

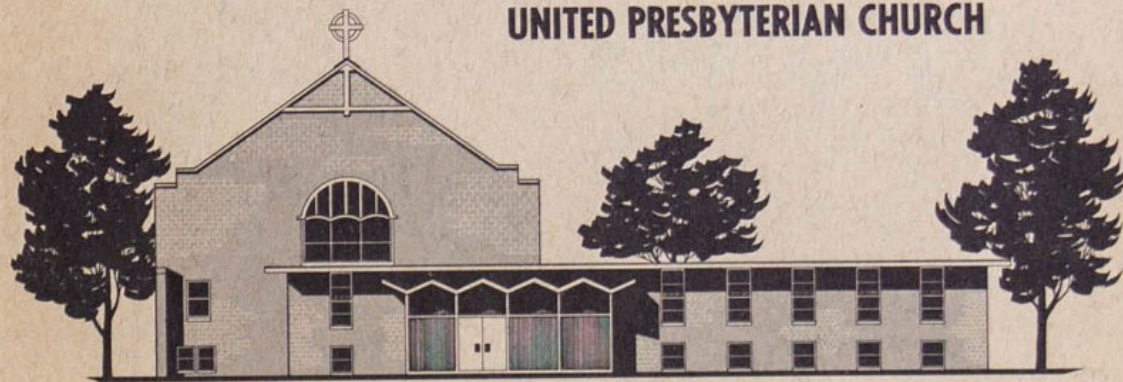

General Assembly, Synod, and Presbytery figures are reported as a self-allocation pledge of the congregation. The other figures are a goal which we hope to attain, and the budget gives approval of allocation of the funds in this way if received in the offering.

In a way, this has been a difficult year as Pastor of Calvary. I am thinking especially of the heartbreak and sadness, which has come our way as a Congregation through sickness and death. How good to know Christ and have Christian friends.

As a congregation, we have much for which we can thank our God. We have continued opportunity to worship together. Our people remain interested in various activities, although this interest varies and is weak in some areas, such as the Sunday School and the evening worship service. Attendance at the morning service has been fairly good. We have had good financial support. The leadership from the congregation has been carried on with harmony, although opinions have varied and have been discussed at length. This is as it should be.

Jesus said, "I will build my Church." (Matthew 16:18) Sometimes we feel, at least I do, that the things which happen are not building up but tearing down the Church. What we do not see plainly is that He is building the invisible or spiritual Church according to His wisdom and purpose. Since the Lord is the Builder of the Church, our question must be, how will He lead us? How will He build His Church in our midst? Personally, I feel that evangelism is the main challenge which confronts us. We must move ahead to reach the unsaved.

My main activities as Pastor continue to be: proclaiming the Word of God at morning and evening services on each Lord's day, conducting mid-week prayer services, visiting the sick in hospitals and in their homes, calling in homes of members when possible, and trying to help keep the organization of the church operating smoothly.

I continue to act as Police Chaplain. Once a month for a 24 hour period I am "on call" by the central police dispatcher for any need that seems to require a minister's attendance. Many of these 24-hour periods pass without a call, but occasionally there is an opportunity to help someone.

When we had Communion January 4, a new program of sharing the Lord's Supper with shut-ins of our congregation was started. From now on, when Communion is to be held at a morning service, members who are shut-in at the time will be invited to contact the church and ask that they have a share in the service. Then, in the afternoon after the Lord's Supper, some Elders and the Pastor will visit the home. Only members disabled so they cannot attend church will be able to partake at home. This plan was approved by the Session at its January meeting.

It is a privilege to be your Pastor and I pray that the Lord will enable us - you and me - to do His work. Above all, may there be evidence that He is working among us!



## REPORT OF THE SESSION FOR 1969

During the year 1969 the Session held eleven (11) regular meetings, nine (9) special meetings, participated in two (2) joint meetings with the Board of Trustees, held the Annual Congregational Meeting, and one (1) special Congregational Meeting.

The Session took the following action relative to our church membership:

1. Five (5) were granted letters of transfer to other churches.
2. Seventeen (17) were suspended.
3. Thirteen (13) were placed on the non-resident membership roll.
4. There were seven (7) new members received on Re-affirmation or Confession of Faith.
5. There were eight (8) new members received by Letter of Transfer.

