Dear Members,

The new Board met in April and all offices were filled with the appointments of Katherine Tompkins to the office of Recording Secretary and Annie Merriam to Parliamentarian.

Here is a brief rundown on the some of the highlights from the annual reports:

Librarian Jerry Stout reported that during the past fiscal year, the library had added approximately 600 books and quarterlies. Receipts in the library totaled \$3,018.55 with expenditures totaling \$2,434.16. (Does not include utilities.)

Pauline Jopling reported for Membership that MHGS membership for 1988-1989 totaled 674 which included 89 new members, 14 reinstated, and 571 renewals. Six lifetime members were added as well.

Sharon Huffman, Treasurer, reported that as of March 31, 1989, the Society had total assets of \$179,273.96, liabilities of \$14,500.00 and net worth of \$164,773.96.

And of course the work of Don Martinson, Building and Grounds, speaks for itself.

I feel sure that all members join with me in a heartfelt vote of thanks to Past President Pauline Richardson, the Past Board Members and the many volunteers for a job well done.

HOME AT LAST!

he dream of the MHGS library began almost with the formation of the Society in 1966. Shortly after organizing, the charter members began planning to someday have a permanent home the MHGS could call its own.

The Society met, in the early years, in various members' homes and in the basement of the church on South Hillside. Then about ten years ago a building fund was started and a building committee was formed to seriously begin looking for a building.

The committee looked at the Black Masonic Lodge building, an empty fire station, and several houses. They also sought grants from various foundations, and Federal money from Community Development Block Grants without success.

Early in 1985, the Society learned of the possible availability of an old two story house at 1005 North Water. The house was on Urban Renewal land purchased by the city several years earlier.

The land was being traded to the Wichita School Board, so the house would either have to be moved or demolished. The City of Wichita had to decide whether to tear the house down at a cost of around \$3,000, or find a buyer who would be willing to pay to have it moved.

everal people looked at the house and determined it to be structurally sound and able to withstand a move. The City agreed to sell the house for \$1.00 if the Society would clean up the lot after the move. The City was also willing to deal on a piece of Urban Renewal land two blocks to the north along the railroad tracks, so the move would be a short distance. Cost of moving the house was about \$9,500 and the new basement foundation would be an additional \$10,000.

Armed with this information, a special meeting of the membership of MHGS was called in May of 1985. The plan was presented to the group with the suggestion that with a lot

of volunteer help by members, MHGS could convert the old house into a real library of its own. The members voted to support the plan and negotiations were started with the City.

On the strength of verbal promises from the City personnel, members began cleaning up the lot and preparing the house to be moved. Preparation required undergirding it with new 2 x 10 floor joists on 16" centers in addition to the old 2 x 6 joists that were on 24" centers. It also meant cleaning out literally tons of debris and old lath and plaster from the interior. Although the house had been "vacant" for about 10 years, it had actually been a temporary home to many transients over the years. Only those who participated in the clean up can appreciate the amount of work to remove the filth.





n August of 1985, MHGS was given a bill of sale for the house for \$1 and a deed to the lot at 11th and Main for \$1. At that time, a contractor was hired to move the house, and another to start building the basement.

With only \$20,000 in the building fund and another \$10,000 that could be committed, fund raising activities were going full steam.

Moving day was November 1, 1985. It was an exciting daytime move up Main street in the wrong direction. The event had lots of media coverage and plenty of picture taking.

Wichita Business Directory: 1886-87, 1894, 1900


ichita, according to Polk's 1886-7 edition, was the judicial seat of Sedgwick County and a city of the first class with a population of 16,500. There were 9 public graded schools, a public library of 1,800 volumes, an opera house and churches of Baptist, Friends, Episcopal, United Presbyterian, Christian, Catholic, German Methodist and African denominations. Societies of Mason, Odd Fellows, and Knights of Honor were among the benevolent organizations.



Included in the business interests were 1 water and 44 steam flour mills, 5 elevators, 2 foundries and 6 banks. There were 8 hotels listed of which the Occidental was the best and one of the largest in southern Kansas. There was a board of trade, street railway, telephone exchange, gas and water works and U.S. land office. Five newspapers were published: The Beacon and Eagle daily and weekly; the Republican; Wichita Herold; and Arrow; all weeklies.

Postal Service, telegraph, Western Union Express; Adams, Wells, Fargo & Co.; and Pacific were available to the residents.

In the area of transportation, Wichita was a station on the central branch of the A.T. & S.F. Railroad, and at the crossing of the St.L. Ft.S. & W. R.R. Wichita was also the western terminus of the St.L. & S.F. Ry and the eastern terminus of the W. & W. R.R. Stages with mail went to Hutchinson, Castleton, and Burdenville triweekly and to Ruby, Peotone, and Harper semiweekly.



By 1894, Wichita had become one of the largest cities in the state with an estimated population of 30,000. There were electric lights and electric street railways. The city had a complete system of drainage and was said to be one of the healthiest in the state. Newspaper publishing had increased to 8 dailies, 9 weeklies and 2 monthlies. Included among the business interests were car works, foundries, machine shops, factories, planing mills, grain elevators and flouring mills. Railway systems radiated in all directions.

Six years later, in 1900, Wichita had become the largest wholesale center in the state with \$300,000 spent in 1899 on buildings for wholesale concerns. Wichita was also the central depot of all large implement manufacturing concerns, the distribution point for the furniture trade, and the central station for the interurban telephones of southern Kansas and Oklahoma.

