PASTOR'S REPORT
1971

1.

When the Apostle Paul gave what amounted to a "report" of his work, he said: "God has appointed me to proclaim the Good News as an apostle and teacher, and it is for this reason that I suffer these things. But I am still full of confidence, for I know whom I have trusted and I am sure that He is able . . ." (11 Timothy 1:11-12, TEV). Outwardly, Paul was not doing so well. He was in prison. But he knew that God had appointed him and that God was able. He knew he could trust God.

This seems like an honest point to begin a report about my work as pastor of Calvary church during the past year. None of us, obviously, have had to suffer in prison for our faith. However, outwardly, as far as Calvary church is concerned, things are not all that we wish they could be. We find ourselves as a church in an "older" or changing neighborhood. Our attendance and membership have had a slight decline. I, personally, feel at a loss to know which way to lead so as to cope with some of these problems. But we can take heart, as Paul did. God has appointed us to this task of proclaiming the Good News of Jesus Christ. Furthermore, God is faithful and able.

Therefore, I give thanks to the Lord for His continuing faithfulness. I can say that He has been with me. I know that the ministry of proclaiming His Word is impossible unless He works directly in the hearts of the speaker and the hearers. I just praise Him that He has given His light and strength and guided through many days. May he continue to do so. I also rejoice that the Lord has restored my health. Many of the months of 1971 were difficult because of how I felt, but the Lord has seen fit to alleviate that problem.

I also give thanks to the Lord for the faithfulness of His people. Many of you have jobs to do in connection with the church and are very faithful to your work. I think of the Sunday School teachers and officers, the United Presbyterian Women, the Trustees, Elders, Deacons, Choir, members, church treasurer, financial secretary, church secretary, janitor, etc. Also, the financial support of the church has remained good, although our giving for mission purposes has declined. For each of you and your dedication to our Lord I give thanks.

I believe that God is faithful and able. I also believe that He has much for us as a church to do. Therefore, let us rededicate ourselves to the Lord, that we may find His purposes for us and experience His power among us in the work of proclaiming the Good News of Christ.

REPORT OF THE SESSION FOR 1971

During the year 1971 the Session held eleven (11) regular meetings, two (2) special meetings, participated in a joint meeting with the Board of Trustees, and held the Annual Congregational Meeting.

The Session took the following action relative to our church membership:

- (1) Eight (8) were granted a letter of transfer to another church.
- (2) One (1) was suspended.
- (3) There were six (6) deaths.
- (4) There were five (5) new members received on confession of faith.
- (5) There was one (1) new member received by letter of transfer.

There were four (4) infant and one (1) adult baptisms.

The Session authorized procurement of 175 new Crusader Hymns with funds provided by Memorial Funds available for this purpose.

The Session appointed two (2) special committees to study and report their findings to the Session on:

(1) Benevolence Giving - responsible to determine where the money goes, how it is divided, and what the possibilities are for exercising control of the distribution.

(2) Contract Response - established at the request of General Assembly to review the "COCU" plan of union. "COCU" stands for two (2) things:

- (a) Committee on Church Union - responsible for developing the plan of union.
- (b) Church of Christ Uniting - a continuing idea.

The Session approved the use of Fellowship Hall for three (3) golden wedding anniversary receptions, two (2) wedding receptions, and six (6) days of meetings of Child Evangelism on two (2) different occasions.
