[He first saw government corner on northeast corner of his quarter in early May 1872; consisted of four pits with a mound of dirt in the center and a stake laying near the corner. Marks on the stake were a figure 8 on one side, and figures 7, 17, and 18 on other sides.]

W. A. MADDEN. Came from Jersey Co., IL to KS and settled on SW/4 of Sec. 8 Twn 26 Rng 3W in Dec 1874. About 1877, from SW corner of Sec. 17, plowed east for hedge row on south line of Sec. 17 for John Ogelsvie.

WILLIAM H. HILL. Moved from IL to KS in 1872 and into Sedgwick Co. in spring of 1873 and onto Cowskin in Union Twn. Came here in Mar or Apr 1873 hunting claim. Moved on NW/4 of Sec. 20 Twn 26 Rng 3W in May; left it in 1874; stayed on it year or more.

R. O. SIDLES. Came to Sedgwick Co. in fall of 1872 and settled with Mr. Sidles. Was 9 years old that fall.

JOHN FOBEE. Came to Sedgwick Co. in 1875 on visit and in Mar 1876 bought SE/4 of Sec. 18 Twn 26 Rng 3W.

W. A. FRAZEE. First saw north quarter corner of Sec. 17 in spring of 1872. Traded for quarter in 1873.

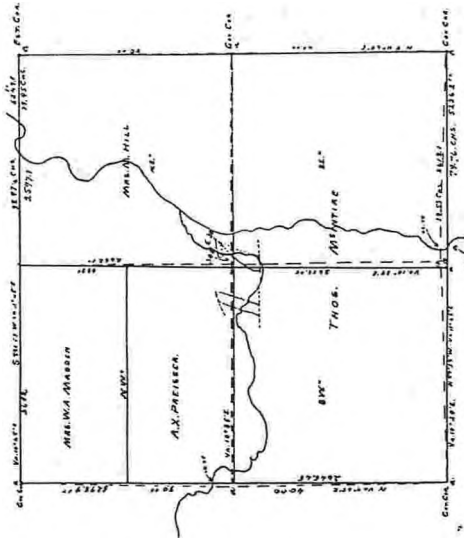

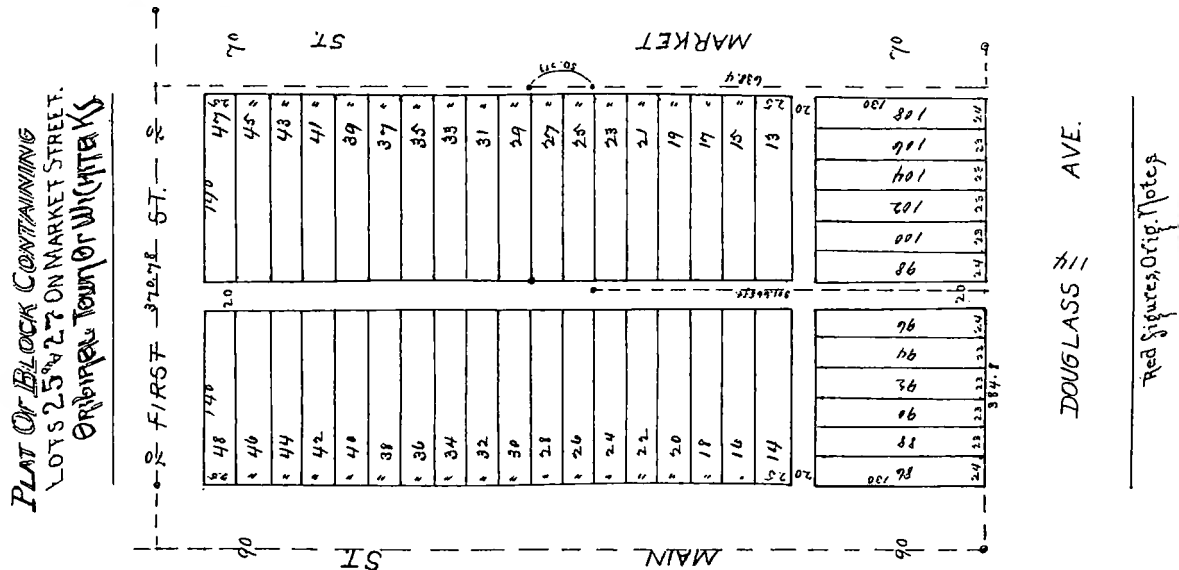

RESEARCH AIDS FOR KANSAS WILLS

Knowing a little something about testate and intestate laws in Kansas can be helpful in genealogical research. Although there are exceptions, the following is general information in effect during the latter part of the nineteenth century. Sources are the COMPILED LAWS OF KANSAS, 1879, compiled by C. F. W. Dassler (St. Louis: W. J. Gilbert, 1879), and GENERAL STATUTES OF KANSAS, 1899, compiled by C. F. W. Dassler (Topeka: Crane & Co., 1900).

1. Any person of full age and sound mind and memory, having an interest in real or personal property, could make a will. Full age was 21 for males and 18 for females.
2. In addition to the county where the will was proved, a copy of the will and order of probate was recorded in each county in Kansas where the deceased had real estate devised (left to someone) by will, IF the judge of that county ordered it.
3. Wills proven in other states, relative to any property in Kansas, could be recorded in the probate court of any county in Kansas where any part of the property was located.
4. If a will was contested, it was by civil action in the district court in the same county where the will was admitted to probate. A will could be contested at any time within two years after the probate of the will but not afterwards.
5. No man or woman, while married, could bequeath (leave by will) away from his/her spouse, more than one-half of his/her property unless they received consent in writing, with two witnesses. From 1865-1868, the husband could devise away the entire estate.
6. When the testator (one who made a legally valid will) had a child born after his death who was not provided for in the will, the child received the same share in the will as if the testator had died without leaving a will (see 8).
