

## THE KANSAS CONNECTION

A REVIEW OF SOME NEW KANSAS MATERIALS IN OUR LIBRARY

KANSAS ITS POWER AND ITS GLORY R-210-190 Published by John R. Peach 1966. While not a genealogical or historical work per se this material does give an overview of the industrial growth in Kansas. Additionally, it alphabetically lists many of the towns and cities in Kansas, their home counties and some of the businesses located there.

"CARDEN OF THE PLAIN" CARDEN PLAIN, KANSAS 1884-1984 R-210-191 1984 Much like many of the centennial histories being produced now, this book contains several family histories replete with many pictures. The book does supply the reader with the graduates of Garden Plain High School for the years 1911 through 1984. Something that I have not noticed in many books is a section entitled "Recollections from the Newspapers of the Era." It contains abstracts of happenings reported in the local newspapers dealing with the history of the area. For the researcher the main drawback of the publication is the very apparent lack of an index. The biographical sketches are not even in order so it is somewhat difficult to use.

"THAT MUSICAL WICHITA" R-210-192 By Kathryn A. Slawson and Esterre M. Sevin. Covering in three parts the musical history of Wichita from 1870 to 1980 offers some historical insight into Wichita's past that isn't mentioned in the standard history books. There are several pictures and for someone wanting background material for study this would be a good source.

CONWAY SPRINGS MEMORIES OF THE FIRST 100 YEARS R-210-193 1984 This particular centennial history of one of the area towns is somewhat unique in that it does not contain the usual biographical sketches. The publisher went all out with the visual presentation of the area history; there are picutres on almost every page. The reader is presented with a listing of War Veterans from the area and one unusual feature is a plat map showing the locations of the businesses in town. All in all its a good book for historical research.

THE GENESIS OF GIRARD R-210-194 By William Cuthbertson A collection of short stories about a variety of subjects in the Girard area. The book is divided into six main sections dealing with people, places and things. There is quite a bit of biographical information but to use the book to its fullest extent one must read the entire thing. The biographical section is in alphabetical order so it does help the reader to determine if their family is in that section of the book.

NOTES ON EARLY CLARK COUNTY, KANSAS R-210-195 By the Clark County Chapter of the Kansas State Historical Society. Volume 1 No. 1, July 1939-August 1940. A collection of newspaper clippings from the Clark County Clipper in Ashland, Kansas. I don't know if this series was continued beyond the first number but I'm sure the researchers in Clark County have put it to use. I warn you though, its not usable for quick research. There is no index, table of contents and no apparent order to the stories. There are several biographical sketches so it is still valuable to the researcher.

THE SMOKY VALLEY IN THE AFTER YEARS R-210-196 By Ruth Bergin Billdt and Elizabeth Jaderbork Published in 1969. Done in two parts this publications subject matter deals with Lindsborg, Kansas. The first part is a translation of a work originally published in Swedish in 1919. The second part is a collection of news articles from the area newspaper. Part 1 in indexed.

THE EARLY YEARS OF OSAGE COUNTY R-210-198 By Roger Carswell, 1982. An 88 page booklet offering a historical account of Osage County, Kansas. While not biographical as such many early settlers are mentioned in short historical sketches of the various townships and a listing is given of the towns in the county with some history of each.

HISTORY OF SEDGWICK COUNTY, KANSAS R-210-199 1911 2 Volumes by O.H. Bentley. Not new material to most people who are searching in Sedgwick County, this fills a gap in our library collection. One of the three main works that contain biographical material about the area.

# what's happening...

MHGS REGISTER

In February the Library Expansion Committee of MHGS learned that the the City of Wichita owned a vacant house that needed to be either moved or demolished and that there might be some city-owned land available near downtown Wichita. They investigated costs for building foundations, moving a house, renovation, etc.. Then they prepared a proposal to get CBDG (Block Grant) funds to convert all this into a Library for MHGS. Unfortunately the City Commission decided other groups needed the CBDG funds worse than MHGS did.

The current Library Expansion Committee, which was appointed in April when new officers were elected, decided that the idea of converting the house to a Library was still viable without government funds IF the City would just donate the house and a large lot at the NW corner of 11th and Main. This lot is big enough to provide lots of parking, is near two bus lines, and is close to downtown -- the courthouse records, City Library, etc.. It also has room for future expansion -a meeting hall or whatever might be desired. So we began negotiating in earnest with various people in City Hall.

On May 22nd, at a Special Meeting of the membership, cost figures were presented and it was pointed out that the Society had enough money on hand (about \$30,000) to build a basement, move the house, and get a good start on the renovation. The group voted unanimously to proceed on this basis and ask the City for the land and the house. We started right in. We conferred with City officials. We also talked with the neighbors, with the Midtown Citizens Association, and appeared before the Economic Development Commission. Everyone seems to be rooting for us.

On June 29th we learned that if we received the lot at 11th and Main, we would be responsible for paying to extend the sanitary sewer line to the property at a cost of about \$12,000; and we needed to show the City that we had this additional money available before proceeding with the talks. Fortunately some of our members came to the rescue and agreed to make donations or loans at no interest to cover this cost. So we were under way again.

