THE CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS OF THE CALVARY PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH OF WICHITA, KANSAS, ADOPTED ON THE 9TH DAY OF JANUARY, 1958

IN THE NAME OF THE FATHER AND OF THE SON AND OF THE HOLY SPIRIT, WE, THE CONGREGATION OF THE CALVARY PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH OF WIGHITA, KANSAS, IN MEETING ASSEMBLED, HEREBY ADOPT THE FOLLOWING CONSTITUTIONS:

ARTICLE

THE NAME OF THIS CONGREGATION SHALL BE "THE CALVARY PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH OF WICHITA, KANSAS. AS USED IN THE CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS AND OTHER ADTS OF THIS CONGREGAATION, THE WORDS "CONGREGATION" AND "CHURCH" SHALL BE SYNDHYMOUS, AND SHALL BE INTERPRETED TO MEAN "THE CALVARY PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH OF WICHITA, KANSAS" UNLESS SOME OTHER
MEANING IS APPARENT FROM THE CONTEXT.

ARTICLE II

- 1. This congregation receives and adopts the Confession of Faith, the Larger and Shorter Catechisms, the Form of Government, the Rules of Discipline. And the Directory of Worship, as set forth in the Constitution of the United Pressyter:an Church in the U.S.A. which singerely we believe to be in accord with the Holy Scriptures.
- 2. This Constitution is supplemental to and subordinate to the Constitution of the United Presentain Church in the U.S.A. and shall always be constituted in harmony therewith, and all preaching and teaching in this congregation shall conform thereto.
- 3. WHENEVER THE WORDS "PRESSYTERIAN" AND/OR "PRESSYTERIAN CHURCH" ARE USED IN THIS CONSTITUTION OR BY-LAWS OF THIS CHURCH, SUCH WORDS SHALL SE INTERPRETED AS HAVING REFERENCE TO THE UNITED PRESSYTERIAN CHURCH IN THE U.S.A. UNLESS SOME OTHER MEANING IS APPARENT FROM THE CONTEXT.

ARTICLE III

THIS CONGREGATION SHALL BE A LOYAL MEMBER OF THE PRESBYTERY, SYNOD AND GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE UNITED PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH IN THE U.S.A. AND SHALL COOPERATE WITH THOSE ASSEMBLIES FOR THE PREACHING OF THE GOSPEL AND ITS MULGATION THROUGHOUT THE WORLD.

ARTICLE IV

- 1. ALL SERVICES OF THIS CONGREGATION AND IT ORGANIZATIONS SHALL CONFORM TO THE CONSTITUTION OF THE UNITED PRESSYTERIAN CHURCH IN THE U.S.A. AND TO THE RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE AUTHORITY OF THE PRESSYTERY, SYNOD AND GENERAL ASSEMBLY THEREOF.
- 2. ALL ISSUES PERTAINING TO LOCAL AND NATIONAL GOVERNMENT, POLICY, OR ODDITRINE SHALL BE REFERRED TO AND THROUGH THE PROPER ECCLESIASTICAL JUDICATORIANS.
- 3. MINISTER, CHURCH OFFICERS AND ALL OTHERS IN CHRISTIAN SERVICE OF THIS CHURCH SHALL GIVE SATISFACTORY EVICENCE OF THEIR LOYALTY TO AND SELICF IN THE UNITED PRESSYTERIAN CHURCH IN THE U.S.A. AND ITS BOARDS AND AGENCIES.

ARTICLE V

THE OBJECT AND PURPOSE OF THIS CONGREGATION IS THE PROPAGATION OF THE GOSSEL AND THE UPBUILDING OF THE KINGDOM OF GOD AT HOME AND ABROAD, BEGINNING WITH THE SALVATION OF THE INDIVIDUAL.

ARTICLE VI

1. COMMUNICANT MEMBERS SHALL BE AGMITTED WHEN APPROVED BY THE SESSION IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE ESTABLISHED PROVISIONS OF THE PRESSYTERIAN CHURCH.

- 2. CHILDREN BORN WITHIN THE PALE OF THE CHURCH ARE TO BE BAPTIZED AND ARE UNDER THE CARE, GOVERNMENT, AND DISCIPLINE OF THE CHURCH, AND WHEN THEY HAVE ARRIVED AT THE YEARS OF DISCRETION. THEY ARE TO ASSUME ALL THE PRIVILEGES AND OUTIES OF FULL COMMUNICANT MEMBERS, ON EVICENCE TO THE SESSION OF THEIR HAVING BEEN PROPERLY INSTRUCTED AND ON THEIR AFFIRMATION OF FAITH.
- 3. ALL COMMUNICANT MEMBERS SHALL BE VOTING MEMBERS IF IN GOOD AND REQUEAR ! STANDING. ALSO ALL ADULTS WHO SUPPORT THE CHURCH AND ATTEND WORSHIP SERVICES OF THE CHURCH ARE ELIGIBLE TO VOTE ON THE CALL OF A PASTOR.

ARTICLE VII

THE FINANCIAL YEAR OF THIS CHURCH BHALL BE THE CALENDAR YEAR.