7. A verbal will (nuncupative will) made during the last illness of a person, was valid in respect to personal property if it was put in writing and signed by two competent disinterested witnesses, within ten days after the verbal will was spoken, and if it was proven by witnesses the testator was of sound mind and memory, and not under any restraints. The will had to be offered to probate within six months after the death of the testator. Real estate was handled as if the testator had died leaving no will (see 8).
8. If an inhabitant of Kansas died intestate (leaving no will), after the debts were paid, one-half of the value of all the real

estate belonged to the wife and the other half to the children in equal shares. And, if the personal property of the deceased was not needed to pay debts, it was to be distributed one-half to the wife and the other half to the children in equal shares.

9. All provisions made to the wife/widow of a deceased husband applied the same to the husband/widower of a deceased wife. "Estates of dower and by curtesy are abolished." Curtesy is the right a husband has in the lands of his dead wife, when they have had children capable of inheriting.

10. Children of half-blood inherit equally with children of whole blood.

11. Illegitimate children inherited from their mother and also from the father when recognized by him as his children.

12. If an inhabitant of Kansas died intestate and the wife was not a resident of Kansas at the time of conveyance (transfer of title to real estate) or never was a resident of Kansas, she was not entitled to any interest in any real estate as "continuous cohabitation as husband and wife is presumptive evidence of marriage, for the purpose of giving the right to inherit land".

13. If an inhabitant died intestate in Kansas, the homestead of 160 acres of farming land, or one acre within the limits of an incorporated town or city, occupied at the time of his death as a residence and afterward by the widow and children, was exempt from distribution and payments of debts and was the absolute property of the widow and children WITH EXCEPTIONS pertaining to certain debts if the heirs were unable to pay those debts.

14. If a person died intestate in another state, leaving an estate to be administered in Kansas, the administration of that estate was granted by the probate court of ANY county in which there was any estate to be administered. The first administration lawfully granted extended to all the estate of the deceased in Kansas and excluded the jurisdiction of the probate court in every other county.

15. The administration of the estate of an intestate was granted in the following order: 1) his widow, or next of kin, or both; 2) one or more of the principal creditors; 3) other persons the court deemed proper. They had to be residents of Kansas.

16. Every executor or administrator had to return to the court, an inventory of all goods, chattels, moneys, rights and credits of the deceased, and real estate, within 60 days after their appointment or sooner. Every executor or administrator had to give the first accounting of the administration within one year.

