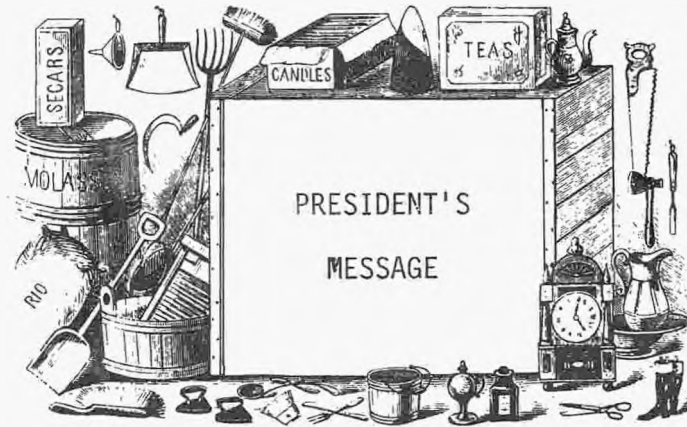

LIBRARY LORE

Just where do the books and magazines on the shelves at the MHGS Library come from? Since we have a steady influx of new members I thought that it was time to review how our library collection grows. There are three major building blocks that help our library grow - DONATIONS, PURCHASES and EXCHANGES.

The first major building block is Donations. Members and non members alike who are interested in strengthening our growing library many times donate to the library books and other materials. They may be from their own personal collections or books that they have purchased for the library. These materials range from records and county histories to magazines, family genealogies and even city, school and organizational directories.

The second building block for library expansion is Purchases. At the majority of the general meetings we pass around a collection basket. All money collected in this manner is deposited in our Piggy Bank. This money is then generally used in a coop manner; 1/2 of the purchase price for an article coming from the Piggy and 1/2 donated by interested individuals who are willing to help purchase a particular item. Many times several people will join together to donated their half of the purchase price. On occasion we put in the Alert notices of books or other material that we are attempting to purchase. If you would like to help purchase one of those or have a certain book in mind that you think the library should have let one of the librarians know.

The third building block is Exchanges. While we only exchange for a few books the greatest majority of our periodicals are exchanged with other societies across the country. This allows us to receive publications from other areas at an economical price. We presently exchange with about 200 other societies.

Cora is in charge of scheduling volunteers to work in the library each day it is open. 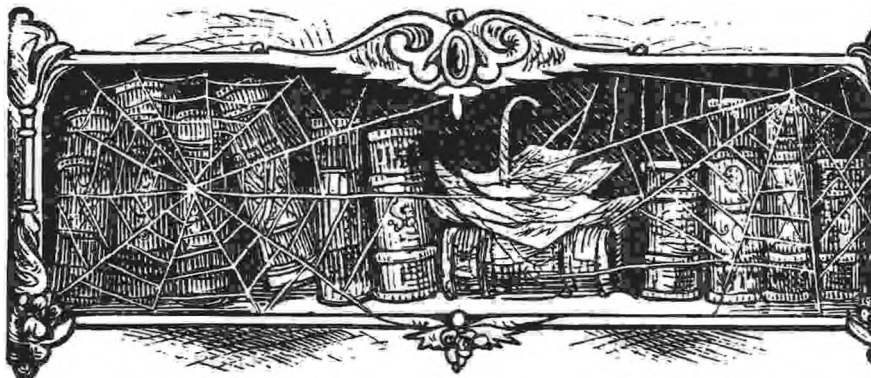
FINALLY

A NEW PUBLICATION

"Certificates of Death for Wichita, Kansas 1887-1899" is first of all a compilation of the surviving death certificates for this period of time that are on file in the Office of the City Historian at the Wichita Public Library. There are approximately 4,000 certificates existing for this period with some gaps in coverage in the early years.

To further help the researcher we have listed in a separate section for each year the listing from the Wichita City Directories that we felt were pertinent as to the deceased. Other family members are often listed and the researcher may gain through this. But in many cases the death did not occur at the place of residence and in these cases we have attempted to search out possible residences of the deceased.