Finally, on July 23rd, at the recommendation of the Economic Development Commission, the City Commission approved our request and "authorized the mayor to sign the appropriate real estate documents to convey the land and structure to the society...". Details of the contract were worked out and the final document delivered to us on July 26th. Basically it gives us the house and lot and we agree to build a new basement, move the house and renovate it and "operate the facility as a genealogical library accessable to the public for a fee for a period of two years from the date of this agreement." We have to comply with City codes, of course. The City agreed that if we need to we can mortgage the property(I hope we don't come to this) in order to finance any improvements.

The house, currently located at the NW corner of 9th and Water, is an old but sound two-story structure with about 1150 square feet of space on each floor. The basement will add another 1200 square feet. The first floor should provide space to display all of our present books and documents as well as future acquisitions, while also allowing ample reading space. The second floor would provide office space for the librarian, room for the publications, etc.. The basement would be dry, light and airy and provide lots of storage space and work space.

We are looking forward to ground breaking in the near future and hope to be able to move into a permanent Library of our own within a year. The City has said we will get the actual deed on August 28th. Then we will let contracts for the basement and the moving and be under way. Look for further details in the September ALERT.

## The Wichita City Eagle December 18, 1879

Wichita, Kansas

December 15, 1879

To the Editor of the Eagle:

COMRADES: In accordance with the resolution governing the Union Veteran Corps, the first quarterly reunion for 1880 will convene at Eagle Hall, Thursday, January 1st, at 2 o'clock, p.m. As matters of importance will be then and ther considered a full attendance is desirable, at it is hoped no old soldier will be rendered conspicuous by his abscence.

The election of a Council having been deferred at the last reunion you are hereby requested to meet December 25th at some convienent place in your respenctive townships and wards and select a man to fill the vacancy for the insuing year.

The following named townships and wards not having reported their enrollments are requested to do so at once and deliver them to the secretary by January 1st.

The townships and wards not having reported are Lincoln, Sherman, Park, Kechi, Payne, Minniha, Garden Plains, Grand River, Morton, Viola, Ohio, Union, and 2d, 3d, and 4th wards, Wichita.

Greeley township furnished 31 names, but is too incomplete for publication. Likewise Erie township.

#### MHGS COMPUTER "BUFFS"

By Faye Wood

GEDCOM- GEnealogical Data COMmunications. Genealogical data is the information or 'data' from your family research file. A Communications format is how your family research file looks when it goes from one computer to another.

One of the first and most important things you can learn about computers IS - NO two computers are alike. Each computer is as different as the person using it. As every person operates differently, so do computers. Just as persons have a common language, so do computers. Understanding this we should realize that it will make things much simpler if we have 'common' language with which to translate all our notes, reference material, files, etc..

This spring, as a project for an Advanced Computer Class, I used GEDCOM tags to generate a datasearch program and found it is GREAT. It organizes my material and my mind.

The following is a GEDCOM Tag Dictionary (Nov 84 version). The TAG is a two-character identifier that tells what the data in the value field represents.



Louise was born 25 Nov 1906 in Glen Elder, KS & died 12 July 1985 in Wichita, KS. She was the daughter of John Ray & Ella Lavina (Nusbaum) Neiffert. Her grandfather Isaac F. Neiffert homesteaded south of Glen Elder in 1873.

Louise was one of the first organizers of Midwest Genealogical Society in 1966. The Society's first library, est. April 1967, was in the recreation room of the Brehm home.


The Society has lost an efficient, loyal and dedicated member. We will miss her.







The Annual meeting of the Kansas Council of Genealogical Societies, June 7 & 8, 1985 was hosted by the Barton County Genealogical Society in Great Bend, KS.

Of the 36 member societies in the Kansas Council only 12 had delegates present. In the spring election Rowena Horr, Topeka, was approved as the new president. Charles Carter, Chanute, continues as the vice-president for a second term. Legislative chairman, Leland Adams, Overland Park, reported on the negative opinion given by Attorney General Bob Stephan as to the release of vital records. In the recent legislature, Bill #319 was presented to reverse the opinion. Passage of the bill was not achieved. It will probably be introduced again in the 1986 assembly.

The certificate committee reported that 327 territorial, pioneer and early settler certificates were approved during the past year. Many members and their friends are eligible. The first issuance of these certificates and their supporting data in bound form has been sold out. A second volume is available and hopefully volume one will be reissued.

Mrs. Helen Wood, Quaker Collection Curator at Friends University, Wichita, presented the first of the workshops. The Friends collection is the largest of its nature west of the Mississippi River. The Swarthmore and Haverford Universities in Pennsylvania are likely to be the only greater collections existing.

Attendees had a choice of three topics for the second morning workshop. I chose the "Various National Cultures in Kansas" presented by Ms. Mae Weaver, retired Barton Co. Home Economist. She presented a lively one hour history of the major groups who migrated to Kansas. Many of these came here direct from their home country and settled in clusters in various parts of the state. Ms. Weaver's six page handout presented commonly found surnames found in the various settlements. A chart of the ten ranking homelands of the foreign born is listed by the census years 1860 to 1930. Her bibliography of source material, other books offering related information and suggested readings was included. These pages will be copied and put in a folder in the Society Library for member perusal. The title will be that given above.

Mr. Dale Schrag, Director of Libraries, Bethel College, Newton, gave the afternoon program. He covered the origin of the Mennonite Church in Switzerland some five hundred years ago and its continuing history.

All in all, the meeting was informative and the members of the Barton County Society were pleasant hosts.
