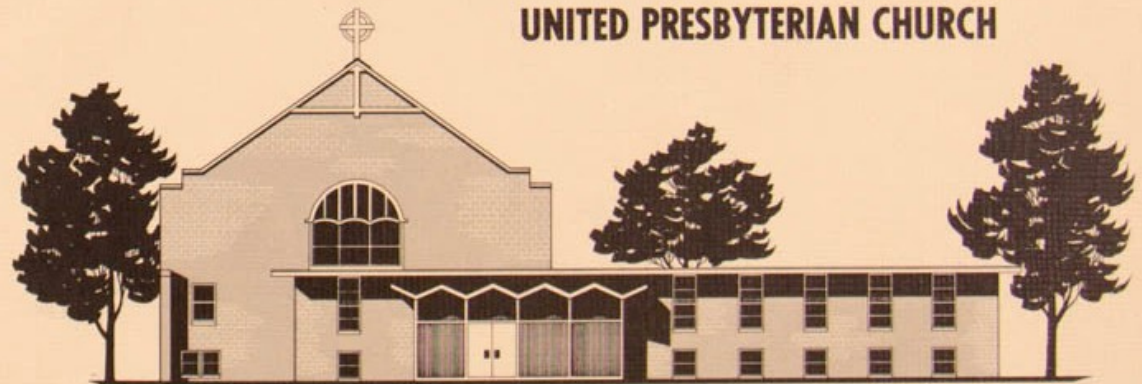

PASTOR'S REPORT
1972

Paul said in Colossians 1:25, "And I have been made a servant of the church by God, who gave me this task to perform for your good. It is the task of fully proclaiming His message . . ." (Today's English Version) This sums up what I feel my position is as a pastor. I trust the Lord has placed me in this position. I desire, by His help, to be His servant for the church. The work is to "fully proclaim His message."

The past year at Calvary may mark somewhat of a new beginning. In September we held the "Calvary Warm-Up" meetings, which resulted in the weekly Bible Study groups on Sunday evening. I pray that the Lord will awaken renewed interest in Himself and in His Word through these Bible study times.

Another "new happening" has been in the area of children's work. Last Spring before Easter "Children's Week" saw the sanctuary bustling nightly with children watching flannelgraph stories, film strips and puppets, all presenting the truth of the Gospel. Then, in the summer, the Vacation Bible School was held for one week, with continuing sessions each Wednesday night for five more weeks. In October and November the mid-week Bible Clubs presented God's Word of promise to more than 30 children.

Another event, unusual for our congregation, was the New Year's Eve service, sponsored by the Cruiser Club, with over 80 people present for Communion at the Lord's Table, as we fellowshiped with the Lord as the New Year began.

Meanwhile, the work of the Sunday School, our weekly worship on the Lord's Day, and the mid-week activities go on much as usual. The Lord has blessed us financially, as He has moved in the hearts of many people to give of their means to support the church in a tangible way.

These things are all on the positive side as we try together to be the Church of Jesus Christ. However, as pastor, I feel that we have barely made a beginning. We started in the fall with the idea of "Calvary Warm-Up". We were talking about the spiritual need that we have as a church. Our program has changed to a degree, but have we? I feel that as a congregation we need to say, as did the Apostle Paul, "All I want is to know Christ and experience the power of His resurrection . . . I do not claim that I have already succeeded in this, or have already become perfect . . . I really do not think that I have already reached it; the one thing I do, however, is to forget what is behind me . . . So I run straight toward the goal in order to win the prize, which is God's call through Christ Jesus to the life above." (Philippians 3:10-14 TEV)

My prayer as pastor is that we may have among us an individual desire to experience Christ and His power in our lives, that we may not dwell on the past but will face realistically the challenge of the present day, and that we will have the vision and the faith to step out for the Lord in 1973.

REPORT OF THE SESSION FOR 1972

The Session approved the use of our church facilities by Child Evangelism for a dinner and other meetings, for a week of Children's Meetings, by a special delegation of the Bartlesville Church, and for two (2) wedding receptions.