ARTICLE VIII

- 1. THE ANNUAL MEETING FOR THIS CONGREGATION AND CORPORATION SHALL BE HELD EACH YEAR AND AT SUCH TIME AND IN SUCH MANNER AS THE BY-LAWS MAY PROVIDE. OFFICERS SHALL BE ELECTED AND ALL OTHER BUSINESS THAT MAY PROPERLY COME BEFORE THESE ANNUAL MEETINGS SHALL BE TRANSACTED.
- 2. IN ALL REGULAR OR CALLED MEETINGS OF THE CONGREGATION A QUOTUM SHALL CON-SIST OF TEN (10) MEMBERS IN ADDITION TO THE MODERATOR.
- 3. Special meetings of the conshesation may be called by the Session or of the corporation by the Trustees or by a petition in writing signed by 20 voting members of the respective sooy.
- 4. NOTICE OF REGULAR ANNUAL MEETINGS SHALL BE PUBLICLY READ IN CHURCH ON THE SUNDAY PRECEDING THE MEETING. NOTICE OF SPECIAL MEETINGS SHALL BE PUBLICLY READ IN CHURCH ON THE TWO SUNDAYS PRIOR TO THE MEETING.
- 5. NOTICE OF AN ADJOURNED MEETING SHALL BE READ ON THE SUNDAY IMMEDIATELY PRECEDING IT.

ARTICLE IX

1. THE PASTORAL OFFICE IS THE HIGHEST OFFICE IN THIS CONGREGATION. THE METHOD OF CALLING OR RELEASING A PASTOR SHALL ALWAYS BE IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE FORM AND PROCEDURE PRESCRIBED BY THE UNITED BY T

2. THE PASTON OF THE CONGREGATION SHALL ALWAYS OF THE MODERATOR OF THE SESSION AND OF THE GONGREGATIONAL MEETINGS, EXCEPT WHEN IS UNABLE TO ACT. IN SUCH CASES BOME OTHER MINISTER OF THIS PRESBYTERY SHALL BE INVITED BY THE PASTOR, WITH THE CONCURRENCE OF THE SESSION, TO PRESIDE. IF THE BUSINESS IS EXTREMELY IMPORTANT OR UNGENT AND NO OTHER MINISTER IS REASONABLY AVAILABLE, THE SESSION SHALL, WITH THE PERMISSION OF THE REGULAR MODERATOR, CHOOSE ONE OF ITS OWN MEMBERS TO BE THE CHAIRMAN PHO TEM.

ARTICLE X

- 1. THE SESSION IS THE RULING BODY OF THIS CHURCH, AND SHALL CONSIST OF THE ACTIVE RULING ELDERS IN OFFICE, IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS OF THIS CHUNCH.
- 2. THE TRUSTEES SHALL SE ORGANIZED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE LAWS OF THIS STATE AND THE CHURCH LAWS, AND SHALL HAVE JURISDICTION OVER THE FINANCIAL AND MATERIAL INTERESTS OF THE CHURCH, SUBJECT TO THE SESSION AS THE RULING SODY OF THIS CHURCH.
- 3. THE BOARD OF DEADONS SMALL BE COMPOSED OF DEADONS DULY ELECTED AND ORDAINED. THIS BOARD SHALL HAVE SUCH OUTLES AND FUNCTIONS AS ARE PROPER AND IN ADDORDANCE WITH THE LAWS AND DUSTOMS OF THE CHURCH.
- 4. THE CLERK OF THE SESSION SHALL BE THE CLERK OF THE CONGREGATION BY VIRTUE OF HIS OFFICE. HE SHALL KEEP THE MINUTES OF ALL MEETINGS, AND PRESERVE THE RECORDS AND ARCHIVES OF THIS CONGREGATION. HE SHALL HAVE THE POWER TO OSTAIN SUCH ASSISTANCE AS MAY BE NECESSARY FOR THE PROPER BERFORMANCE OF HIS OFFICIAL DUTIES.

- 5. AN AUDITING COMMITTEE SHALL BE APPOINTED BY THE TRUSTEES FOR THE PURPOSE OF AUDITING AND CERTIFYING THE RECORDS OF THE FINANCIAL OFFICERS OF THE CHURCH. THIS COMMITTEE SHALL REPORT TO THE ANNUAL MEETING OF THE CORPORATION.
- 6. THE SESSION SHALL HAVE AND PERFORM THE QUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES ASSIGNED TO IT BY THE CONSTITUTION OF THE UNITED PRESSYTERIAN CHURCH U.S.A. WHICH INCLUDES THAT THE SESSION SHALL HAVE JURISDICTION OVER AND RESPONSIBILITY FOR THE PROGRAM OF CHRISTIAN EDUCATION IN THIS CHURCH.
- 7. THE SESSION, THE TRUSTEES AND THE DEACONS SHALL CONSIST AS BOARDS OF SUCH MEMBERS AS THE BY-LAWS MAY PRESCRIBE, PROVIDED THE NUMBER OF EACH GROUP SHALL SE DIVISIBLE BY THREE, AND THE MEMBERS OF EACH GROUP SHALL SE ELECTED BY THE CONGREGATION FOR TERMS OF THREE YEARS, IN SUCH MANNER THAT ONE-THIRD OF EACH GROUP SHALL SE ELECTED EACH YEAR.
- 8. THE SESSION, THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES AND THE BOARD OF DEACONS SHALL HAVE SUCH OFFICERS AS MAY BE PRESCRIBED BY THE BY-LAWS.