There was one (1) adult baptism and three (3) infant baptisms.

THE CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS OF THE CALVARY UNITED PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH OF  
WICHITA, KANSAS,

In the Name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, we, the congregation of the Calvary United Presbyterian Church of Wichita, Kansas, in meeting assembled, hereby adopt the following constitutions:

ARTICLE I

The name of this congregation shall be "The Calvary United Presbyterian Church of Wichita, Kansas. As used in the Constitution and By-laws and other acts of this congregation, the words "Congregation" and "Church" shall be synonymous, and shall be interpreted to mean "The Calvary United Presbyterian Church of Wichita, Kansas" unless some other meaning is apparent from the context.

ARTICLE II

1. This congregation receives and adopts the Confession of Faith, the Larger and Shorter Catechisms, the Form of Government, the Rules of Discipline, and the Directory of Worship, as set forth in the Constitution of the United Presbyterian Church in the U.S.A. which sincerely we believe to be in accord with the Holy Scriptures.

2. This Constitution is supplemental to and subordinate to the Constitution of the United Presbyterian Church in the U.S.A. and shall always be construed in harmony therewith, and all preaching teaching in this congregation shall conform thereto.

3. Whenever the words "Presbyterian" and/or "Presbyterian Church" are used in this Constitution or By-laws of this church, such words shall be interpreted as having reference to the United Presbyterian Church in the U.S.A. unless some other meaning is apparent from the context.

ARTICLE III

This congregation shall be a loyal member of the Presbytery, Synod and General Assembly of the United Presbyterian Church in the U.S.A. and shall co-operate with those assemblies for the preaching of the Gospel and its promulgation throughout the world.

ARTICLE IV

1. All services of this congregation and its organizations shall conform to the Constitution of the United Presbyterian Church in the U.S.A. and to the rules and regulations of the authority of the Presbytery, Synod and General Assembly thereof.

2. All issues pertaining to local and national government, policy, or doctrine shall be referred to and through the Proper ecclesiastical judicatories.

3. Minister, Church Officers and all others in Christian Service of this Church shall give satisfactory evidence of their loyalty to and belief in the United Presbyterian Church in the U.S.A. and its Boards and Agencies.

ARTICLE V

The object and purpose of this congregation is the propagation of the Gospel and the upbuilding of the Kingdom of God at home and abroad, beginning with the salvation of the individual.



## ARTICLE VI

1. Communicant members shall be admitted when approved by the Session in accordance with the established provisions of the Presbyterian Church.

2. Children born within the pale of the church are to be baptized and are under the care, government and discipline of the church, and when they have arrived at the years of discretion, they are to assume all the privileges and duties of full communicant members, on evidence to the Session of their having been properly instructed and on their affirmation of faith.

## ARTICLE VII

The financial year of this church shall be the calendar year.

## ARTICLE VIII

1. The annual meeting for this congregation and corporation shall be held each year and at such time and in such manner as the By-laws may provide. Officers shall be elected and all other business that may properly come before these annual meetings shall be transacted.

2. In all regular or called meetings of the congregation a quorum shall consist of ten (10) members in addition to the Moderator.

3. Special meetings of the congregation may be called by the Session or of the corporation by the Trustees or by a petition in writing signed by 20 voting members of the respective body.

4. Notice of regular annual meetings shall be publicly read in church on the two Sundays preceding the meeting. Notice of special meetings shall be publicly read in church on the two Sundays prior to the meeting.

5. Notice of an adjourned meeting shall be read on the Sunday immediately preceding it.

## ARTICLE IX

1. The Pastoral office is the highest office in this congregation. The method of calling or releasing a pastor shall always be in accordance with the form and procedure prescribed by the United Presbyterian Church in the U.S.A.

2. The pastor of the congregation shall always be the Moderator of the Session and of the congregational meetings, except when he is unable to act. In such cases some other minister of this Presbytery shall be invited by the Pastor, with the concurrence of the Session, to preside. If the business is extremely important or urgent and no other minister is reasonably available, the Session shall, with the permission of the regular Moderator, choose one of its own members to be the chairman pro tem.

