

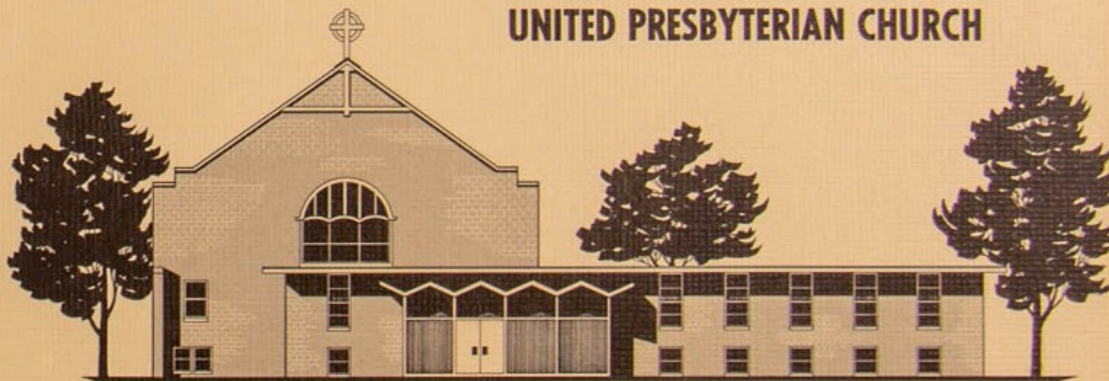

PASTOR'S REPORT 1974

During 1974 I completed my eighth year as pastor of Calvary United Presbyterian church. I believe that God has saved me through the grace given in Jesus Christ and that He has called me to serve as a pastor and minister of the Gospel. I also believe that He has called me to be a fellow-worker with all of you in the mission He has given to this particular congregation. The Apostle Paul said to the Christians in Rome, "First, I thank my God through Jesus Christ for you all, that your faith is spoken throughout the whole world." I do thank God for the faith of each one of you and pray that God will lead us to new and renewed paths of service to Him.

The primary task of the pastor is to teach the Word of God. The morning worship service each Lord's Day gives an opportunity to present some portion of Scripture, to expound its meaning and seek to apply it to our contemporary needs. Further teaching of the Word is done through the Sunday evening study, the mid-week prayer and Bible study hour, informal Bible study and counseling sessions with individuals, and the Bible Club. I spend most of each week-day morning preparing to do this teaching work. Incidentally, Bible Club is for grade school children and was held on each Wednesday evening during eight -week periods in the spring and fall.

Another large item in the work of a pastor is visiting with church members and new people. I find that most of my afternoons are occupied with calling on people in hospitals and care homes. At times there are as many as six or more people in local hospitals. One area where I feel more needs to be done is visitation of church members. A big obstacle here is finding the time when such visitation can take place. With the busy schedules we all follow, time that is appropriate for such visiting is difficult to arrange.

A third area in the work of the pastor is in the area of organization. The on-going program of the congregation is administered through the Session. The pastor is the moderator of the Session and responsible for endeavoring to get the Session to initiate and guide all the phases of the congregational activity. Also, as pastor in a Presbyterian church, I am a member of Presbytery and responsible to attend Presbytery meetings and assist with its work. Currently, I am serving on the Support Department in the Budget Committee of Presbytery.

This gives you some idea of how I spend my time. As I look at the congregation, I observe some stirrings of spiritual hunger for God's Word and Will. Several of the men have begun to meet weekly as "Fishermen" that together we can seek the Lord's guidance and help in becoming more effective witnesses for Him. Certain individuals within our congregation have a renewed spiritual interest and joy in the Lord. My prayer is, as we enter this new year, that the Holy Spirit will arouse new thirst for God and His Word. I also pray that the Lord will give us a new realization of what He wants us to be as a fellowship of believers. We seem pre-occupied with carrying-on the church and its organization. I think the Lord wants us to be a people who are willing to lose our life for His sake, intent upon Him and our love for Him.

REPORT OF THE SESSION FOR 1974

During the year 1974, the Session held eleven (11) regular meetings, ten (10) special meetings, participated in a joint meeting with the Board of Trustees, and held the Annual Congregational Meeting in January. In addition, there were two (2) special meetings of the Congregation plus the newly instituted November Congregational Meeting.

The Session took the following action relative to our church membership:

- A. No letters of transfer were requested.
- B. There were four (4) new members received on Confession of Faith.
- C. There were none (0) received by letter of transfer.
- D. There was one (1) new member received on Reaffirmation of Faith.
- E. There were none (0) removed from the church membership roll by annual audit.
- F. There were two (2) deaths.

There were four (4) adult baptisms and three (3) infant baptisms administered this year.

The Session approved the use of our church facilities by Child Evangelism Fellowship, Irving School PTA, one (1) anniversary reception, and two (2) wedding receptions.

At a special meeting of the Congregation on June 2, 1974; the Session requested and received authority to establish an "Organ Fund" to procure a new organ for our church sanctuary. Since that time, considerable activity has taken place on the part of the Session and its "Music Committee" in an effort to determine our requirements and the best possible way to meet our needs. At a recent meeting, the Session decided to purchase a new "Allen Organ", subject to the approval of the Congregation.

At a special meeting of the Congregation on October 27, 1974, Section 2 of the "Church By-Laws" was rewritten to change our time for holding congregational meetings. What had been known as the "Annual Congregational Meeting" (held in January) and its specified items of business were divided into two (2) meetings. One (1) meeting is to be held in November of each year for the purpose of electing church officers and another in January of each year to handle all other specified items of business.