THE OREGON TRAIL: DEATHS IN 1852

On 12 May 1841, the "first emigrant wagon train to set out for the Pacific" left present day Johnson County, Kansas, beginning the two thousand mile journey west on the Oregon Trail. By 1852, following the onset of the Mormon emigration in 1847 and the California gold rush in 1849, the well traveled route was the scene of an annual California-Oregon-Utah migration west.

To cross the Cascades and Sierra before the snow, the seasonal exodus of wagon trains began as soon as the prairies were green, starting in May and continuing through the early part of June. Statistics from the Fort Kearny post record in 1852 noted 7,516 wagons, 18,656 men, 4,370 women, 5,600 children, 7,783 horses, 3,983 mules, 74,780 cattle and 23,980 sheep headed out on the Oregon Trail traveling on the south bank of the Platte River past Fort Kearny, and an estimated equal number on the north bank.

Trips could be good or bad, depending on the weather. Confrontations with Indians on the trail were not a major problem for the well armed travelers as there was little warfare between the two groups during this period. The greatest danger was cholera epidemics, bringing death by violent dehydration to many members of the wagon trains.

One hundred miles west of Fort Kearny, on 1 June 1852, Seth N. Doty, a traveler on the trail, wrote: "The train is estimated to be 700 miles long, composed of all kinds of people from all parts of the United States, and some of the rest of mankind, with lots of horses, mules, oxen, cows, steers and some of the feathered creation, moving along about 15 or 20 miles per day; all sorts of vehicles from a coach down to a wheel barrow; ladies on horseback, dressed out in full-blown Bloomers; gents on mules, with their Kossuth hats and plumes, galloping over the prairies, making quite an equestrian troupe and a show ahead of anything Barnum ever got up. The plains are a pleasant place to travel; excellent roads . . . and were it not for the sick and the dying, that everywhere meet our eye, and the vast number of graves along the road, the journey would be a pleasant one. As near as I can ascertain by observation, there are about 80 graves to the 100 miles so far; that is, new ones. . . ."

SEARCHING FOR QUAKER RECORDS

by Jean McRae White

Most people searching for Quaker records are referred to William Hinshaw's Encyclopedia of American Quaker Genealogy which is extracted mainly from meeting records found at Swathmore College, Swathmore, Pennsylvania, and Guilford College, Guilford, North Carolina. The encyclopedia consists of six volumes:

- Volume I -- the Carolinas
- Volume II -- Philadelphia, Pa; Salem and Burlington, New Jersey
- Volume III -- New York City and Long Island
- Volumes IV & V -- Ohio
- Volume VI -- Virginia

Hinshaw, however, did not finish his encyclopedia before his death. Willard Heiss of Indianapolis, through the Indiana Historical Society, published some of the Indiana and Illinois meetings from Hinshaw's unpublished notes. Heiss compiled six volumes of Indiana records. Volumes I and II of Heiss comprise Volume VII of the encyclopedia. Roger Boone published a book of corrections and additions to Heiss' Indiana meetings.

The genealogist may ask, "Are these all the meeting records that still exist?" This is probably true for North Carolina. All the holdings at Guilford College were published in Hinshaw's encyclopedia. There were many more meetings that existed in North Carolina, but their records are now presumed lost. But there are many other Quaker meeting records still available that are not recorded in the seven volumes of Hinshaw's encyclopedia.

After William Hinshaw died, his widow donated his notebooks to Swathmore College where they were microfilmed. She paid to have the records placed on cards and alphabetically filed by meetings, using the same format found in the encyclopedia. This file is known as THE QUAKER INDEX. It includes meeting records as far west as Iowa, Oklahoma, Nebraska, and Colorado. Willard Heiss used this index to make typescript copies of the records, and placed these in the lending library of his daughter-in-law. When the library was discontinued, the typescripts were placed in storage. About four years ago, Friends University in Wichita, Kansas (they also hold the meeting records under the Kansas Yearly Meeting) paid a substantial sum to obtain these records for their Quaker collection at the Edmund Stanley Library. Another copy of these typescripts is at the Allen County Library, Fort Wayne, Indiana. Also, THE QUAKER INDEX has been filmed by the LDS Church and an index by surname is available on microfilm number 0002,148.