ARTICLE XI

- 1. PROPOSED AMENDMENTS, ALTERATIONS OR REPEALS TO THIS CONSTITUTION MUST BE PRESENTED IN WRITING AND READ WITH THE CALL OF A CONGREGATIONAL MEETING AT LEAST TWO SUNDAY MOGNINGS IN ADVANCE OF SAID MEETING. IF ANY SUCH AMENDMENT, ALTERATION OR REPEAL RECEIVES A MAJORITY VOTE IT SHALL BEDOME EFFECTIVE AT ONCE UNLESS OTHERWISE SPECIFIED.
 - 2. ARTICLE II, SECTIONS 1 AND 2 AND ARTICLE XI MAY NOT BE AMENDED.

BY-LAWS OF THE CALVARY PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH, WICHITA, KANSAS

SECTION 1 - MEMBERSHIP

- 1. APPLICANTS FOR MEMBERSHIP WHO HAVE NOT MADE A PROFESSION OF FAITH SHALL BE EXAMINED BY THE SESSION AS TO THEIR KNOWLEDGE, PIETY AND WILLINGNESS TO APPROVE AND ABIDE BY THE RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE UNITED PRESSYTERIAN CHURCH U.S.A.
- 2. APPLICANTS PRESENTING LETTERS OF TRANSFER OR CERTIFICATES OF DISMISSION FROM EVANGELICAL CHURCHES SHALL SE RECEIVED BY THE SESSION IF THEIR LETTERS OR CERTIFICATES ARE FOUND TO SE IN GOOD AND REQULAR STANDING.
- 3. APPLICANTS WHO PRESENT PROOF THAT THEY ARE MEMBERS IN GOOD AND REGULAR STAND-ING IN OTHER EVANGELICAL CHURCHES WHO DO NOT GIVE CERTIFICATES OR LETTERS OF TRANSFER SHALL BE RECEIVED UPON THEIR TESTIMONY OF FAITH.

4. UNBAPTIZED PERSONS SHALL SE DAPTIZED AT THE TIME OF THEIR PUBLIC RECEPTION. ALL NEW COMMUNICANTS SHALL SE PUBLICLY RECEIVED FOLLOWING ACCEPTANCE BY THE SESSION.

SECTION 2 - CONGREGATIONAL MEETINGS.

- 1. THE ANNUAL CONGREGATIONAL MEETING OF THIS CHURCH SHALL BE HELD IN THE CHURCH DURING THE MONTH OF JANUARY OF EACH YEAR. THE TIME AND DATE OF SUCH MEETING TO BE AT THE DISCRETION OF THE SESSION. IT MAY BE ADJOURNED BY THOSE PRESENT WHO ANSWER THE CALL TO THE SAME NIGHT OF THE FOLLOWING WEEK.
- 2. A SPECIAL MEETING OF THE GONGREGATION MAY BE HELD AT ANY TIME FOR THE PURPOSE OF CONSIDERING BUCH MATTERS AS ARE SPECIFIED IN THE GALL FOR THE MEETING. NO OTHER DUSINESS MAY BE TRANSACTED AT ANY SPECIAL MEETING OTHER THAN SPECIFIED IN THE CALL FOR THE MEETING.
- 3. THE CLERK OF THE SESSION SHALL GIVE PUBLIC NOTICE OF ANNUAL OR SPECIAL MEET-INGS OF THE CONGREGATION. SUCH NOTICES SHALL STATE THE DAY, HOUR, AND THE PLACE OF THE MEETING AND ALSO ITS PURPOSE. THE SAME SHALL DE READ FROM THE PULPIT TWO SUNDAY MORNINGS PRECEDING THE MEETING.
- 4. AFTER A BRIEF PERIOD OF WORSHIP CONSISTING OF A HYMN, A PASSAGE OF SCRIPTURE AND AN OPENING PRAYER, THE ORDER OF BUSINESS OF THE CONGREGATIONAL MEETING SHALL SET READING OF THE GALL FOR THE MEETING

READING OF REPORTS BY THE TREASURER OF THE SESSION THEASURER OF DEACONS TREASURER OF CHURCH BENEVOLENCES AUDIT OF THESE THREE PRESIDENT OR SECRETARY OF ALL CHURCH RELATED ORGANIZATIONS. CLERK OF THE SESSION CLERK OF DEACONS BOY SCOUT INSTITUTIONAL REPRESENTATIVE PASTOR

OTHER REPORTS AS MAY BE DEEMED DESIRED OR NECESSARY. ELECTION OF ELDERS, DEACONS AND SENEVOLENCE TREASURER FOR TERM OF THREE YEARS, FILLING ANY VACANCIES.

AMENDMENTS, ALTERATIONS OF REPEALS TO THE CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS. OTHER BUSINESS.