Today, there are only 4 banks serving the city. Published newspapers number 2 daily, 11 weekly and 5 monthly.



his microfiche contains an inventory of birth, marriage and death records from 188 communities in Massachusettes.

Years and titles of the existing records are listed under a heading of the community from which the records came.

Most of the records have been put on microfiche by the Hol-brook Research Institute and are available through their office. The microfiche numbers are published along side the title of the record. In addition, Mr. Holbrook has listed where records are to be found for any community that has not yet had their records microfilmed.

The fiche appears to be well planned, with all inventoried communities indexed. If the community has had a name change, it is cross indexed under both names.

Inventoried and filmed records include births from as early as 1630 in Boston and 1620 in Provinceton. Records for some towns are as recent as 1987.

This is an ongoing project of the Holbrook Institute. There are approximately 375 communities in MA and others are to be added as time permits. As it is now, the bibliography is a helpful and easy to follow guide to available records in those 188 Massachusettes communities. When completed, the project promises to be an invaluable tool for the Massachusettes researcher.





i seat myself this morning in order to let you no that we are all well at this time an have bin ever since we came to this conrary we received your letter date ed feb 4. 18.69 we ware glad to hear from you onst more an glad to hear of you well soing we are proud to hear Nancy an Elisabeth has profest religion girls i want you to prove faithful an hold out to the end an when it goes well with you pray for me so that it we never more see each other in this warld that we will meat in heaven a bove whare trubels will be over. glad would i be to see you all i think of you ever hour in the day the last thing at night an the first thing in the morning but these things has so to be now for a while but i hope it wont be so all ways i want you to do the best you can an when the rite times coms for a poor man to get land i will let you now the time is Just past for a man to get land scheap land is high an will be on til the in den land coms in mar ket James it is the pretist an best land in the world the health cant be cir past the water is fine an pure i have bin som fifty miles i see fine springs pretty creaks an branches som fine skirts of timber an milions of acors of land nise an rich as a manure pile James there ant one acor in East tennissee half as rich James it is really be yout exprexion an i do no if you was out hear that you wouldent be back in East tennisee if they would give you all the land on mulbury we have the finest market in the world all things in good demand cash in hand you can get all you want in the store with such things that you cant hardly sell in there at an my prise you can get your shogar an coffee an anny thing you want under the sun with your produse such as potatoes corn wheat butter Eggs or an ny thing groes in the ground potatoes is al ways worth from 75 to one dollar per bushel an corn the same butter has bin 50 cts ever since i came hear Eggs the year round 25 they have bin all winter from 35 to 50 cts James if you an Nancy ws out hear an you had 50 Shang hi hens you would make more mony than you can farming in there it is tru i hant maid annything since we bin out hear all thoe we have all bin at work we havent but cleared grub but you bet i am trying now to so som thing for John an oald Catharin an Marth i am clean ing up twelve acor of New ground as rich as a manure pile it ant hard to clear it has bin choped of some years ago an the neighbors all tell me it will be good for 75 to one hundre bushels per acor i aim to put 8 in Corn an 4 in potatoes an it will bring from 4 to 5 hundred busels per acor i got one dollar an twenty five cts for all the cord wood i put up in my clearing i am going to move in a weak in two hundrd yards of my clearing i will be in one hundred yards of a fine mill in 2 miles of Wyan dotte North west in the Caw river Bottom between the two rail roads in a half mile church James if you was out hear you could get one dollar an 50 cts per day the year round two in spring season an summer i now Will bring my letter to a close i hope these few lines will find you all well an doing well it leaves all well No more at preasant only Remain your affect father an Mother ontil Death

fter the move, MHGS continued with the basics -- putting on a new roof for \$4,200, extending the sewer line across the street at a cost of \$10,200, and replumbing the house and connecting it to the water line. The lower level was wired and hooked up to the electrical service.

The children of Charter Members David and Louise Brehm learned about the library and asked if they could pay for finishing the basement as a memorial to their parents, (many of those early meetings were held in the Brehm's basement). They pledged enough money for the project and hired their cousin Kevin Callender, a finish carpenter, to do the work. Furring strips and sheetrock went up quickly to make ready for Kevin and his crew. Their work included the addition of wood

paneling, bookcases along the walls and movable bookcases and study carrells. A picture of David and Louise Brehm hangs on the south wall of the lower level.

uring the negotiations and work on the house, the library had been operating out of two buildings in the Old Cowtown Historical Museum. In July of 1986, the lease expired and could not be renewed. All of the books and equipment had to be placed in storage. By November, the lower level was granted a partial occupancy permit by the City and everything was moved into the lower level. One year to the day of the move, MHGS was operating out of its new library.

In the 2+ years since opening, the Society's Building and Grounds committee and numerous volunteers have completely rewired the 1st and 2nd floors, rebuilt stairs to the 2nd floor and attic, built an access ramp for the handicapped, and poured sidewalks and a large parking lot.

Interior finish work has included the completion of two restroom facilities; the Librarian's office, Ways and Means office, and an office for MHGS Publications on the 2nd floor. At the time of this writing, the ceiling and walls of the front entry are nearing completion, as are the 1st floor stackroom bookshelves. Antique light fixtures have recently been added to the 1st floor reading room.

Seeing is believing, so come by and take a look for yourself.