## ARTICLE X

1. The Session is the ruling body of this church, and shall consist of the active ruling Elders in office, in accordance with the constitution and By-laws of this church.

2. The Trustees shall be organized in accordance with the laws of this state and the church laws, and shall have jurisdiction over the financial and material interests of the church, subject to the Session as the ruling body of this church.

3. The Board of Deacons shall be composed of Deacons duly elected and ordained, this Board shall have such duties and functions as are proper and in accordance with the laws and customs of the church. page 3.

4. The clerk of the Session shall be the clerk of the congregation by virtue of his office. He shall keep the minutes of all meetings, and preserve the records and archives of this congregation. He shall have the power to obtain such assistance as may be necessary for the proper performance of his official duties.

5. An auditing committee shall be appointed by the Trustees for the purpose of auditing and certifying the records of the Financial officers of the church. This committee shall report to the annual meeting of the corporation.

6. The Session shall have and perform the duties and responsibilities assigned to it by the Constitution of the United Presbyterian Church U.S.A. which includes that the Session shall have jurisdiction over and responsibility for the program of Christian Education in this church.

7. The Session, the Trustees and the Deacons shall consist as Boards of such members as the By-laws may prescribe, provided the number of each group shall be divisible by three, and the members of each group shall be elected by the congregation for terms of three years, in such manners that one-third of each group shall be elected each year.

8. The Session, the Board of Trustees and the Board of Deacons shall have such officers as may be prescribed by the by-laws.

## ARTICLE XI

1. Proposed amendments, alterations or repeals to this Constitution must be presented in writing and read with the call of a congregational meeting at least two Sunday mornings in advance of said meeting. If any such amendment, alteration, or repeal receives a majority vote it shall become effective at once, unless otherwise specified.

2. Article 11, sections 1 and 2 and Article XI may not be amended.

## BY-LAWS OF THE CALVARY UNITED PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH, WICHITA, KANSAS

### Section 1 - Membership

1. Applicants for membership who have not made a profession of faith shall be examined by the Session as to their knowledge, piety and willingness to approve and abide by the rules and regulations of the United Presbyterian Church U.S.A.

2. Applicants presenting letters of transfer or certificates of dismissal from evangelical churches shall be received by the Session if their letters or certificates are found to be in good and regular standing.

3. Applicants who present proof that they are members in good and regular standing in other evangelical churches who do not give certificates or letters of transfer shall be received upon their testimony of faith.

4. Unbaptized persons shall be baptized at the time of their public reception. All new communicants shall be publicly received following acceptance by the Session.

### Section 2 - Congregational meetings.

1. The annual congregational meeting of this church shall be held in the church during the month of January of each year. The time and date of such meeting to be at the discretion of the Session. It may be adjourned by those present who answer the call to the same night of the following week.

2. A special meeting of the congregation may be held at any time for the purpose of considering such matters as are specified in the call for the meeting. No other business may be transacted at any special meeting other than specified in the call for the meeting.

3. The clerk of the Session shall give public notice of annual or special meetings of the congregation. Such notices shall state the day, hour, and the place of the meeting and also its purpose. The same shall be read from the pulpit two Sunday mornings preceding the meeting.

4. After a brief period of worship consisting of a hymn, a passage of Scripture and an opening prayer, the order of business of the congregational meeting shall be:

Reading of the call for the meeting,  
Reports by the Treasurer of the Session  
Treasurer of Deacons  
Treasurer of church benevolences  
Audit of these three  
President or secretary of all church related organizations  
Clerk of the Session  
Clerk of Deacons  
Boy Scout Institutional representative  
Pastor  
other reports as may be deemed desired or necessary,

Approval of Benevolence Budget

Election of Elders, Deacons and Benevolence Treasurer for term of three years, Filling any vacancies.

Amendments, alterations or repeals to the Constitution and By-laws.

Other business.

5. Vote shall be by ballot in the following:

Elections when the number of nominees exceeds the number of those to be elected calling or dismissing a pastor.

6. In all matters pertaining to rules of order, the manual of Presbyterian Law shall be followed.

7. The annual Corporation meeting of this church shall be held in the church at the conclusion of the congregational meeting held during the month of January each year. It may be adjourned by those present to the same night of the following week.

