whereby a suitable building could be erected. After some discussion a motion was carried instructing the trustees to enter into such an agreement which was accordingly done and the building was soon commenced. On December 10, 1925, R. W. Ferris M. Hill, Grand Junior Warden acting for M. W. Grand Lodge, laid the corner stone of the building and on June 7, 1926, the building was formally opened for use.

The lodge may well be proud of its present home and many favorable comments are received from visiting brethren. The lodge extends a hearty welcome to all to visit this beautiful lodge room devoted to the service of God and emulating the principles of:
