

#### LIBRARY EXPANSION COMMITTEE REPORT

# CONCERNING THE FIRST OWNER OF 1203 NORTH MAIN

In reading in our last REGISTER (Vol. XX, No. 4), the article "The History of 1203 North Main" caught my eye. I was surprised to learn that the first owner of that property was Doc Lewellen.

The first time I heard this name was in 1967, which was the year Wichita celebrated its Centennial and was shortly before our daughter was to be married. I had invited her husband-to-be's Mother over to make out our lists for the wedding announcements. As this was the first time we'd met, we got to chatting about families. In the process, I learned her first ancestor to come to Wichita was Doc Lewellen, which didn't mean a thing to me then, but since have learned that he was the man that bought the Old Indian Trading Post from Jesse Chisholm, moved it down close to where the two rivers came together (9th and Waco now), and started the first store. After a few years he turned the store over to his oldest daughter and her husband, and he went back to his farm in Butler County, near Towanda.

Hannah, his oldest daughter, had married John Ward in 1868 and they were the first bride and groom of Wichita—the Honeymoon Cottage, that now sits in Cowtown, was their first home. Their daughter, Henrietta (Etta), married Robert Widdow on February 19, 1899 in her Mother's home at 820 North Wichita. They went to Eldorado by wagon to get the wedding dress, which took two days. This was a dark green heavy material with satin brocade trim. The dress has been handed down in the family and is still in fair condition.

When our daughter was disappointed that our church was not available for the time she wanted, I suggested they get married in the little White Church in Cowntown. She could wear this old fashioned wedding dress and have their reception in the Honeymoon Cottage, as this was Wichita's Centennial year [1967]. She said 'no way', but now rather wishes she had. Her husband is the fifth generation. A great aunt, who has the dress, has written a genealogy and has graciously given me a copy.

I was checking through my past MHGS REGISTERS the other day—it's surprising what you can find you hadn't seen before. In Vol. XIX, No. 3(1984), page 315, "KANSAS STATE CENSUS, 1 Apr. 1865, Butler County, Chelsea Twp.," by S. C. Fulton, the entire family of Lewellen, D., is listed. His oldest daughter, H., was thirteen at the time!

As this address, 1203 North Main, is where our new Genealogy Library is located, I thought this might be of interest to some of you.

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#### THE YELLOW BRICK ROAD IN PENNSYLVANIA

This is a story of how a Kansan found the "yellow brick road" in Pennsylvania. On 7 October 1917 Carl Wiley, a Kansan, and Nelle McSparren, an Iowan, were married at Winterset, Iowa. Carl, born 9 July 1893 in the small town of Madison, was the son of William T. Wiley of Jennings County, Indiana, and Florence Hickinbotham of Sylvan, Wisconsin. William was a carpenter in Madison and, when Carl was old enough to hold a hammer, he followed his father around in his workshop. Later, Carl joined his father in his trade and many fine old houses, still standing in Madison, are the result of their handicraft. However, about 1916 Carl migrated to Des Moines, Iowa, where he joined the National Guard and was sent to the Mexican border near Brownsville, Texas, for duty during the war with Mexico.

Nelle McSparren, wife of Carl Wiley, was born 23 August 1896 in Eldon, Wapello County, Iowa, where she grew up in the rail-roading community, later moving to Des Moines where she found a job as a bookkeeper in a sporting goods store. She was the daughter of Charles McSparren of Cedar County, Iowa, and Sophia Watts of Lee County, Iowa. Sophia, mother of Nelle, was the daughter of English born Elihu Watts, who was raised in Pennsylvania and fought in the Civil War, and Sarah Margaret Reiter, daughter of Louis F. Reiter of Baltimore and Katherine Leasure.

Katharine, who was to lead Helen to the "yellow brick road," was the daughter of John Leasure and Margaret Brinker, both of Pennsylvania, and granddaughter of Daniel Leasure and Elizabeth Ryan. Daniel, born 1 July 1758 in York County, Pennsylvania, was elected Captain of a frontier company before he was of age and served as such until he was fifty years old. His wife, Elizabeth Ryan, daughter of George Ryan, was of French-Irish descent. As a young girl, she was in the fort at Hannastown when it was attacked by Indians in 1782 and, to help those who defended the fort, melted pewter spoons into bullets.

Daniel's father was Abraham Leasure who was born in 1735 in Germany where his parents had fled because of a storm of religious persecution in Navarre, France. They were Huguenots, originally spelling their name Le Suer. Abraham and his wife, Margaret, immigrated to Chambersburg, Pennsylvania, sometime prior to the Revolutionary War. During that great struggle, he moved to the valley of the Kiskiminetas, where he was an Indian scout until 1790, and afterwards, purchased a train of pack horses and transported merchandise. He eventually purchased a large tract of land near Pleasant Unity, Westmoreland County, Pennsylvania, from the heirs of William Penn. He settled and remained there until his death in 1803.

Now, how did the "yellow brick road" in Pennsylvania get into this story. Because Helen Wiley Lee is a genealogist who walks

cemeteries and searches county courthouses for records. During the summer of 1985, Helen and her husband, Alan, were in Pennsylvania for a family wedding. Noting on the map that the town of Mt. Pleasant was only ten miles away, they decided to go there following the festivities. They visited the courthouse at Greensburg, in Westmoreland County, where the clerks helped them locate records and gave them directions to the Unity Township Cemetery. Many researchers, according to the caretaker of the cemetery, came to "see Abraham" and he gave them directions to find the grave. First, he said, follow the yellow brick road to a curve and, around the curve, would be Abraham's grave. Imagine their surprise when Helen and Alan saw the path, made with bricks that were yellow! And sure enough, around the curve was Abraham Leasure's grave. And, that is how a Kansan, on a summer day in 1985, found the "yellow brick road" in Pennsylvania.

Note: Helen Wiley Lee's ancestor chart was published in the MHGS REGISTER 15(July-September):74-75. Following is an abstract of Abraham Leasure's will as transcribed by Helen Lee.

Westmoreland County, Pennsylvania Will Book 1, pp 177-79. Will of Abraham Leasure of Unitey Township, Westmoreland County, Pennsylvania. Dated 6 March 1803. Names sons John Leasure, Daniel Leasure, Abraham Leasure; wife Margaret; daughters Mary, wife of John Emdig (?), Margaret, wife of Frederick Weaver, Elizabeth, wife of Henry Clever. Executors: John Grove, Henry Brinker. Witnesses: David Kilgor, John Kilgor, William Mormeyer (?).




#### SEDGWICK AND SURROUNDING AREA COUNTY MAPS









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# CALCULATING A BIRTHDATE FROM TOMBSTONE INFORMATION

This arithmetic exercise is little understood by most family historians. It is reproduced here from Marshall County Roots & Branches for October, 1985.

The following is offered as a simple method of calculating the date of a person's birth using the date of death and the age at death. This doesn't sound like a difficult task and it isn't if you keep a few rules of thumb in mind. It is just a matter of subtraction once the numbers are placed so that those with the greatest value are at the left. Suppose a child died at the age of 1 year, 3 months, and 11 days; date of death is recorded as July 26, 1871. Your numbers would be arranged as follows:

Whenever it isn't a matter of simple arithmetic with the lower number smaller than the one it is being subtracted from, you must borrow from the number to the left. However, you must remember to change the month you are borrowing into days and the year you must borrow into months (12). The number of days would depend on the number of days in the month preceding (30,31,28, or even 29 in the event of a leap-year February). If the child in the example above had died at age 1 year, 3 months, and 29 days, the calculations would appear as follows:

(30 days of June were borrowed) 
$$1871 \frac{3}{28}$$
  
(birthdate: March 27, 1870)  $1870 \frac{3}{3} \frac{29}{27}$ 

(This may not seem correct but look at it this way, if you did not begin numbering July at "1" again July 26th would be June 56.) Suppose this child died at the age of 1 year, 9 months, & 11 days. The example would now appear as follows:

(12 months are borrowed from 1871) 
$$287$$
  $728$  (birthdate: October 15, 1869  $1015$   $1869$   $1015$ 

Just for fun, let's try a more complex example. Suppose the person who died was 75 years, 6 months, and 21 days old when he died on the 1st of March in 1912.

Your calculations may not agree to the day with known birthdates because we have no way of being certain whether the person doing the original calculating used this method or one that assumed all months to contain 30 days. If the latter was the custom, your figures would be 1 (or 2) days off.

# DEATH NOTICES FROM KANSAS TERRITORIAL NEWSPAPERS,

# 1854-1861

# Compiled by Alberta Pantle

The following death notices are reprinted, with permission, from the KANSAS HISTORICAL QUARTERLY, Vol. 18, 1950. The remainder will be printed in following issues of the <u>REGISTER</u>. "Marriage Notices From Kansas Territorial Newspapers, 1854-1861," a companion article, appeared in Vol. 19 of the REGISTER.

THE following list of deaths was compiled from the files of territorial newspapers belonging to the Kansas State Historical Society. The year in which the newspaper was published is given only when it differs from the year in which the death occurred. In cases where the same notice appeared in two or more newspapers, the entry from the local newspaper was used if it gave complete information.

Inasmuch as the file of some newspapers is only a scattering of issues, and as many deaths were never recorded in any newspaper, this list is not complete. There are, of course, many other sources for ascertaining the death dates of persons who lived in Kansas territory. Among them are the mortality schedules from the United States census for 1860, cemetery inscriptions, church and family records, and printed histories.

ADAMS, HENRY C., son of W. H. & Harriett Ann, aged 4 mos., d. Platte county, Mo., April 5, 1858. (Leavenworth, Kansas Weekly Herald, April 17.)

#### COMPUTER BUFFS

The February meeting of the National Genealogical Society Computer Interest Group featured Paul A. Andereck as guest speaker. Paul and his wife, Sara, publish and edit a quarterly periodical, Genealogical Computing, and, with Richard A. Pence, Paul authored Computer Genealogy, a plain language, nontechnical guide on genealogical computing.

According to Andereck, a well equipped computer genealogist should have the following in order to do a first class job of computerizing his or her records. (Note: You really don't have to have the following to computerize your genealogy. This is Paul's sophisticated shopping list.)

Computer: PC-DOS/MS-DOS computer with at least 256k RAM, monochrome monitor, two double-sided double-density disk drives and a 10mb or greater hard disk. (Example: Tandy 1000 with external hard disk. Also shop IBM PC, Compaq, Leading Edge D.) Modem: Hayes-compatible 300/1200 baud external direct connect auto-dial, auto-answer. Printers: #1. Dot-matrix 132-characters per line with pinfeed or tractor, carriage width for standard continuous form 8-1/2x11 paper. #2. Daisy-wheel standard width, 35 characters per second, Diablo-clone cartridge ribbon and printwheels, with or without tractor, pitches 10, 12, 15 and proportional, 6 and 8 lines per inch. If only one printer is purchased, choose #2.

Software: DOS: MS- or PC-DOS 2.1 or higher (usually comes with computer). BASIC: Microsoft GWBASIC or BASICA (comes with computer). Genealogy: Roots II by Commsoft. Word Processing: Word Perfect 4.1 by SSI Software. Database Manager: PC-FILE III v4 by Buttonware. Communications: Crosstalk by Microstuff. Spreadsheet: PC-CALC by Buttonware. General Ledger: DAC-EASY by DAC. Payroll: DAC-PAYROLL by DAC. Utilities: Sidekick by Borland; PROKEY by Rosesoft. (Business software included for another business use to justify expense.)

Supplies and incidentals, including a power strip, paper, ribbons, diskettes, etc., which, less some of the software and maybe one of the printers, will bring the total cost to around \$3,500 to \$4,000. Be sure to shop compatibles, and consider a 20mb hard disk, instead of a 10mb, to bring your computer up to 640k.

In his <u>Genealogical Computing</u>, <u>September</u>, 1984, Paul said Family Roots by Quinsept was "the genealogy software to beat." Now, he says, Commsoft has done that with Roots II. He plans to test Family Roots, Roots II, and the Morman Church's Personal Ancestral File and report his findings in his periodical. These three are considered the "big three" of genealogy software, far out-selling and out-performing whatever is in 4th place.

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
