HISTORY of XI DELTA PI SORORITY

Though the Xi Delta Pi Social Sorority had its founding in the second month of 1932 when La Verne Stephenson Everett entertained a group of girls at bridge, the Kansas State Charter Board did not issue the charter until one year later on the 6th of February, 1933. The following names were affixed to the 50-year charter:

During the past thirteen years, we have established two chapters, composed a constitution and by-laws, chosen a crest and selected an emblem symbolic of the sorority to which we have pledged our loyalty and honor, formed an inter-chapter council for the combined interests of all chapters, selected songs and rituals, and have outlined a definite program of achievement for the coming years.

Past presidents of the organization include, in the order of their presidency, La Verne Stephenson Everett, Mary Lou Fryer, Juanita Peterson Messick. Alpha: Lynne Carlson Kirkwood, Mary Helen Garrison Jarrell, Betty Peterson Burnett, Mary Dill Wilkeson, Marian Watson and Mildred Dobson. Beta: Ina Carlson Frymire, Marguerite Schrenk McMahon, Evelyn McClure, Shirley Tilford, Berniece Cheatham, Leona Toot, Laura Miller, and Nora Krehbiel.

CONSTITUTION of XI DELTA PI SORORITY

ARTICLE I—Name.

Section 1. The name of this organization shall be the Xi Delta Pi Sorority.

ARTICLE II—Purpose.

Section 1. The purpose of this organization shall be to promote friendship and good will among the members.

ARTICLE III—Membership.

Section 1. Bids for membership shall be issued to only those girls who have been selected by a vote of the active members. Two opposing votes are necessary to prevent the issuance of a bid.

ARTICLE IV—Officers.

Section 1. The officers of this Sorority shall consist of a president, vice-president, secretary, treasurer, and a member of the inter-chapter council.

Section 2. Officers shall be elected from those who have been officially recognized by formal initiation.

Section 3. Officers shall be elected by active members of the Sorority and shall hold office for one year.

Section 4. The president and one person so-elected shall be members of the inter-chapter council which shall have charge of all matters pertaining to the Sorority as a whole.

Section 5. The active past presidents shall automatically become inter-chapter council members at the termination of their presidency with the privilege of tendering their resignation from the inter-chapter council.

ARTICLE V—Meetings and Quorum.

Section 1. Regular business meetings shall begin with the second meeting day in September and close with the election of officers in May. Summer meetings shall be optional with the membership of respective chapters.

Section 2. The time set for regular business meetings shall be that best suited to the needs of each individual chapter with a minimum of one business meeting each month.

Section 3. Special meetings may be called by the president or on application of at least five members; the president shall call such meeting.

Section 4. Any number of members over one-half of the active membership in the chapter shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

Section 5. To transact joint chapter business, a quorum of each chapter must be present, and a two-thirds vote of those present shall be necessary to carry any motion.

ARTICLE VI—Songs and Devotional.

Section 1. The songs, "Star of Our Loyalty," "Xi Delta Pi, Hail to Thee," and "Xi Delta Pi Hymn" by Marguerite Schrenk McMahon shall be the official songs of the Xi Delta Pi Social Sorority.

Section 2. The Sorority prayer as written by Ina Carlson Frymire and Thelma Lee Davis shall be a part of the devotional at each meeting.

BY-LAWS

ARTICLE I—Duties of Officers.

Section 1. The duty of the president shall be to preside at all meetings of the Sorority, to appoint committees, and to perform all the duties usually pertaining to her office.

Section 2. In the absence or disability of the president, the vice-president shall perform all duties of the president. The vice-president shall also have charge of newspaper publicity and the scrap book.

Section 3. The secretary shall keep the minutes of all proceedings and record the same. She shall give notice of all meetings.

Section 4. The treasurer shall receive and safely keep all funds of the organization and shall pay out the same only on the order of the president, who is subject to the wishes of the members. She shall make a monthly written report of receipts and disbursements.

Section 5. Duties of the inter-chapter council representatives shall include those of: Presiding in alternation over the inter-chapter council meetings, contacting new members, keeping history cards of all members, arranging calendars, black-ball list, compiling of the year book, making a regular review of the Constitution, reporting on meetings held by the council and any other duties so imposed by the membership of the sorority.

ARTICLE II—Election of Officers.

Section 1. Officers shall be nominated by a nominating committee consisting of three members of the Sorority elected at the last meeting in April. The candidates shall be announced by the nominating committee at the second meeting in May. The names submitted by the committee shall be voted upon by the members in secret ballot. A majority vote of all members shall be necessary for election to office.

Section 2. Officers shall be elected at the last meeting in May and shall be installed at the first September meeting.

Section 3. No person may serve in the same office more than two terms in succession.

Section 4. To fill an unexpired term in any office, an election shall be held, requiring a majority vote of the membership, a quorum being present. The oath of office shall be administered.

ARTICLE III—Membership.

Section 1. All active and associate members shall be permitted to invite guests to all rush parties, the number of guests to be invited to each party to be determined by the members.