Also we have endeavored to locate the burial places of the person who had succumbed. Through actual cemetery surveys, cemetery records, mortuary records and some newspaper surveys we have been somewhat successful in this area. Time did not allow for a thorough search of the Wichita papers covering this period of time so mortuary and cemetery records were heavily relied on. Places of burial were not listed on the original certificates until 1899. Previous to that time few mention burial places, so this section should be of great value to the researcher.

The publication contains 310 pages, including a 46 page index.

From: The Sidney Weekly Journal, Sidney, Shelby Co., Ohio

(Taken from Shelbyana Quarterly--publication of Shelby Co. Gen. Society)

- 21 Jan 1870. "Joseph Kirkendall, former Shelby Co. Sheriff & for many years a resident this Co., died at LEAVENWORTH, KS. last week after illness of 5 days. He left Sidney 15-16 years ago."
- 28 Jan 1870. "Dr. VENARD of Plattsville sold his property and contemplates moving soon to KANSAS."
- 29 Apr 1870. "Dr. VENARD, late of Plattsville, left for KANSAS this week. Dr. William H. SHAW of Palestine has located himself in Plattsville."
- 10 June 1870. "Dr. BEEMAN and wife arrived in Sidney from KANSAS on Mon. He left Sidney & located in KANSAS several years ago."
- 12 Nov 1869. "Word received of affliction befallen Spencer CAMPBELL's family at LAWRENCE CITY, KS. Until several months ago they resided southwest of Sidney, thence sold out & emigrated by wagon to KANSAS, arriving in LAWRENCE CITY last week. Mr. CAMPBELL died Monday morning & one of his daughters died soon after."
- 26 Nov 1869. "A member of Spence CAMPBELL's family writes to correct a few mistakes in our previous article. The family traveled to KANSAS by rail, they had been in LAWRENCE CITY 4 weeks prior to Mr. CAMPBELL's death, & the daughter is not dead but has been seriously ill."
- 9 June 1871. "Marr. at WATHENA, KANSAS, 11 May by Rev. E. ALWARD, George B. STERLINE of Columbia, Pa. to Miss Anna KELSEY, Sidney."
- 15 Sep 1871. "On June 18th last Earnest FRANKENBERGER, about 13 yrs, son of W. T. FRANKENBERGER who formerly lived in Sidney some 6 or 7 yrs ago, left his home in BOURBON CO., KS. & started for Sidney. He was on the road over 2 months, arriving on the 26th ult. He is staying at the residence of his uncle, J. P. FRAZER & is evidently of a wild and roving disposition."
- 22 Sep 1871. "We stated the lad was 13, should have been 11 yrs."
- 12 Jan 1872. "Peter STRUBLE, Perry Twp., has sold his farm to B. W. MAXWELL & father, & will relocate to ANDERSON CO., KANSAS in the spring."
- 29 Mar 1872. "James MCKERCHER will go to KANSAS next week where he will join the Ohio and Indiana colonies."
- 5 Apr 1872. "Another installment of the Ohio colony left Shelby Co. for KANSAS on Wed. consisting of James MCKERCHER, W. A. SKILLEN, James G. IRWIN & James ROBBINS. David HENRY & S. S. MAXWELL, Perry Twp., have lands in KANSAS & accompanied them to look after their real estate interests."

FROM THE POTTAWATOMI GAZETTE, POTTAWATOMI COUNTY, KANSAS,
1867, submitted by Dora Lampton:

From the 18th Kansas Volunteers, Fort Dodge, KS, August 6, 1867:
Dear Sister:

We left Fort Larned on the 29th ult. and have not been to post since. We are encamped about six miles above Fort Dodge, and they say we will remain here three or four days. Do not wait for me to write, but write every time you have a chance, and send me some papers. I am writing this on a blanket.

We are armed with sabres, Spencer's carbines and seven shooters. You ought to see us on a scout, cooking our buffalo meat by buffalo chips. We lay it down on the fire and let it broil. I can drink my three pints of coffee without milk as the most of them. We draw hardtack, bacon, potatoes, rice, coffee and sugar.

We have lost nineteen of twenty men out of the battalion by death. I am sorry to record the death of Sergeant H. Wright. He died of cholera on the 30th of last month. I still enjoy good health.