Haverford College, Haverford, Pennsylvania, holds some other Pennsylvania meeting records and has reciprocated with Swathmore College so that now each college holds a full set of Pennsylvania records, as well as records from other states.

Another major source of Quaker records is the Hall of Records, Annapolis, Maryland. They hold the records on microfilm which were under the Baltimore Yearly Meeting, the Virginia Yearly Meeting, and a few under the Philadelphia Yearly Meeting. Generally, these include all the Delaware meetings, Maryland meetings (including the eastern shore meetings under the Philadelphia Yearly

Meeting), most of the Virginia meetings, all meetings located in what is now West Virginia, meetings in southeastern and central Pennsylvania, and a few meetings from Ohio, Indiana and Iowa. The records for southwestern Pennsylvania (originally under the Baltimore Yearly Meeting) are now at Swathmore College and are believed not to be included in THE QUAKER INDEX.

A few meeting records, such as Hopewell Meeting in Virginia and Kingwood Meeting in New Jersey, have been published separately. New York meeting records not found in Hinshaw may be at the New York Yearly Meeting Records Room, 221 East 15th Street, New York, New York 10003. New England meeting records may be found at the New England Quaker Research Library, P.O. Box 655, North Amherst, Massachusetts 01059.

Meetings in Upper Canada (Ontario) were formed from migrations of people from the States. Records exist for a few of these meetings and are in the Archives of the Society of Friends, Friends Meeting House, 60 Lowther Avenue, Toronto, Ontario. They publish the Canadian Quaker History Newsletter. The Ontario Archives in Toronto microfilmed these records and they are available to the researcher at their reading room. The University of Western Ontario in London, Ontario also has some of the meeting records.

Most of the meeting records mentioned above have been microfilmed by the LDS Church and are at the Genealogical Library in Salt Lake City. They can be rented through branch LDS libraries throughout the United States by consulting the GLC (microfiche catalog of holdings) at any of the branch libraries. For a complete listing of their holdings, search the author/title of the GLC under "Society of Friends."

A national society for Descendants of Early Quakers has recently been formed. Membership information may be obtained from the national corresponding clerk, Miss Bonita Dell Miller, 3040 East 2nd Street #11, Long Beach, California 90803.

Another source of Quaker family material is The Quaker Yeoman, a quarterly published by James E. Bellarts, Brookside Business Consultants, Inc., 2330 S E Brookwood, Suite 108, Hillsboro, Oregon 97123.

Willard Heiss is working on the Handbook for Historians and Genealogists for Quaker Research in the United States and Canada. This is one of his retirement projects and will be a major contribution to genealogical research.

KANSAS COUNCIL OF GENEALOGICAL SOCIETIES

Report of Annual Meeting

The annual meeting of the state council was held in Lawrence, KS, 13 June 1987. Rowene Horr of Topeka, the outgoing president, was in charge. Thirteen of the council's thirty seven societies were represented with one hundred nine attendees. The treasurer was absent but his report was read. The financial balance stood at \$4,561.00. The 1987-88 budget is \$4,370.00. There is to be no increase in dues for the current year.

No additional nominations for new officers were presented from the floor, so the spring mail balloting will prevail. New officers are: Ruth Clark, president, is from Winchester; and, Jo Eslinger, vice president, is from Wichita.

The spring research trip to Salt Lake City was termed successful. A September 1988 trip is planned and will be of an extra day's duration. This will allow a full week of research.

With a rather bitter mood, announcement was made that Attorney General Bob Stephan put in a bid to add the present Research Center to his legal facilities. This is the structure that formerly housed the Kansas State Historical Societies' exhibits along with the many research collections. An ever expanding court system, it is claimed, will need the space.

To better conserve the priceless collections now housed in the Research Center, there is long range planning for a new home. An all new structure could have the latest enviromental controls and provide an improved arrangement of storing and viewing areas. Accessible parking would be most appreciated by the visitors. Locating in the area of the new Museum would probably be the most feasible approach.

The assembly was told that President Reagan's nomination of John Agresto for National Archivist had been withdrawn. Much protest had been expressed relative to Mr. Agresto's nomination. The Federation of Genealogical Societies is promoting the appointment of Don W. Wilson. He is currently director of the Gerald Ford Library.