- 5. VOTE SHALL SE SY BALLOT IN THE FOLLOWING: ELECTIONS WHEN THE NUMBER OF NOMINEES EXCEEDS THE NUMBER OF THOSE TO BE ELECTED. CALLING OR DISMISSING A PASTOR.
- 6. IN ALL MATTERS PERTAINING TO RULES OF ORDER, THE MANUAL OF PRESBYTERIAN LAW SHALL BE FOLLOWED.
- 7. THE ANNUAL CORPORATION MEETING OF THIS CHURCH SHALL BE HELD IN THE CHURCH AT THE CONCLUSION OF THE CONGREGATIONAL MEETING HELD DURING THE MONTH OF JANUARY EACH YEAR, IT MAY BE ADJOURNED BY THOSE PRESENT TO THE SAME NIGHT OF THE FOLLOWING WEEK.
- 8. A SPECIAL MEETING OF THE CORPORATION MAY BE CALLED AT ANY TIME FOR THE PURPOSE OF CONSIDERING SUCH MATTERS AS ARE SPECIFIED IN THE CALL OF THE MEETING. NO OTHER BUSINESS MAY BE TRANSACTED AT ANY SPECIAL MEETING OTHER THAN THAT SPECIFIED IN THE
- 9. THE CLERK OF THE TRUSTEES SHALL GIVE PUBLIC NOTICE OF THE ANNUAL OR SPECIAL CORPORATION MEETINGS. SUCH NOTICE SHALL STATE THE DAY, HOUR, PLACE AND PURPOSE OF THE MEETINGS. THE SAME SHALL BE READ FROM THE PULPIT TWO SUNDAYS PRECEDING THE
- 10. THE GROER OF BUSINESS AT THE ANNUAL CORPORATION MEETING SHALL BE: READ THE GALL FOR THE MEETING REPORTS BY THE TREASURER OF THE CHURCH

COMMITTEE OF AUDIT CLERK OF THE TRUSTEES STEWARDSHIP CHAIRMAN TREASURERS OF ALL OTHER CHURCH RELATED ORGANIZATIONS TREASURER OF ANY SPECIAL FUNDS

ANY OTHER REPORTS DEEMED NECESSARY OR ADVISABLE. ELECTION OF TRUSTEES, STEWARDSHIP CHAIRMAN, CHURCH TREASURER, FINANCIAL SECRET-ARY AND THE FINANCIAL SECRETARY OF YOUTH BUDGET FOR TERM OF THREE YEARS, FILLING ANY VACANCIES. OTHER BUSINESS.

11. BALLOT VOTING SHALL BE NECESSARY WHEN THE NUMBER OF NOMINERS EXCEEDS THE NUM-

SECTION 3 - THE SESSION

- 1. THE RULING ELDERS AND THE PASTOR SHALL CON TITUTE THE SESSION. THE PASTOR IS THE MODERATOR. THE SESSION SHALL ELECT A CLERK AND SUCH OTHER OFFICERS ANNUALLY AS THEY DEEM ADVISABLE. THE CLERK OF THE SESSION SHALL BE EX-OFFICIO THE CLERK OF THE CONGREGATION AND SHALL KEEP THE MINUTES AND RECORDS THEREOF, INCLUDING AN UP-TO-DATE AND ACCURATE ROLL OR LIST OF ALL COMMUNICANT MEMBERS, ALSO ALL WHO ARE ENTITLED TO
- 2. THERE SHALL BE 15 RULING ELDERS, EACH ELECTED FOR A TERM OF THREE YEARS. THEY SHALL BE DIVIDED INTO THREE CLASSES IN SUCH A MANNER THAT THE TERM OF ONE-THIRD OF THE ELDERS SHALL EXPIRE ANNUALLY. THE POWERS OF THE SESSION SHALL BE THOSE SET FORTH IN THE CONSTITUTION OF THE UNITED PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH U.S.A. THE SESSION SHALL HOLD

AT LEAST ONE REGULAR MEETING EVERY MONTH AND NOTICE OF THE TIME AND PLACE THEREOF SHALL SE GIVEN ON THE SUNDAY PRECEDING THE MEETING. A QUORUM OF THE SESSION SHALL CONSIST OF FIVE RULING ELDERS AND THE PASTOR OR MODERATOR.

34 IT SHALL BE THE DUTY OF THE SESSION TO SEE THAT THE CHURCH, WHICH IS THE HOUSE OF GOD, SHALL BE USED FOR PURPOSES IN ACCOMPANCE THEREWITH AND NOT DIVERTED TO USES CONTRARY TO ITS CHARACTER.