Section 2. Before a girl can be elected to membership in the Sorority, she must first serve a period of pledgeship—this period to continue for four months from the date of pledge service. At the end of that period, she is either accepted or rejected for membership in the Sorority. Two opposing votes are necessary to disqualify her for membership. Each candidate for membership shall be required to pass the Xi Delta Pi "Examination for Active Membership" before becoming actively affiliated with the sorority.

Section 3. Resignation from membership shall be in writing and no resignation shall be accepted from a member not in good and regular standing.

Section 4. The term honorary member shall include any past president or charter member who has left the sorority in good standing. An honorary member shall be entitled to attend social functions of the sorority as a guest of the active membership. She shall not be required to pay a reinstatement fee when becoming an active member. The name of any honorary member who joins another local sorority shall be dropped from the list of honorary members.

Section 5. The term associate member shall include any member who has left the sorority in good standing, but who wishes to retain an associate membership. An associate member shall be required to pay her dues six months in advance; she shall receive all bulletins and invitations of her respective chapter and pay her share of the assessment of social affairs she attends.

Section 6. The term inactive member shall include any member who has resigned from the sorority in good standing. Each time she rejoins the sorority and becomes an active member, she shall be required to pay a reinstatement fee of \$2.50.

Section 7. Change of status of membership shall be in writing and effective as of date of letter from the member.

Section 8. Only active members are entitled to a vote.

ARTICLE IV—Dues.

Section 1. Pledge fee shall be \$5.00, to be paid at Pledge Service.

Section 2. Initiation fee shall be \$5.00, to be paid at Formal Initiation.

Section 3. Active dues shall be \$6.00 annually, payable 50c per month.

Section 4. Associate dues shall be \$3.00 annually, to be paid 6 months in advance.

Section 5. Any member three months in arrears in payment of dues shall be automatically dropped from the sorority.

ARTICLE V—Meetings.

Section 1. A member shall be allowed one unexcused absence every four meetings, but shall be fined 50c for such unexcused absence. The president and secretary together shall determine whether or not a reason for absence is excusable.

Section 2. Three consecutive excused absences shall count as one unexcused absence.

Section 3. Any member absent for three consecutive meetings without excuse shall be automatically dropped from the list of members.

Section 4. The president or the secretary of the chapter must be notified of the absence before meeting if the absence is to be excused.

Section 5. If it is found at any time that a member has given a false excuse for absence that member shall be immediately dropped from the rolls of the sorority.

ARTICLE VI—Committees.

Section 1. The president shall be empowered to appoint such special committees as she deems needful at any time, or on vote of members at any meeting shall appoint committees they suggest. The president shall be ex-officio member of all committees.

ARTICLE VII—Amendments.

Section 1. These By-Laws may be amended at any meeting by a two-thirds vote—a quorum of each chapter being present.

ARTICLE VIII—Parliamentary Authority.

Section 1. "Roberts' Rules of Order" shall be the parliamentary authority on all matters not covered by the Constitution and By-Laws of this organization.

ARTICLE IX—Suspension of By-Laws.

Section 1. In case of emergency, By-Laws may be suspended by unanimous vote of those present at the meeting, if a quorum of all chapters is present.

ARTICLE X—Black-Ball.

Section 1. Any person who has been black-balled by this organization shall not be permitted to attend any of its private functions.

Section 2. Charges upon which a person may be black-balled are misconduct, delinquent dues, or any specific charge which, in the opinion of the Inter-Chapter Council, would constitute a black-ball.

Section 3. Any chapter may submit to the inter-chapter council the name of a person for black-ball, said name to be voted upon by secret ballot at the following inter-chapter council meeting; there must be a minimum of two members of each chapter present, and a majority vote shall be required.

ARTICLE XI—New Chapters.

Section 1. If and when a Gamma Chapter is formed, each active chapter shall contribute \$10.00 per chapter, and the charter members of the Gamma Chapter shall be allowed \$2.50 per person from their respective chapters toward the forming of a treasury for the Gamma Chapter.

Section 2. The forming of a Gamma Chapter is subject to the approval of the inter-chapter council.

ARTICLE XII—Officers' Meetings.

Section 1. Joint Officers' Meetings shall be held when necessary at the convenience of the officers of all chapters.

SPECIAL NOTICES

Tea and Coffee Services may be used free by members only, or they may be rented to non-members for a fee of \$4.00, to be returned in three days. Inactive Member in good standing may rent same for a fee of \$1.00. Rental Fee is to be divided equally between chapters. Individual who uses any part or all of services should see that they are cleaned before they are returned.

Sorority Members are to pay for the following, whether present or not:

Rush Tea and all Rush Affairs.
Founder's Day.

Rush Tea—Corsages for guests shall be paid for by their respective chapters, other expenses will be pro-rated on active membership of each chapter.

Fall Dance—Pro-rated on active membership of each chapter, pledges not included, whether members are present or not.

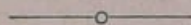
Christmas Dance—Pro-rated on active membership and pledges of each chapter.

Christmas Party—Each chapter shall alternately be hostess but the expense shall be pro-rated on active membership and pledges of each chapter.

Founder's Day—Pro-rated on active members and guests present.

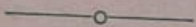
