

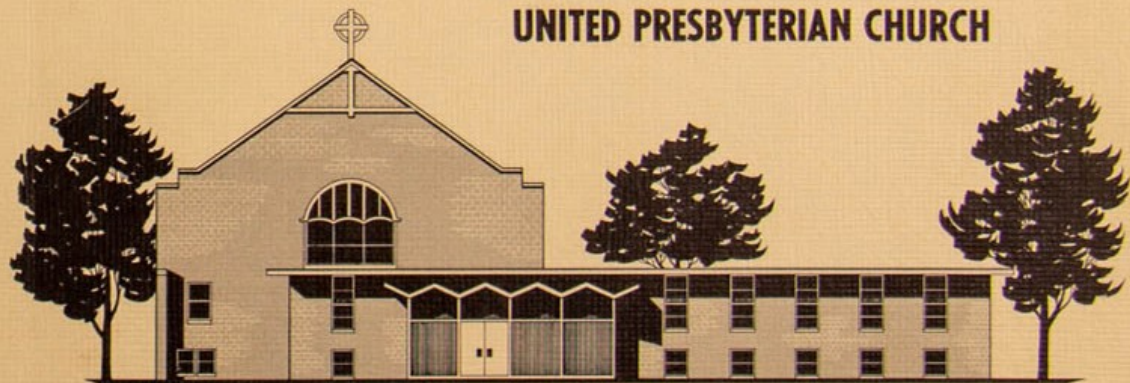

My work as a pastor in 1973 has continued much as in the past. The main emphasis is on the preaching of the Word, especially at the morning worship on the Lord's Day. Other activities which occupy my time include preparation for the Sunday evening Bible studies, mid-week prayer and Bible study and visitation. In this last category, visitation is mainly to those who are sick and shut-in and those who have some special need or are visitors in the congregation. Another aspect of my work, often unnoticed by the congregation, is involvement in Presbyterial responsibilities. I am a member of the Support Department of Presbytery and am at the present time serving as moderator of the Faith Presbyterian church Session.

Some noteworthy happenings within the life of Calvary church for 1973 include:

Bible Club, a mid-week time of Bible teaching for children, held on Wednesday evenings in the spring and fall. Bible Club attracted over 70 grade-school age children in the spring session, and about 40 in the fall period. With the Sunday-school sponsored Vacation Bible School in the summer, the congregation had this form of evangelistic outreach for children. Many of the children who attended are not associated with our church in any other way.

A Youth Director, Richard Barcus, served during March, April and May, and then John Carter was appointed to the position in December. This part-time position, financed through the Youth Program portion of the general budget of the congregation, was a venture of faith and experimentation by our congregation. I trust that the new year will bring further achievements in this area.

A Young Married People's Class was promoted and organized by Mr. and Mrs. Duane Jessup and Mr. and Mrs. Gerald Kinney. During the fall months, the group has met monthly for a social gathering and weekly as a Sunday School class. This fills a long-standing need and I trust the Lord will continue to bless this venture.

Sunday evening Bible study in groups has attracted twenty to forty people to the study of Acts last spring and the study of Ephesians this fall. I trust that in the next couple months we can use various scriptural sources to discover just what the church of Jesus Christ is and how we ought to function as His body.

Perhaps this is not a part of the congregational life per se, but my wife and I attended the Billy Graham School of Evangelism in St. Louis during the first week of November. We heard several outstanding servants of the Lord as they encouraged and exhorted us about the work of evangelism. For us, it was real joy to experience the oneness of Spirit in the work of our Lord among those from other churches and areas of service.

Any summary like this is of limited value, for it deals mainly with outward and visible activities. The basic effect of preaching and teaching the Word is first inward, upon the heart of the hearer. I see encouraging signs in the lives of many that the Word has been heard and that the Spirit is having His effect. May 1974 see a continuing spiritual growth in each of us. As Paul says in Ephesians 4:1 "I urge you, then, . . . live a life that measures up to the standard God set when He called you."

REPORT OF SESSION FOR 1973

During the year 1973 the Session held nine (9) regular meetings, nine (9) special meetings, participated in a joint meeting with the Board of Trustees and held the Annual Congregational Meeting.

The Session took the following action relative to our church membership:

- A. Six (6) members were granted a letter of transfer to other churches.
- B. There were two (2) new members received on Confession of Faith.
- C. There was one (1) new member received by letter of Transfer.
- D. There were ten (10) members removed from the church membership roll by their request.
- E. There were three (3) deaths.

There was one (1) adult baptism.

A position of "Youth Director" has been established in our church during the past year. The first one employed in this capacity was Richard Barcus. In consideration of personal circumstance, Mr. Barcus was not able to continue his work with us as of this Fall. Recently, the Session was able to employ John Carter as "Youth Director." We urge that much prayer be offered for understanding the Will of God and success in this undertaking.

The Session has authorized the Music Committee to gather pertinent information and to seek aid from qualified individuals relative to the purchase of a new organ sometime in the near future.

The Session authorized subscription to the "Conference Call" service provided by Southwestern Bell Telephone Co. and procurement of receiver amplifiers to implement this service. This was done to allow shut-ins to participate in our Sunday morning worship services.

The Session approved the use of our church facilities by Child Evangelism Fellowship for worker training classes and for three (3) wedding receptions.