Mr. Joe Snell, executive director of the Kansas State Historical Society is retiring next year. Many Kansas genealogists are urging the appointment of R. Reed Whitaker. This individual is familiar to many, he being current director of the National Archives Kansas City branch.

Mr. Lloyd Bockstruck of Dallas presented an informative program on Virginia.

COMPUTER BUFFS

by Faye G. Wood

Your computer has been plugged in and all the peripherals have been added; you have looked at all the programs, chosen the program for you and purchased it. Next comes your modem, so you can do some serious, albeit fun, research. Well, as usual LOOK before you LEAP! The most important word in ANY computer language is COMPATIBILITY! Your computer had to be compatible with your program and your printer - SO DOES THE MODEM!

Questions to ask:

1. What kind of modem do I want or need?
2. What kind of phone system do I need?
Can I use just a phone or does this require a special or separate line?
3. What kind of attachments, cords, cables, connectors, and/or adaptors do I need? Where can I find them?
4. Do I need communications software?
5. Who do I call? What kind of information can I find?

Now to briefly answer these questions. Before you invest in a modem, please do a thorough research.

A modem is a device that allows you to connect your computer to the phone line. This lets you make a telephone call from your computer to another computer and send information back and forth. Most modems can be used with both tone and rotary phone systems, but some are designed to work with only one. Be sure the modem you buy is COMPATIBLE with your phone system. If you have CALL WAITING and you find you have a problem with a modem, the CALL WAITING may be the problem.

There are two basic types of modems, internal and external. Internal modems are those for which the computer has internal slots for circuit boards. All computers, however, can use external modems which are connected to the serial port.

Many modems have an RS232C interface. Some need a standard 25 pin serial cable to connect the modem to the computer. Some require a special cable, and it should be sold with the modem. Make sure you know where to get a cable BEFORE you buy a modem.

When selecting a modem for your computer, it is best to buy a modem made by the same company, particularly Commodore and Atari. Otherwise, it makes sense to buy a Hayes modem or at least a Hayes-compatible modem since Hayes set the standard that most modem manufacturers have adopted.

The rate at which you can send and receive data is indicated by the BAUD rate. A 300 Baud rate modem will send more than one double-spaced page per minute. The newer 2400 Baud rate modems are faster. You need to decide if the 300 Baud rate will handle your needs before buying a faster, higher Baud rate.

Some terms used when considering a modem are as follows:

AUTO LOG-ON (AUTODIAL)-A sequence of commands that

connects you to a host system and is automatically executed when you press a certain key. Included are the phone number of the system you are calling, your identification, and your password.

FILE TRANSFER PROTOCOL-A set of rules for sending a file that two computer systems both adhere to. Using formalized rules, instead of merely opening a capture buffer, improves the chances of an error-free transmission. Xmodem, Kermit, and Vidtex are some of the protocols.

PARAMETERS-The various settings, controlled by communications software, that affect your modem's performance. To communicate, both computers should have the same settings.

"Communications software is the bridge between your computer and your modem" is a statement from FAMILY COMPUTING (April 1987). Some software may come with the modem, but be sure this software will do what you want it to do. Examples of communication software include Crosstalk, Mite, and Smartcom.

The next question - Who to call? What kind of information can be found? The following numbers are 1-800 numbers to call to request pricing information or sign-up kits regarding the service.

Paul Andereck states in GENEALOGICAL COMPUTING (April, May, June 1987): "One instance of direct-search capability's arrival can be seen in the recent announcement of Accelerated Indexing Systems International (R). A.I.S.I. is going to be making its 50 million name database available to genealogists throughout the U.S. by use of the telephone lines and a computer."

In the above issue, there is an ad for GENie (General Electric Network for Information Exchange) which is a genealogy Round Table. This ad stresses an Electronic Bulletin Board. If you dial (703) 978-2726 (a VA number), you can be reading and writing messages on the National Genealogical Society Computer Interest Group's own electronic bulletin board. Seven days a week, twenty four hours a day, the dedicated phonenumber and computer are available to all callers.

Modems used for genealogical purposes should be utilized as just another tool for the researcher. And my last word is - REMEMBER when you buy anything connected in any way with a computer, BE SURE IT IS COMPATIBLE!