SECTION 4.-THUSTEES

- 1. THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES SHALL CONSIST OF TWELVE MEMBERS EACH ELECTED FOR A PERIOD OF THREE YEARS. THEY SHALL BE DIVIDED INTO THREE CLASSES SO THAT THE TERM OF ONE-THIRD OF THE MEMBERS EXPIRES AT EACH ANNUAL MEETING. THE BOARD SHALL HAVE CHARGE OF THE MATERIAL AND FINANCIAL AFFAIRS OF THE CHURCH AND SHALL CONDUCT THOSE IN CON-FORMITY WITH THE CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS OF THIS CHURCH, THE UNITED PRESSYTERIAN CHURCH IN THE U.S.A. AND THE LAWS OF THIS STATE. A QUORUM SHALL CONSIST OF FIVE AND THEY SHALL HOLD ONE REGULAR MEETING PER MONTH AT SUCH TIME AND PLACE AS THEY SHALL DECIDE. PREVIOUS NOTICE OF THE MEETING SHALL BE GIVEN TO ALL TRUSTEES BY THE CHAIR-MAN OR SECRETARY IN SUCH MANNER AS MAY BE AGREED UPON BY THE BOARD. ALL TRUSTEES SHALL BE MEMBERS OF THE CONGREGATION IN GOOD STANDING, OF AT LEAST TWENTY-ONE YEARS OF AGE. THE BOARD SHALL ALWAYS CONSIST OF AT LEAST TWO THIRDS COMMUNICANT MEMBERS OF THIS CHURCH.
- 2. AS SOON AS POSSIBLE AFTER THE ANNUAL MEETING THE BOARD SHALL MEET AND ELECT ITS OFFICERS FOR THE ENSUING YEAR. THEY SHALL ELECT THEIR OWN CHAIRMAN AND SECRETARY. THE CHAIRMAN SHALL PRESIDE OVER THE MEETINGS OF THE BOARD AND THE CORPORATION. IN THE EVENT IF HIS ABSENCE THE BOARD MAY ELECT ANOTHER OF ITS MEMBERS TO PRESIDE. THE SECRETARY SHALL KEEP A RECORD OF THE MINUTES OF THE BOARD AND CORPORATION MEETINGS AND KEEP A RECORD OF ALL PROCEEDINGS OF THE BOARD AND SUBMIT THEM TO THE SESSION ANNUALLY FOR REVIEW. THE BOARD SHALL BE AUTHORIZED TO FILL VACANCIES ON THE BOARD FOR THE BALANCE OF THE CURRENT YEAR. SUCH VACANCIES TO INCLUDE CONTINUED ABSENCE FROM BOARD MEETINGS WITHOUT DUE GAUSE.

SECTION 5 .- TREASURER

TREASURER SHALL BECOME EX-OFFICIO AND ASSOCIATE MEMBER OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES. THE TREASURER SHALL RECEIVE ALL FUNDS OF THE CHURCH FROM THE FINANCIAL SECRETARY, SHALL HOLD THE MONIES IN THE PROPER ACCOUNTS FOR WHICH THEY ARE DESIGNATED AND DISBURSE THEM ONLY BY CHECK UPON PROPER OF THE TRUSTEES. THE TREASURER'S REPORT TO THE ANNUAL CORPORATION MEETING SHALL INCLUDE A WRITTEN OR PRINTED SUMMARY OF ALL RECEIPTS AND DISBURSEMENTS FOR THE PAST FISCAL YEAR. IN THE EVENT OF A VAC-ANCY IN THE OFFICE OF TREASURER THE CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES SHALL FILL SUCH VACANCY UNTIL IT CAN BE FILLED BY ELECTIVE PROCESS OF THE CONGREGATION.

SECTION 6 - FINANCIAL SECRETARY

THE FINANCIAL SECRETARY BHALL MEEP A RECORD OF ALL PLEOSES AND CONTRIBUTIONS TO THE CURRENT EXPENSES OF THE CHURCH, SHALL RENDER TO THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES A STATE-MENT AT SUCH TIMES AS THEY MAY CALL FOR IT AND SHALL COLLECT ALL OFFERINGS, COUNT, CLASSIFY AND GIVE PROPER CREDIT FOR SAME AND SEE THAT ALL CONTRIBUTIONS ARE PLACED INTO THE PROPER ACCOUNTS. IN THE EVENT OF A VACANCY IN THE OFFICE OF FINANCIAL SECRETARY, THE CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES SHALL FILL SUCH VACANCY UNTIL IT CAN BE FILLED BY ELECTIVE PROCESS OF THE CONGREGATION.

SECTION 7 - DEACONS

- 1. THE BOARD OF DEACONS SHALL CONSIST OF NINE MEMBERS ELECTED FOR TERMS OF THREE YEARS AND SHALL BE DIVIDED INTO THREE EQUAL CLASSES. THE BOARD SHALL ELECT ITS OWN OFFICERS ANNUALLY WITH THE PASTOR AS MODERATOR EX-OFFICIO.
- 2. IT SHALL BE THE DUTY OF THE BOARD TO ASSIST THE PASTOR IN THE SPIRITUAL CARE OF THE CONGREGATION, TO LOOK AFTER THE SICK AND NEEDY AND TO DISTRIBUTE THE OFFERINGS AND GIFTS OF THE CONGREGATION DESIGNATED FOR USE BY THE BOARD.

- 3. THE BOARD SHALL ALSO ADSIST THE PASTOR IN THE VISITATION OF NEW FAMIL ES AND OF THE FAMILIES AND INCIVIOUALS IN NEED OF THE CHURCH AND OF CHRIST IN THEIR LIVES.
- 4. THE BOARD SHALL HAVE CHARGE OF THE PREPARATION OF THE COMMUNION TABLE AND DERVICE.

