# LABOR DAY – A BRIEF LOOK BACK IN HISTORY



The celebration of Labor Day was initiated as a way to honor common American workers and labor unions. In the early 19<sup>th</sup> Century, many workers had jobs which required them to work every day of the week.

Thanks to labor unions which pushed employers hard to establish a regular work week and employee benefits.

The first unofficial Labor Day took place in New York City on September 5, 1882. By June 28, 1894, Labor Day became an official American holiday to be celebrated on the first Monday in September of each year.

According to *History.com*, President Grover Cleveland officially declared Labor Day a national holiday. While many cities had parades in honor of workers and their various trades, others continued to advocate for workers' rights. The Pullman Strike of 1894, marked one such fight when workers boycotted the railroads to fight for safe conditions, normal work schedules and living wages. Today many Americans look forward to an extra day off from work to enjoy family and friends with barbeque get-togethers. It's also seen as an official end to summer and the start of a new football season.

We are looking for a Board Secretary, Treasurer and a social media coordinator.


