Morris Pedigree Chart

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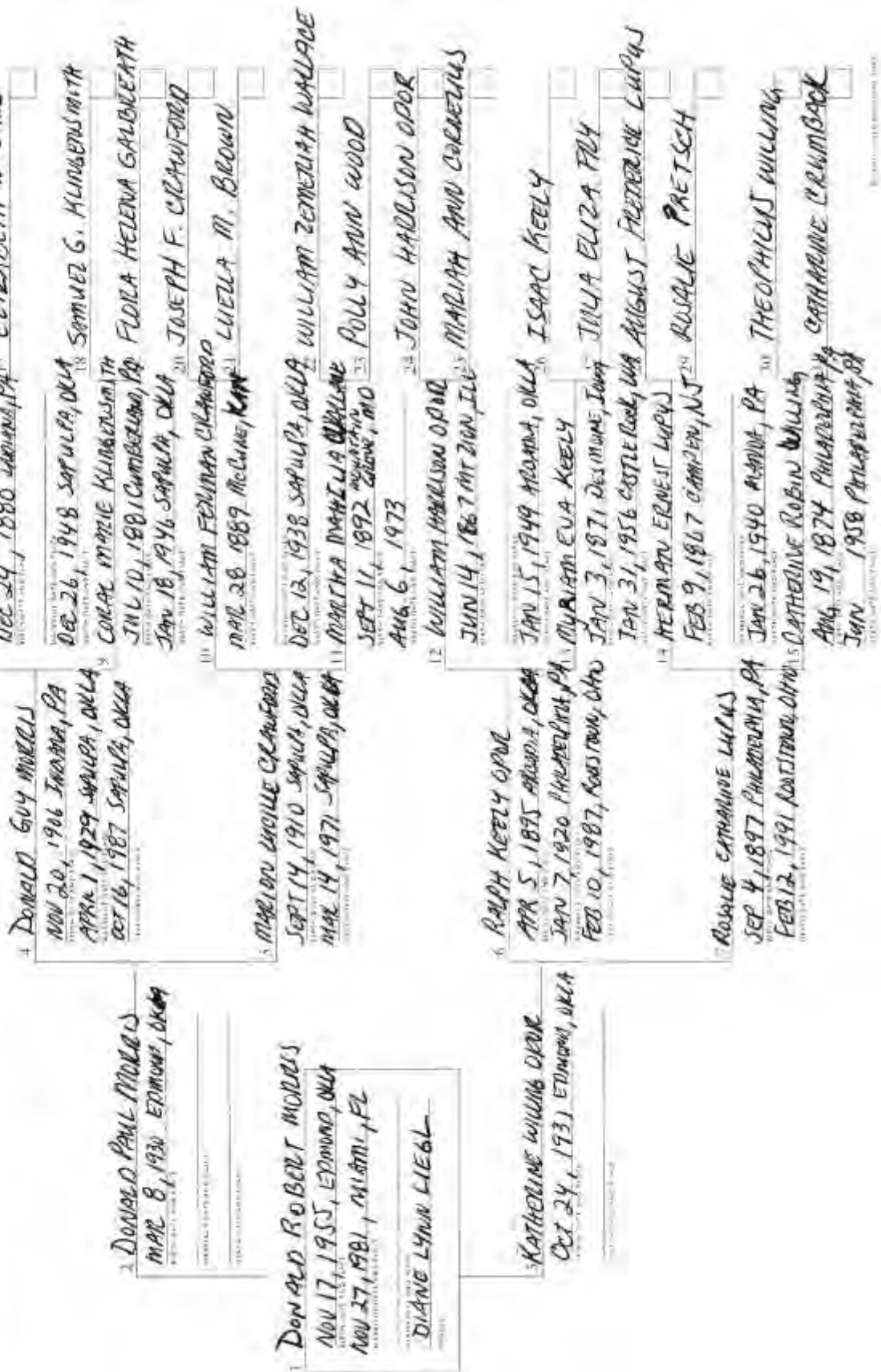
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Five-Generation Ancestor Chart

The Walsh Family: 108 Years of Educational Service

...and still giving to Kansas

Part One: 1907-1940

In 1907, Barber County, Kansas, was a sparsely populated and obscure corner of the world.¹ And yet it was here, and in that year, that the course of education was changed. In that year a young couple by the name of Walsh left their home state of Tennessee to settle in Barber County, Kansas.

Remarkably, a poem brought them to Kansas. James Martyn Walsh had entered a national poetry contest. His winning poem, "I Celebrate the Man Who Fails," attracted a member of the Kansas board of education. Admiring this celebration of quiet, private persistence over noisy, public triumph, he wrote to Martyn. Would Martyn and Anna come to teach Kansas children? They would and they did.

Over a century has passed since that day. But the gifts of this family -- J. Martyn Walsh, his wife Anna Elizabeth Smith, and their daughter Anna Kathleen Walsh - reach into the years still ahead.

Quality in the Classroom

In early day Kansas, school teachers were expected to be (and to remain) unmarried. It is very unusual, then, that Martyn and Anna Walsh were both welcomed as Barber County teachers. But while the marital standard might be waived, they were expected to meet the rigorous academic standards of Kansas. And their baccalaureate degrees and Tennessee teaching experience did not exempt them from the certification process.