SECTION 8 - FINANCES

- 1. THERE SHALL SE A FINANCE COMMITTEE OF AT LEAST ONE MEMBER FROM EVERY ORGANIZ-ATION RECOGNIZED BY THE SESSION OF THE CHURCH THROUGH ITS OWN SELECTION AND ONE MEM-BER FROM THE CONGREGATION APPOINTED BY THE FINANCE CHAIRMAN WHO SHALL BE ELECTED ANNUALLY AT THE MEETING OF THE CORPORATION. HE SHALL NOT BE THE TREASURER OR THE FINANCIAL BECRETARY.
- 2. THE FINANCE COMMITTEE SHALL, NOT LATER THAN OCTOBER 10TH EACH YEAR, PREPARE A PROPOSED SUDGET FOR THE CURRENT EXPENSES OF THE CHURCH FOR THE ENSUING YEAR.
- 3. THE SESSION SHALL PRESENT TO THE FINANCE COMMITTEE THE PROPOSED BENEVOLENCE BUGGET FOR THE ENSUING YEAR. THE CURRENT EXPENSE BUGGET AND THE BENEVOLENT BUDGET, AFTER APPROVAL BY THE FINANCE COMMITTEE, THE SESSION AND THE TRUSTEES, SHALL BE PRESENTED TO THE CONGREGATION DURING THE MONTH OF NOVEMBER OF EACH YEAR FOR CONGREG-ATIONAL APPROVAL. THE TIME AND DATE FOR SUCH MEETING TO BE AT THE DISCRETION OF THE SESSION.
- 4. THE MONEY TO BE RAISED BY THE CONGREGATION TO MEET THE BUDGETS OF THE CHURCH SHALL BE RAISED UNDER THE DIRECTION OF THE FINANCE COMMITTEE IN SUCH MANNER AS MAY BE DEEMED BEST BY THEM. THE ANNUAL EVERY MEMBER CANVASS SHALL BE MADE AT SUCH TIME AND IN SUCH MANNER AS THE FINANCE COMMITTEE DECIDES. THE RESULTS SHALL BE REPORTED TO THE CONGREGATION NOT LATER THAN THE ANNUAL MEETING OF THE CORPORATION.
- 5. No BOARD OR COMMITTEE OF THIS CHURCH MAY, WITHOUT THE CONGREGATION'S APPROVAL COLIGATE THIS CHUSCH FOR A SUM TO EXCEED \$300.00

SECTION 9 - ELECTIONS

- 1. THE REGULAR ELECTION OF OFFICERS SHALL SE HELD AT THE ANNUAL MEETINGS. VACANCIES MAY BE FILLED AT A SPECIAL MEETING CALLED FOR THAT PURPOSE OR AT REGULAR ANNUAL MEETINGS OR AS SET OUT IN SECTIONS 4,5, AND 6 OF THESE BY-LAWS.
- 2. THE ROTARY SYSTEM SHALL APPLY TO ALL OFFICERS OF ELDER, TRUSTEE AND DEACON. NO MEMBER WHO HAS SERVED A FULL TERM ON THESE BOARDS SHALL BE RE-ELECTED UNTIL THE
- 3. NOMINATIONS MAY BE BY THE RESPECTIVE BOARDS OR FROM THE FLOOR. ALL NOMINEES MUST AGREE TO BERVE BEFORE THEIR NAMES ARE PLACED BEFORE THE CONGREGATION FOR VOTING.
- 4. IF MORE PERSONS ARE NOMINATED THAN ARE REQUIRED, THE VOTING SHALL SE BY BALLOT AND A PLURALITY SHALL ELECT. IN CASE THE NOMINEES EQUAL THE PLACES TO BE FILLED, THE ENTIRE LIST MAY BE BY MOTION DULY MADE AND CARRIED.

SECTION 10 - AUDITING COMMITTEE

1. PRIOR TO THE ANNUAL MEETING EACH YEAR, THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES SHALL APPOINT AN AUDITING COMMITTEE OF TWO FOR THE ENSUING YEAR. IT SHALL BE THE DUTY OF THIS COMM-TITEE TO AUDIT THE ACCOUNTS OF ALL FINANCIAL OFFICERS OF THE CHURCH AT BUCH TIME OR TIMES AS THEY MAY DEEM ADVISABLE AND REPORT THEIR FINDINGS TO THE CONGREGATION AT THE MINUAL MEETINGS. THIS COMMITTEE MAY CONSULT WITH AND ADVISE THE FINANCIAL OFFICERS CONCERNING THE PHOPEH AND DESIGNABLE METHODS OF KEEPING FUNDS AND FINANCIAL RECORDS SECTION 11 - AMENDMENTS

1. AMENDMENTS TO THESE BY-LAWS MAY BE PROPOSED AT ANY ANNUAL OR SPECIAL MEETING OF THIS CHURCH DULY CALLED THEREFOR. A PROPOSED AMENDMENT, ALTERATION OR REPEAL SHALL SE READ AT THE MEETING AT WHICH IT IS PRESENTED AND A TWO THIRDS VOTE SHALL BE REQUIRED FOR ADOPTION OF BAID AMENOMENT, ALTERATION OR REPEAL OF THOSE BY-LAWS.

