

# THE HISTORY OF THE DESTER FAMILY AND 1005 NORTH WATER

The new Midwest library building was originally located at 1005 North Water. The house was built around 1898 by Henry Abram Dester, a local carpenter. In it's original form the house was only one story. The second level was built on later so the family could take on boarders. In fact, in the 1909 city directory not only were the Desters living at 1005 but so were Orla K. Stewart, Henry Dester's son-in-law, and family. So the second level of the building would have been built between 1898 and 1909.

Henry Dester was born July 27, 1844 in Edersburg, Germany, the son of Henrich Dester. Henrich Dester, his wife and four children immigrated to America in 1851, settling in Lee County, Iowa. Henry married Katharina Rupp, born May 16, 1847, who was also a German immigrant. She was the daughter of John Rupp and Mary Hirschter. Henry and Katharina had three children: Mary Elizabeth, born May 4, 1870 in Washington County, Iowa, Elizabeth born Aug. 13, 1872 also in Washington County, Iowa and Katherine Ida born Nov. 25, 1874 near Moundridge, Kansas.

Henry and family moved to Kansas about 1876 to the Moundridge area. Then in about 1884 the family moved to Wichita. They seemed to move about quite a bit according to the city directories. About 1894 they moved to North Water Street, living at 1004, and the house they lived in for so many years, at 1005 would have been built after they bought the land at that location from J.N. Haymaker in 1898.

On December 17, 1889, Henry's second daughter "Lizzie" married Orla Kenton Stewart. This was the only one of the daughters to marry. Mary E. did bookkeeping and stenography while Katherine was a seamstress out of their home on North Water.

Henry Dester's son-in-law, Orla Stewart, was the Wichita Chief of Police in 1915. Orla's sons, Edgar C. and Oscar H. became co-founders of Globe Construction Company in 1916. Globe Construction Company was also located in the 1000 block of North Water for many years. After Edgar and Henry's deaths, Edgar's sons, Kenton S. and James E. Stewart took over Globe Construction.

The Desters and the Stewarts were all members of St. John's Episcopal Church. Henry Dester died May 16, 1929 leaving his widow and two unmarried daughters the house on North Water.

A life long resident of Sedgwick County remembers the Dester sisters in the 1930's. The older sister worked outside and kept house while the younger one was a seamstress and did sewing in the house on North Water.

Katharina Dester died January 6. 1937. Mary and Katherine spent the rest of their lives on North Water with their nephews looking after them. Just after their mother died in 1937 the sisters rented out one level of their home to William Vaughn and his family. The Vaughn's were living

on North Water in the 1939 city directory. The Vaughns were not the only family that had rented from the Desters. In the early 1920's the Byerly family lived there and one of their daughters was born there.

William Vaughn and family lived on one level of the 1005 house and the Dester sisters lived on the other level until their deaths. Mary E. died September 23, 1951 and Katherine died January 8, 1961. The Desters are all buried in Old Mission Cemetery.

The Vaughns bought the 1005 house in February of 1967, after the death of the Desters and lived there until the 1970's. In 1979 the house was sold to Urban Renewal and has been vacant since that time.

In renovating the interior of the Dester house the wall and ceiling plaster had to be stripped before the house could be moved. Practically all of the second floor was lath and plaster whereas the first floor area had been remodeled and sheetrock had replaced all of the plaster except for the foyer and front stairwell. The plaster on the walls in the foyer and stairwell was the original plaster. As bits of plaster were removed you could see the animal hair that had been mixed in with the plaster to give it holding power. The plaster in the upper level was of a more modern nature.

Midwest Historical and Genealogical Society took possession of the house at 1005 North Water in September of 1985. Preparation for moving the structure began immediately. Groundbreaking ceremonies were held at 1203 North Main on September 8, 1985. Since that time many hours have been spent, first in preparation for removal of the house from 1005 North Water to 1203 North Main, and now in the remodeling of the structure for the new Midwest Historical and Genealogical Society Library.

TO THE MEMBERSHIP:

#### THE HISTORY OF 1203 NORTH MAIN

In the 1870 land description of the City of Wichita the 1200 block of North Main was owned by Doc Lewellen. The earliest structure that we presently know of on the location was the depot and general offices of the St. Louis, Fort Scott and Wichita Railway. The railroad was built through the area in 1882 and in the mid to late 1880's the railroad purchased all the lots in the 1200 block of North Main. After that time the railroad went through some name changes. It was known as the Kansas, Colorado, Pacific Railroad and later the Missouri Pacific. The railroad remained owner of the property until it was purchased by Urban Renewal in the late 1970's.

For a number of years the railroad leased part of the property to the Gardner Coal Co. The building that the coal company used for an office was built in 1905 and sometime after it closed in the early 1960's the building was moved to Historic Wichita Cowtown. It has not been restored but is being used for storage and sits on the south side of the museum, near the Arkansas River.

Ownership of much of the land in the area was obtained by Urban Renewal and just in the past year it has begun to be redeveloped. The Kansas Elks Training Center is building homes in the area to help in this redevelopment. The lots that Midwest Historical and Genealogical Society received are in a triangular shape, bounded by the Missouri Pacific Railroad on the west, Main Street on the east and 11th Street on the south. The size of the lots will allow ample room for parking and also future expansion of our library facility.

### HALSTEAD TOWNSHIP

Mr. A. L. Green, Compiler Newton, Kans.