8. A special meeting of the Corporation may be called at any time for the purpose of considering such matters as are specified in the call of the meeting. No other business may be transacted at any special meeting other than that specified in the call.

9. The clerk of the Trustees shall give public notice of the annual or special Corporation meetings. Such notice shall state the day, hour, place and purpose of the meetings. The same shall be read from the pulpit two Sundays preceding the meeting.

10. The order of business at the annual corporation meeting shall be:

Read the call for the meeting  
Reports by the treasurer of the church  
Committee of audit  
Clerk of the Trustees  
Stewardship Chairman  
Treasurers of all other church related organizations  
Treasurer of any special funds  
and other reports deemed necessary or advisable.  
Approval of current expense budget

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Election of Trustees, Stewardship Chairman, Church Treasurer, Financial Secretary and the Financial Secretary of Youth Budget for term of three years, fill-and vacancies.  
Other business.

11. Ballot voting shall be necessary when the number of nominees exceeds the number of offices to be filled.

### SECTION 3 - The Session

1. The Ruling Elders and the Pastor shall constitute the Session. The Pastor is Moderator. The Session shall elect a clerk and such other officers annually as they deem advisable. The clerk of the Session shall be ex-officio the clerk of the congregation and shall keep the minutes and records thereof, including an up-to-date and accurate roll or list of all communicant members, also, all who are entitled to vote at congregational meetings.

2. There shall be 15 ruling Elders, each elected for a term of three years. They shall be divided into three classes in such a manner that the term of one-third of the Elders shall expire annually. The powers of the Session shall be those set forth in the Constitution of the United Presbyterian Church U.S.A. The Session shall hold at least one regular meeting every month and notice of the time and place thereof shall be given on the Sunday preceding the meeting. A quorum of the Session shall consist of five ruling Elders and the Pastor or Moderator.

3. It shall be the duty of the Session to see that the church, which is the House of God, shall be used for purposes in accordance therewith and not diverted to uses contrary to its character.

### SECTION 4 - Trustees

1. The Board of Trustees shall consist of twelve members each elected for a period of three years. They shall be divided into three classes so that the term of one-third of the members expires at each annual meeting. The Board shall have charge of the material and financial affairs of the church and shall conduct those in conformity with the Constitution and By-laws of this church, the United Presbyterian Church in the U.S.A. and the laws of this State. A quorum shall consist of five and they shall hold one regular meeting per month at such time and place as they shall decide. Previous notice of the meeting shall be given to all Trustees by the chairman or secretary in such manner as may be agreed upon by the Board. All Trustees shall be communicant members of the congregation in good standing, of at least twenty one years of age.

2. As soon as possible after the annual meeting the Board shall meet and elect its officers for the ensuing year. They shall elect their own chairman and secretary. The chairman shall preside over the meetings of the Board and the Corporation. In the event of his absence the Board may elect another of its members to preside. The secretary shall keep a record of the minutes of the Board and Corporation meetings and keep a record of all proceedings of the Board and submit them to the Session annually for review. The Board shall be authorized to fill vacancies on the Board for the balance of the current year. Such vacancies to include continued absence from Board meetings without due cause.

### SECTION 5 - Treasurer

Treasurer shall become ex-officio and associate member of the Board of Trustees. The Treasurer shall receive all funds of the church from the Financial Secretary, shall hold the monies in the proper accounts for which they are designated and disburse them only by check upon proper order of the Trustees. The Treasurer's report to the annual Corporation meeting shall include a written or printed summary of all receipts and disbursements for the past fiscal year. In the event of a vacancy in the office of Treasurer the chairman of the Board of Trustees shall fill such vacancy until it can be filled by elective process of the Congregation.



## SECTION 6 - Financial Secretary

The Financial Secretary shall keep a record of all pledges and contributions to the current expenses of the church, shall render to the Board of Trustees a statement at such times as they may call for it and shall collect all offerings, count, classify and give proper credit for same and see that all contributions are placed into the proper accounts. In the event of a vacancy in the office of Financial Secretary, the chairman of the Board of Trustees shall fill such vacancy until it can be filled by elective process of the Congregation.