ANNUAL REPORT OF THE SESSION 1957

THE BOARD OF ELDERS MET IN REQULAR SESSION THROUGHOUT THE YEAR WITH REV. OTT AS MODERATOR AND HAVING AN AVERAGE ATTENDANCE OF TEN MEMBERS. ELEVEN SPECIAL SESSIONS WERE HELD DURING THE YEAR MAINLY FOR THE PURPOSE OF EXAMINING APPLIDANTS FOR MEMBERSHIP IN THE CHURCH. A TOTAL OF TWENTY NEW MEMBERS WERE RECEIVED INTO THE CHURCH MEMBERSHIP DURING THE YEAR. A REAL SPIRIT OF COOPERATION WAS WITHESDED THROUGHOUT THE YEAR BOTH AMONG MEMBERS OF THE BOARD AND MEMBERS OF THE CHURCH IN GENERAL.

IN JANUARY APPOINTMENTS WERE MADE FOR THE MUSIC COMMATTEE AND CHRISTIAN EDUCATION COMMITTEE FOR THE YEAR. ANDREW BREHM WAS APPOINTED AS DELEGATE TO REPRESENT THE CHURCH AT THE MID-WINTER PRESEYTERY MEETING. THE RESIGNATION OF MARTHA HOPKINS AS CHOIR DIRECTOR WAS RECEIVED AND PLANS WERE MADE FOR THE SECURING OF A NEW CHOIR DIRECTOR.

A BOARD MEETING WAS NOT HELD DURING THE MONTH OF FEBRUARY DUE TO THE ABSENCE OF THE PASTOR.

MARCH - THE PROSPECT OF MAVING SEVERAL DIFFERENT MINISTERS HOLD A REVIVAL IN OUR CHURCH WAS DISCUSSED AND APPROVED BY THE SESSION. APPROVAL OF THE SESSION WAS GIVEN TO CONTINUE BENDING OUT THE GHURCH PAPER EACH WEEK. DUE TO LACK OF FINANCES THE SUGGESTION WAS MADE TO THE TRUSTCES THAT THEY DROP THE CHURCH AD IN THE PAPER TEMPORABILLY.

APRIL - A COMMITTEE WAS APPOINTED FOR THE PURPOSE OF DRAFTING PLANS FOR CALLING ON MEMBERS OF THE NEWCOMERS LIST AND FOR MAKING A CANVASS OF THE CHURCH AREA. IT WAS DECIDED TO POSTPONE THE EVANGELISTIC SERVICES UNTIL FALL. ANDREW BREHM WAS APPOINTED DELEGATE TO THE SPRING PRESSYTERY MEETING.

MAY - THE RECOMMENDATION WAS MADE TO THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES THAT A NEW BROCHURE CONCERNING THE PROGRAM OF OUR CHURCH BE PRINTED TO BE USED WHEN CALLING ON PROSPECTIVE MEMBERS. A REPORT WAS RECEIVED FROM THE VISITATION COMMITTEE AS TO PLANS FOR MAKING CHURCH CALLS. PERMISSION FOR LEAVE OF ABSENCE AS PART OF HIS VACATION WAS GRANTED THE PASTOR FROM MAY 27 TO JUNE 8.

JUNE - THE BUILDING COMMITTEE WAS GIVEN PERMISSION TO RECOMMEND THE ENGAGING OF AN ARCHITECHURAL FIRM TO THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES FOR THE PURPOSE OF PREPARING PRE-LIMINARY WORK FOR THE NEW EDUCATIONAL BUILDING. AN INVITATION WAS RECEIVED INVITING THE PASTOR AND ALL ELDERS TO ATTEND A MEETING ON STEWARDSHIP PROMOTION AT CAMPFELLOWSHIP. THE PASTOR AND ELDERS PETE WINE AND ANDREW BREHM, ATTENDED THE MEETING.

JULY - IT WAS DECIDED TO DISMISS THE EVENING SERVICES FOR THE LAST TWO WEEKS OF JULY AND FOR THE MONTH OF AUGUST. THE SUBJECT OF HAVING OUTSIDE SPEAKERS WAS DISCUSSED. IT WAS DECIDED THAT OUTSIDE SPEAKERS BE LIMITED TO EVENING SERVICES AND THE PREQUENCY OF HAVING OUTSIDE SPEAKERS BE LEFT TO THE DISCRETION OF THE PASTOR.

ANNUAL REPORT OF THE SESSION (CONT'O) 1957

AUGUST - A COMMUNICATION WAS RECEIVED FROM THE BOARD OF FORIEGN MISSIONS STATING THAT NILLIAM H. TWING, WHOM WE HAD SEEN SUPPORTING, HAD RESIGNED. SUNDAY, SEPTEMBER 15TH, WAS SET AS THE DATE TO CONDUCT THE NEIGHBORHOOD CANVASS. PERMISSION WAS GIVEN THE PASTOR TO CONDUCT SERVICES FOR THE REV. HERBERT YOUNG FROM SEPTEMBER 23 - 28.