Your brother, Geo. Bertram.

P.S. We left James Huggins in the hospital at Fort Larned, and he was doing well, and wanted to go with us but was too weak.

Aug. 12, 1867 Fort Hayes

Dear Sister:

On the night of the 8th inst. we received orders to report at Fort Hayes on the 11th, about 80 miles distant. Four days rations were issued to lighten the teams. We reached here at noon today. I am quite well. James Huggins and Winfield Clark joined us at Fort Dodge on the 7th. They are now in good health. No sickness in camp. We shall stay at this post some time in my opinion.

The Indians are committing depredations here extensively, and we may have a brush with them.

I must close. I have written this by firelight.

A dispatch from Ellsworth, Kansas, Sept. 27, 1867, says:
The Santa Fe stage has arrived bringing the news of Kitchen's trains being attacked by six hundred Indians, and lost fifty of their mules. They also attacked General Carrolton, Macy and Colonel Davis, killing Lt. Williams and six of the general escort. More trains have been attacked.

It jams the machine and costs 7 cents extra. The PO says enclosed SASE's may be inserted inside a 9 1/2 inch business envelope, a regular "long" envelope, without folding. REVIEW

Ronald A. Bremer, COMPENDIUM OF HISTORICAL SOURCES: THE HOW AND WHERE OF AMERICAN GENEALOGY, Published by Mr. & Mrs. Carl L. Bremer, 1983, 1004 pp.

This is sort of the "Book of Lists" for Genealogists. Some of the author's lists are undoubtedly valuable, such as the addresses of National Headquarters of Church Denominations and List of Libraries and Repositories. However, a list of addresses of life insurance companies is probably of limited value; an alphabetized list of townships, identifying county and state, is also questionable (how often does one know the township name but not the county?); lists of counties and county seats, and where to write for vital records, etc. are nothing new (duplicative of the Handy Book which gives more details on which records are available.) The "Miscellaneous List" of 32 items on page 447 sounds like a put-on: What connects such disparate and non-parallel items as "The Congregational Library," "Canals," and "Roman Numerals"? Lists for the sake of lists result in more quantity (1004 pages) than quality in this collection.

The author Ronald A. Bremer bills himself in the middle of this book (full-page advertisement, p. 446) as "a modern Demosthenes," "lauded as the finest speaker of his time." It is safe to say that Mr. Bremer is not the finest writer of his times: witness such tortured grammar and spelling as "these type," "peretaining," "surprizing," and "Garrard County and It's Churches." It is also safe to say that someone was not the finest proofreader of our times: on one page alone (p. 179), one finds such apparently brand-new Kentucky counties as "HADIN," "LITCHER," and "MUBLENBERG."

Accuracy of information does not also appear to be this work's strong point. The \$2.00 fee listed for obtaining DAR applications (p. 93) is hopelessly out of date (it has been raised at least twice since that time), and one will look hard in vain for the county history of Harrison County, Kentucky, listed as "History of Harrison County" (Actual title: HISTORY OF BOURBON, SCOTT, HARRISON AND NICHOLAS COUNTIES, KENTUCKY). The list of published census indexes on pp. 279-280 is also badly out of date (1830 has not been the mostly recently published census index for Illinois and Indiana, for example, for quite some time).

In a book this size there are bound to be some errors, but it is a little disconcerting to find the exact same list of "How to Find Confederate Military and Pensions Records" on pp. 394-395 and again on page 408. There is something even more disconcerting to observe commercial advertising appearing as one subsection of a chapter and indistinguishable in form from other text (pp. 484-485).

On the lighter side, consider the author's advice to (1) outline and (2) rough draft before (3) writing letters; so little time would be left for research. Also, many of the maps seem like "filler" (particularly the ones on pp. 926-935, which identify for us what part of the country is the

"South," and what part is the "Northeast," etc.).

Neither the table of contents nor index is very thorough (and "Geographical" should come AFTER "Genealogical" in a properly alphabetized index). This book undoubtedly has some worthwhile contents in it; for \$100, it's just too hard to find them.--Reviewer, John Schunk.