## SECTION 7 - Deacons

1. The Board of Deacons shall consist of nine members elected for terms of three years and shall be divided into three equal classes. The Board shall elect its own officers annually with the Pastor as Moderator ex-officio.

2. It shall be the duty of the Board to assist the Pastor in the spiritual care of the congregation, to look after the sick and needy and to distribute the offerings and gifts of the congregation designated for use by the Board.

3. The Board shall also assist the Pastor in the visitation of new families and of the families and individuals in need of the church and of Christ in their lives.

4. The Board shall have charge of the preparation of the Communion table and service.

## SECTION 8 - Finances

1. There shall be a finance committee of at least one member from every organization recognized by the Session of the church through its own selection and one member from the congregation appointed by the finance chairman who shall be elected annually at the meeting of the Corporation. He shall not be the treasurer or the financial secretary.

2. The finance committee shall, not later than October 10th of each year, prepare a proposed budget for the current expenses of the church for the ensuing year.

3. The Session shall present to the finance committee the proposed benevolence budget for the ensuing year, after approval by the finance committee, the Session and Trustees, the proposed current expense budget and proposed benevolence budget shall be distributed in printed form to the Congregation sometime during the month of November. The proposed budgets shall be the basis for the annual every member canvass and shall be presented to the Congregation for action at the annual Congregational and Corporation meetings.

4. The money to be raised by the congregation to meet the budgets of the church shall be raised under the direction of the finance committee in such manner as may be deemed best by them. The annual every member canvass shall be made at such time and in such manner as the finance committee decides. The results shall be reported to the congregation not later than the annual meeting of the Corporation.

5. No board or committee of this church may, without the congregation's approval obligate this church for a sum to exceed \$500.00.

6. The offerings received shall be apportioned among the agencies of the Church and other objects of Christian benevolence, under the supervision of the Session and Trustees in accordance with the budgets of this congregation. The specific designation by the giver of any offering to any cause or causes shall always be respected and the will of the donor carefully carried out. When the specific designation of the giver involves

expenditure of money other than provided in budgets and approved projects of the congregation, the Financial Secretary shall bring the matter before the Session for its consideration of the suitability of the gift and whether the gift will be used as designated or returned to the giver.

## SECTION 9 - Elections

1. The regular election of officers shall be held at the annual meeting. Vacancies may be filled at a special meeting called for that purpose or at regular annual meetings or as set out in sections 4, 5, and 6 of these By-laws.

2. The rotary system shall apply to all officers of Elder, Trustee, and Deacon. No member who has served a full term on these Boards shall be re-elected until the expiration of a calendar year.

3. Nominations shall be made by a representative nominating committee of communicant members of the church. Two members of this committee shall be designated by and from the Session, one of whom shall be named by the session as chairman. One member of this committee shall be designated by and from the board of deacons, and one by and from the board of trustees. Other members of the committee (none of whom may be in active service on the session, board of deacons, or the board of trustees), in sufficient number to constitute a majority thereof, shall be designated by the organizations of the church. In addition, the pastor shall be a member of this committee ex officio but without vote. The nominating committee shall be chosen annually. Full opportunity shall always be accorded at the congregational meeting for nominations by any eligible voter. All nominees must agree to serve before their names are placed before the congregation for voting.

4. If more persons are nominated than are required, the voting shall be by ballot, and a majority shall elect. In case the nominees equal the places to be filled, the entire list may be elected by motion duly made and carried.

## SECTION 10 - Auditing Committee

1. Prior to the annual meeting each year, the Board of Trustees shall appoint an auditing committee of two for the ensuing year. It shall be the duty of this committee to audit the accounts of all financial officers of the church at such time or times as they may deem advisable and report their findings to the congregation at the annual meetings. This committee may consult with and advise the financial officers concerning the proper and desirable methods of keeping funds and financial records of the church.

## SECTION 11 - Amendments

1. Amendments to these by-laws may be proposed at any annual or special meeting of this church duly called therefor. A proposed amendment, alteration, or repeal shall be read at the meeting at which it is presented and a two-thirds vote shall be required for adoption of said amendment, alteration, or repeal of these by-laws.