BOOK REVIEW

Gettys Family in America, Sketches of History Local, Genealogical and Biographical. McClellandtown, Waynesburg, Pa. - Mansfield, Ohio; Huntington, Hartford City, Ind. - Newman, Ill; Newtown, Iowa; Norton, Gettysburg, Phillipsburg, Kansas. By Robert C. Gettys. (1986. Pp. 163. Soft cover). No ordering information.

" . . . brewed in Scotland, bottled in Ireland, and uncorked in America. . . . Scotland was the seed-bed, the hills and valleys of Ulster the hardening-ground, and America the field of transplanting." The author describes the circumstances surrounding the emigration and immigration of the Getty(s) (Scottish - Dalgetty/Dalgaty/Delgettie/Dalgathyn/Dalgitie) (Gaelic - Mageitigh, pronounced "Mahgette") Gettie, Geatty, Gaty, Gette, Gaddy, Geddes, Gede, Gaddes, Gettey, as he brings eight generations from Ireland to the American mid-west.

The book's narrative is choppy, but it contains: 33 photographs; a 24 page Appendix A with family charts, however, the numbering system is incomplete; a 14 page Appendix B that contains background, origins, and historical outlines of The Getty of Scotland and Ireland; a 10 page Appendix C that gives troop movements, battle information of the Fayette County Militia on the Ohio Frontier, War of 1812; and, 17 pages of notes including facsimiles of discharge papers, affidavits, and church records. Throughout the book, there are good illustrations, and a 13 page name index with places attached to the names. The author cites some of his sources.

If you have an Ulster Scot among your ancestors, and want to discover their stimulus for immigrating, their general background and nature, then this book may answer some of those questions for you.

Chaff in the Wind. By Edna Walker Chandler.

An enjoyable story about a Kansas pioneer family who helped to bring into being the great American wheat empire. J. P. Johnson, the principal character in the book, is given his Swedish name, Hलगren, by the author, who is a granddaughter known as Sara in the book.

At the encouragement of railroad land salesmen back East, the Hलगrens moved to western Kansas in 1888 near Sharon Springs, in Wallace County, about sixty miles south of Goodland. They just barely existed for about ten years on this then non-productive farm, living in a little sod house, and then moved to a farm in Valley Center township in southeast Pawnee County in central Kansas.

Here they prospered on their new farm land which produced bumper wheat crops so that John Halgren, the Swede, who had been near starvation only two years previously, became the master of three quarters of the best wheat land in Pawnee County.

The acquiring of more land became almost an obsession, but the importance of home, school, and church were not neglected, and a wholesome community spirit prevailed as the family grew to maturity through a number of interesting events. In recognition of his contribution to the building fund in 1916, a window in the sanctuary of the Hyde Park United Methodist Church, then known as the First United Brethern Church, 228 Ellis, Wichita, KS, bears the name of J. P. Johnson.

The book, Chaff in the Wind, with genealogical information on the fly sheet at the front and the above review is a gift from Jack and Margaret Prather, Wichita. The information and knowledge of the book came about in their efforts to compile their church's anniversary book of a year or so ago which is in the MHGS Library (N.H. 41).

The episodes related in this book could very well parallel the frontier problems of your pioneer farm families. Reading the book is like eating a good farm meal--topped off with apple pie. You feel full.

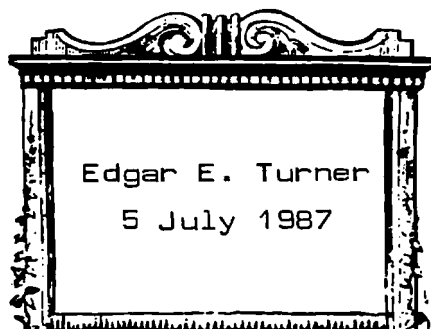

KS VITAL RECORDS TO 1911 OPENED

Thanks to a bill recently passed by the 1987 Kansas legislature, vital statistic records prior to 1 July 1911 are now open for any person to examine. These records are held by city clerks, county clerks, other local officials, and the Archives Department, Kansas State Historical Society. Prior to the passage of the bill, some local officials allowed access to the birth, death and marriage records, while others did not.