On the 19th of October 1870 the writer started for Kansas overland. We struck Kansas at Kansas City. Takeing a south west course we started for the home of the buffalo & antelope on the little Arkansas River. On our route we passed through Olatha and Otawa & Eureka then west to Wichita. We then took the old Government Road north - Came to Sedgwick City. We there found Chas. Schaeffer and John Sloan with a small stock of General Merchandise, Mrs. McClung - Hotel, & John Hawks - Salvon, Mike Ragen - Blacksmith. After looking over the country along our line of travel we arrived on Little River in what is now Halstead Township on the 15th of December 1870, where we found a Cattle Ranch called Hannas Ranch & a family by the name of Randall which I think was the first Lamily in Halstead Township. There were also in township John N. Congan, Allen Millen & family, Andrew Oleson & family, Geo. Cooper & family, Jay Schoonover & Lamily. All except Randall had located on land. The last to settle in 1870 was A. J. & L. D. Brewer on the 15th of Dec/70. There were some timber along Little River. It was a beautiful sight to look over the prairie. You could look as far as the eye could see over a prairie as level as a floor seemingly, where [ane] now beautiful groves, the work of the pioneen, has almost changed the country to a timber country.

The beautiful minage is almost a thing of the past. Looking oven the sea of prairie one could see objects only a half mile away that would look to be 4 or 5 miles away. Also objects 2 or 3 miles away it would seem only a stones throw. The Sand hills & Big River were the buffalo hunting grounds. You could start in the morning and go to the Big River, get one or two buffalo & back the same day. In 1872 the buffalo were beat back to Nenesqua & Medicine Lodge Rivers. As late as 1871 there were several killed in this locality - one about where Halstead now stands, one in Macon township not far from Capt. Aikers & one down in Lakin Township on Kisawa. There were a few deer & turkey along Little River and thousands of antelope on the up land, also a few wild cats - pole cats - badger - coon & prairie dogs, owls & snakes. In the spring of 1871 the A. T. & S. Fe R.R. was built to Newton to intercept

the cattle trade which was the largest drive from Texas ever made. The early history of Newton need no more commenting. (There are numerous incidents of early settlement that is unnecessary to mention.) The early settlers had very hard times as they were all poor people & had nothing to do with. There were some that lived on clams picked up out of the river and anything they could get. They broke up the prairie as fast as they could (haveing nothing to feed their teams only grass). There were a sportanious gro[w]th of blue \_\_\_ grass in 1871 that grew to the heighth of 6 or 7 feet high which has never occurred since. In 1871 sod corn made a good crop - except it was badly worm eaten. There were numerous prairie fines occurred in the first few years that damaged the early settlers - burning up everything - corn, hay, buildings & stock. In '72 crops were about the same only more acreage. In 1873 there were wheat sown which done very well. In 1874 there were a good acreage of corn, oats & wheat put out but the grasshoppers done the harvesting, leaving the people destitute. There were a great deal of suffering & would have been more only for our kind friends in the east. In 1875 our people had to commence their improvements over again, which they did with a determination to win & we now have one of the best States in the Union. In 1876 our people begin to prosper again and in '77 -'78 -'79 -'80 & '81 times were the best ever known in the State -Large crops, good prices and a great emigration from all parts of the world, makeing business good & money plenty.

# in 1870 - Personal Mention

The first settler in Halstead Township was John N. Congan, an old Government scout known as Old Mc. Located on N.W. \( \frac{1}{4} \) Sec. 3. There were two cattle ranches one on Sec. 36 at the upper end of Picnic Grove called Hannahs Ranch & one on Sec. 28 called McFarland & Kyles Ranch. Both left in 1871. The next settlers were Geo. Cooper & wife, Allen Miller & Family, Andrew Oleson and Family, Jay Schoonover & Family, A. J. and L. D. Brewer. Then houses were sod on dug outs made in the bank of the river. A. J. Brewer built the first frame house in the township - hauled the lumber from Salina. The house was built on N.W. \( \frac{1}{4} \) Sec. 30 - two miles west of all settlement at that time. Lena Schoonover was the first child born in Township. Corn sold as high

as \$2.50 per bu., flour \$5.00 per 100 & other things in proportion. In 1871 there settled in what is now Halstead Twp. Harry Fields & wife, Mr. & Mrs. Taylor, Mrs. Fields Father & Mother. Mrs. Taylor died in the fall of 1871, the first death. Also [settled] Joseph Williams - Ed Brown & family & Mrs. Browns Mother, a pensioner of 1812 war. F. J. Brown, Joe Thornhill, Jason Bennett & wife, Alford Allen & family, Thus. Eweing & family, Steve Stout & family, Wm. Flory, Cyrus Hinkson, G. F. Benthusen & family, W. I. Inman & family, John W. Smith & family, H. S. Wenban & family, John Cole & family, Geo. Kirk & family, J. S. Long & family, Eli L. Davis & family, Chas. & Jas Melling, Z. W. Monroe, E. B. Harrington & family, Frank Dinkle, Jerry Bard, Buttler & Giles & familys, Porter, the Frenchman, James Ryan & Rino N. Riggs, Wm. Williams, Si Morris, Jas Papkins & family, Jas Brewer & fam., Geo. W. Brewer & family, S. T. Marsh. All of the above settled in 1871 and possibly more that I can't call to mind at this late date. Those that came in later years I cannot give owing to so many comeing & going every year.

The original of this handwritten article is in a folder on the shelf in the genealogy section of the Newton Public Library in Harvey County, KS.. M.H.G.S. member Micki Crozier photocopied it for us. It was written on lined paper (could be a yellow legal size pad) with what seems to be an old style fountain pen. It is not dated.