Kansas teachers were required to sit for qualifying examinations in 15 subject areas. To receive the teaching credential, they needed a minimum score of 75 percent in every subject and an overall score of 90 percent or better. Thus, in 1911, when Martyn was credentialed in Medicine Lodge, he had achieved superior scores in orthography, reading, writing, English grammar, geography, arithmetic, U.S. history, Kansas history, civil government, physiology & hygiene, elements of agriculture, principles and methods of teaching, English literature, algebra, and modern history.

Challenges at Home

While busy with teaching and qualifying examinations, the Walshes also faced the daily challenges of rural life. Their daughter, Kathleen, was born just a few months after they arrived in Kansas. As a young family, they were not offered in-home boarding arrangements that were available to unmarried teachers. Instead, the Walsh family found a small farm house near Lake City, affordable but some distance from the school. Soon, however, their horse died and they could no longer make the daily "commute" into town. The problem was solved when Anna Walsh offered to play the piano for Sunday services and choir practice, in exchange for living quarters in the basement of a Lake City

church. That problem solved, Anna engaged a loving child-minder² near the school, enabling her to slip across the street to nurse her baby between periods of teaching Latin.

Climbing the Ladder as Rural Educators

The Walsh family would remain in Barber County for over a decade and, as daughter Kathleen started her own schooling, her parents accepted ever-increasing professional responsibilities. In 1918, 41-year old Martyn registered for the World War I draft and simultaneously accepted appointment as Superintendent of Schools at Hardtner. Two years later, while Martyn held the superintendent's position, Anna became Principal of the high school and Kathleen enrolled as a high school freshman.

Reaching Beyond Their Remote Home

Never content to pedal in place, Martyn and Anna sought opportunities for professional growth. In 1919, Martyn contacted Fairmount College in Wichita, seeking graduate coursework. He was invited to enroll in the 3-credit *History of Education* and the 3-credit *School Administration* courses, for a total tuition fee of \$12.00. The registrar advised, however, that he should expect the additional expense of two textbooks, at \$2.00 apiece!³

Meanwhile, Martyn Walsh continued to write poetry. In this era of popular sheet music, his poems were often published as song lyrics. Among his published and copyrighted lyrics many now seem highly sentimental: *Home Memories*; *Good Bye*; *God Bless You, Dear*; *The Sunshine Came With You*; *Roses Still Whisper of You*; *Sweetheart Land*; *The Slipper That My Mother Wore*; *Ship O'Dreams*; *Please, Mister Birdman*; *Waiting for You*; *Until You Came*.

He honored his original home with *When There's Moonlight on the Hills of Tennessee*, and his adopted home in *When the Plains of Sunny Kansas Stretch Away*. A good many of his songs were written for children and high school choral groups: *Sleepy Rip*; *Mah Honey Dew*; *When Teacher Stays Out Late at Night*. And, finally, his work included a number of sacred compositions: *Master I Would Follow Thee*; *Peace, Be Still*; and *Gethsemane*.

Together, some 25 of his song lyrics, written from his rural Kansas home, were published in New York, Philadelphia, Chicago, and Los Angeles, as well as in Great Britain.

A 60-Mile Move

After more than a dozen happy years in Barber County, the Walsh family relocated to Reno County. Here they again became important figures in the school systems and communities of Turon and Haven. It was at Turon, in February 1924, that they helped to host a banquet honoring local resident Vada Watson, the Kansas Wheat Queen. The occasion was to welcome Vada home from her trip to Washington DC where she had presented a bag of Kansas wheat to President Calvin Coolidge.

Both Martyn and Anna continued to teach and, in 1928, Martyn coached the Haven debate team to the Kansas State Championship.

A Third Family Member Takes Wing

The family celebrated daughter Kathleen's graduation with the Turon class of 1924 and saw her off to Fairmount College in Wichita. As an incoming freshman, Kathleen found herself in the midst of a political campaign, seeking to transfer Fairmount College to the City of Wichita. She enthusiastically gathered an armload of brochures and began canvassing door-to-door for voter support.

In ways much like modern day debates, Wichita tax-payers worried about costs; public school administrators feared budget cuts; some argued that higher education was just too “elite” for Wichita to support. As a result, the 1925 vote failed.

Seven decades later, Kathleen described the moment - and revealed her own character - to a Wichita State University audience: “When the proposal failed, we just rolled up our sleeves and did it all over again. It passed the second time and, in the spring of 1928, I proudly graduated from the Municipal University of Wichita.”⁴

With diploma in hand, Kathleen embraced the family commitment to teaching rural students. For the next decade she taught English in small Kansas communities, two years at Sterling, followed by eight years at Hutchinson.

New Career Paths for the Family

While Kathleen carried forward the Walsh tradition, her parents entered an entirely new phase of their lives, leaving the rural classroom and purchasing a city home just south of the University of Wichita.⁵ Anna continued her teaching career as a substitute in the Wichita schools. Martyn began teaching at the University while completing his graduate degree. And, for the first time, he reported a new occupation to census-takers: instead of “Teacher,” he had become an “Author.”

