## CIVIC CENTER · SAN FRANCISCO · CALIFORNIA · 94102

On April 18, 1906, an earthquake measuring 8.25 on the Richter Scale rocked San Francisco. The quake, lasting 48 seconds, and the subsequent fire, lasting three days and nights, caused tremendous property damage. The number of casualties, never completely tabulated, was in the hundreds.

To arrive at an accurate total for the number of dead, Mrs. Gladys Hansen, San Francisco City Archivist, has made a thorough search of all available records. Her total of 826 known dead far exceeds the official figure of 478 given by the 1907 Board of Supervisors. Yet even with her careful calculations, Mrs. Hansen believes the revised figure too low. She appeals to anyone having knowledge of any person killed in the 1906 disaster to write to her with whatever information they have. The names of the dead will be entered in the official roster in the Public Library, available to researchers of history & genealogy.

MARRIAGES IN SEDGWICK COUNTY, KANSAS

The following listing is a continuation of the marriage records for Sedgwick County, Kansas that have previously been published in the Register. Midwest Historical and Genealogical Society, Inc. has on file copies of some early marriage returns for Sedgwick County. These cover the years 1882 through 1912, with some exceptions. In this listing those marriages that we have on file are denoted with an asterisk (\*) following the date of marriage. Copies of these returns are filed by the date of application, so we have included that information for ease of location. The record books at the County Courthouse were consulted for any marriages that were not included in our copies. If the information was not completed on the return it is denoted as ---. If the spellings of the names differed on the returns the additional spelling is provided in parenthesis.

## SHUCKING CORN

These cold winter days when freezing weather has loosened the shucks on the standing field corn, an old yellowed newspaper clipping and excerpts from a William Wells autobiography bring back less than fond memories of a few winters when I was a teenager and the only local work was shucking corn.

It took a lot of will power and some encouragement from others to get a young man up before daybreak to harness and feed his team of horses, eat breakfast himself, then hitch up the conventional farm wagon that usually had three one-foot thump boards on the right side of the box, at least for the right-handed man. Heading for the corn field at the break of day over frozen ground, the horses could not be hurried over the icy, snowy, rutted farm road, seldom traveling over a mile or two to the near end of the field. All the neighbors could tell when we went to work, for the resonant wagon noises traveled several miles in the still, cold winter air.

For this job, the workmen's clothing usually consisted of two denim overalls, a flannel shirt, long johns--my parents believed in woolen ones--, a long denim jacket, a sheepskin-lined overcoat, a warm cap with ear flaps, and several pairs of heavy flannel double-thumbed mittens that had been bought by the dozen. (The reason for the double-thumb type was that we could turn them over for double wear on the palms.) For warmth we wore them double with a new pair on the inside; extra pairs were taken to the field to assure dry mittens at all times. The weather then dictated the layers of clothing removed during the day as we worked up a sweat. If we had known then of the modern-day wind chill factor, we no doubt would have frequently stayed in the house to play pitch or listen the old "Atwater Kent."

There was no dillydallying around. We worked hard and soon achieved a rhythm that rubbed off on the horses as they moseyed along at about the right pace. A good team could be controlled by voice, a giddy up or whoa. We could listen to tell how hard a neighbor was working by how the corn ears banged against his thump boards. Generally we threw the ears without looking, for we could hear the thump that assured us they were falling into the wagon. Normally we picked two rows at a time, giving us considerable although then-unheard-of aerobic exercise for the day. With the average dry land production of western Kansas of that day we were expected to pick a 24-inch deep wagon load each half day. The corn ears were picked fairly clean with a minimum of attached shucks; we used shucking hooks or pegs that came in several types. My favorite was a steel plate the size of my palm; it was riveted to a leather pad which could be strapped snugly around the right wrist over the snug mitten top, with another strap looped lightly around the hand at mid-finger. The plate had a hook in the middle of the plate which resembled a kitchen jar opener. Holding the ear in the left hand, one hooked away a portion of the ear shucks, then pinched in under the balance of the shucks to break the ear away from the shank. One then threw that ear into the wagon while with the left hand grabbing another ear to be shucked.

Short stalked corn indicated light yield and caused a lot of stooping but

was easy to shuck. Taller corn indicated a better yield but was more difficult to shuck and to break the ear from the shank, which was hard on the wrists. This no doubt accounted for the more muscular fellows migrating to the eastern corn country for winter work.

The pay per bushel was usually negotiated, hinging on economic conditions; often room and board was part of the worker's wages. The lazy man was often looking for another job, but neither did I ever see a rich corn picker.

Soon human shuckers were replaced by mechanical harvesters; I feel no jealousy for the early mechanical harvester operators: history tells us of the many who lost limbs and lives around the early machines. At least I survived. Fortunately our government's O.H.S.A. now demands operator safety on all mechanical equipment, and you can read in safety how we did it in the "good old days."