After 1911, access to the vital statistic records remains restricted. Copies of birth and death certificates following this date are obtained from the Kansas Department of Health and Environment.

PUBLICATION GUIDELINES

Each quarter of the year, the MHGS publishes forty eight pages of material in the MHGS REGISTER. The forty eight page limit is a budgeted printing cost. Guidelines for published records are: first, coverage of Sedgwick County; second, counties surrounding Sedgwick; and, third, the state of Kansas. With the exception of general research items, articles submitted for publication need to have a connection with Kansas.

Members of MHGS, and non members, are encouraged to submit items for publication. These can include articles, research, family stories, family records, Bible records, obits, in fact, anything of genealogical or historical interest, with a Kansas connection. If you have material you believe would interest our members, or help them in their research, please submit it for publication. We do like to help each other as much as we can.

ARCHAEOLOGY AND GENEALOGY

Archaeology provides both an understanding of the history of an area as well as finding, perhaps, a missing person. Take for example, Wolstenholme Towne, part of Martin's Hundred plantation below Carter's Grove Plantation in Virginia. Ivor Noël Hume, archaeologist for the Colonial Williamsburg Foundation, discovered Wolstenholem Towne, inhabited by early Virginians from about 1619 until the Indian massacre 22 March 1622, and excavated the site.

Several hundred yards east of the settlement was a small house, at first called the "suburb," or "Granny's homestead," but later ascertained to be the initial settlement of the area. "Granny" was a middle-aged woman scalped by Indians. Her skeleton was found in a trash pit, leading to the assumption she was probably a servant despite an elaborate wire hairpiece on her head.

Not so, said Ethel S. Rae, retired Colonial Williamsburg Foundation research archivist. According to her research, Granny was Thomasine Boys/Boise Johnson, mother of Thomas Boise and relative of John Boys who was named warden of Martin's Hundred, a vivacious lady who disappeared into history (See Virginia Genealogical Society NEWSLETTER, XII:4, XIII:3).

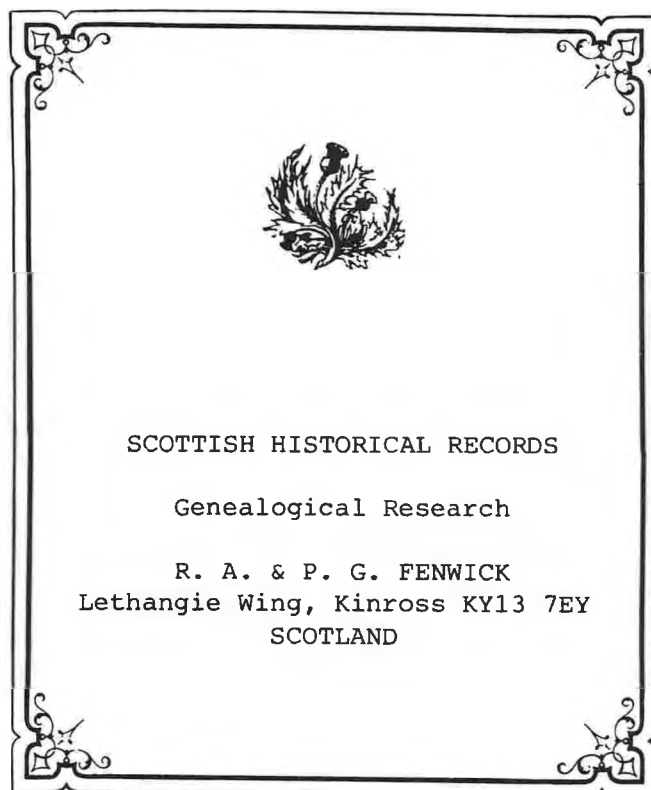
As another example, a year ago Michael Gramly, head of the archeological team of the Buffalo Museum of Science, announced finding the remains of two American Revolutionary War solders in the ruins of Fort Laurens, in eastern Ohio south of Canton, where they were sent to block the British stationed at Detroit. As many as seventeen more bodies, apparently killed by Delaware Indians who were armed by the British, were expected to be found among the ruins. Are you missing a RW ancestor?