Although already a published poet and song lyricist, Martyn now wrote a volume of student and teacher aids called *English Essentials: Objective Tests in English Grammar and Composition, English Literature, and the Classics*. By 1930, the book was in print; within a few years it was selling well. And Martyn, always intellectually active, was already considering a new project.

He began discussion with his daughter and they reached an agreement. A partnership, entitled ‘Walsh and Walsh,’ was formalized. And together they began their successful careers as a Father/Daughter writing team.

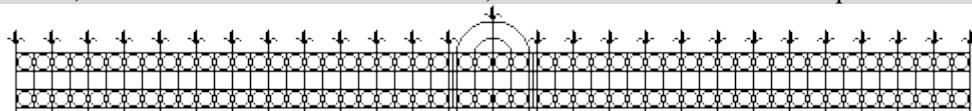

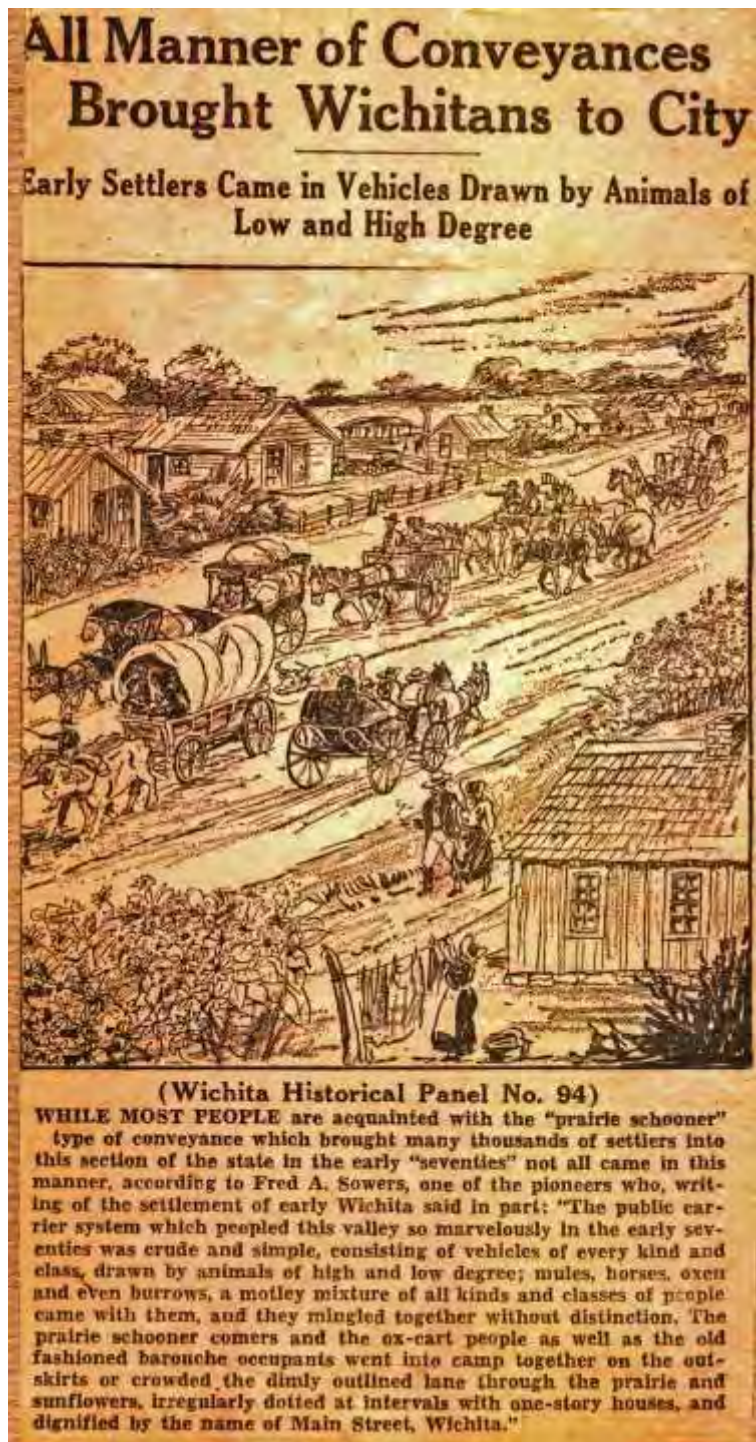

WICHITA'S first settlers, the Indians, did not have one type of lodge or tepee. Like present-day Wichita homes they had a variety of size range, exterior appearance, interior arrangement and were erected of various materials. The first Indians depended on Buffalo skin tepees, according to early trappers and traders. They were light and easily transported. During the "sixties" the present site of Wichita was the home of the Wichita Indians from Texas, driven out by Confederate soldiers. Here they erected pole and grass tepees, a more permanent form of habitation. Many of these lodges remained when the white settlers arrived. They were deserted at that time as a cholera epidemic had killed many of the occupants and the remainder had left for their old homes.