SEPTEMBER - IT WAS DECIDED THAT WE COOPERATE WITH OUR PRESBYTERIAN SYNOD EXECUTIVE BY HAVING THE MEN CONDUCT AN AREA CANVASS OF VALLEY CENTER ON SEPTEMBER 22ND.
THE WOMEN OF THE CHURCH WERE ASKED TO CONDUCT THE CANVASS OF THE AREA ADJACENT TO
OUR OWN CHURCH, BEGINNING SEPTEMBER 15TH.

OCTOBER - THE PASTOR WAS GIVEN PERMISSION TO CONDUCT PREACHING SERVICES AT THE HOPEWELL PRESSYTERIAN CHURCH OF ANTHONY, KANSAS, IN MARCH OF 1958.

November - A BROCHURE OF THE PLANNED EDUCATIONAL BUILDING WAS PRESENTED TO THE Session by the Moderator. It was decided to have a pledge Sumday in which pledges to both the Educational Building and the General Budget of the Church be made at the same time. It was decided that Francis Spear, after deing examined by the Session, as a gambicate for the ministry, be brought before Presentery's Committee on Christian Education when the way was clear.

DECEMBER - A NEW OFFICE, THE OFFICE OF DIRECTOR OF YOUTH ACTIVITIES, WAS CREATED AND PETE WINE WAS APPOINTED BY THE SESSION TO FILL THIS OFFICE. PERMISSION WAS GIVEN BY THE BOARD OF ELDERS TO INCREASE THE NUMBER OF TRUSTEES FROM NINE TO TWELVE MEMBERS. THE PROPOSED CHURCH SUDGET FOR 1958 WAS PRESENTED BY HOWARD RAY, AND AFTER BEING DISCUSSED, WAS APPROVED BY THE BOARD FOR PRESENTATION AT THE CONGREGATIONAL MEETING.

THE ANNUAL FALL CONGREGATIONAL MEETING WAS HELD ON TUESDAY, DECEMBER 3RD, BEGINNING WITH A COVERED DISH SUPPER AND FOLLOWED BY THE REGULAR BUSINESS MEETING. NOMINATIONS WERE MADE AND BALLOTS CAST FOR THE NEW MEMBERS OF THE BOARDS OF ELDERS, TRUSTEES AND DEACONS. R. V. OAKLEY WAS ELECTED AS HEAD USHER FOR THE YEAR OF 1958.

THE PROPOSED CHURCH SUDGET WAS PRESENTED TO THE CONGREGATION BY HOWARD RAY, CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES. AFTER SOME DISCUSSION THE CHURCH SUDGET WAS ACCEPTED.

THE FINAL MEETING OF THE YEAR WAS HELD ON DECEMBER 30TH. A SURVEY OF THE PRESENT CHURCH FILE OF MEMBERSHIP WAS MADE AND THE SESSION VOTED TO SUSPEND THE MEMBERSHIP OF THIRTY-NINE MEMBERS IN LIEU OF THE FACT THAT THEY HAD MOVED AND LEFT NO FORWARD IMATELY THREE YEARS.

IN SUMMARY, I FEEL THAT THIS HAS BEEN ANOTHER GOOD YEAR AND THAT DEFINITE PROGRESS HAS BEEN MADE. IT IS OUR HOPE AND PRAYER THAT OUR EFFORTS MAY HAVE BEEN USED IN MANY DIFFERENT WAYS TO FURTHER THE GAUSE OF OUR LORD AND SAVIOUR.

CLERK OF THE SESSION FRANCIS E. SPEAR BRETHREN IN CHRIST:

ANOTHER YEAR HAB GOME AND GONE. I PERSONALLY SELIEVE THAT 1957 HAB SEEN A SIGNIF:—
CANT YEAR IN THE SPIRITUAL LIFE OF OUR CHURCH. I HAVE SENSED A CERTAIN UPWARD TREMD
IN THE SPIRUTAL GROWTH OF INDIVIDUAL LIVES. SOME HAVE SAID. "THAT IN ORDER TO REACH
ALL WITH THE GOSPEL MESSAGE WE SHOULD TRY TO WIN ONE PERSON AT A TIME." DURING THE
YEAR WE HAVE SEEN INDIVIDUALS WHO LESS THAN THREE YEARS AGO HAD VERY LITTLE TO DO
WITH THE CHURCH WHO ARE NOW SHOWING AND EXPRESSING AMAZING INTEREST IN THE THINGS OF
GOO IN A VERY WONDERFUL WAY. BECAUSE OF THESE CERTAIN INDIVIDUALS THE OVER-ALL
SPIRITUAL TONE OF OUR CHURCH HAS ADVANCED TO A GREATER DEGREE OF COMMITMENT AND DEDICATION. OUR CHURCH BOARDS HAVE RECEIVED NEW LIFE AS NEW MATERIAL HAS SEEN UNCOVERED..
AS NEW MEN., REBORN MEN. HAVE DEDICATED THEMSELVES TO A LIFE OF SERVICE.

THE YEAR OF 1957 HAS SEEN THE ORGANIZATION OF A NEW "CHAPTER OF THE NATIONAL COUNCIL OF PRESBYTERIAN MEN." THEY HAVE HAD MANY FINE PROGRAMS OURING THE YEAR AND 1958 PROMISES TO BE A YEAR WHICH WILL SEE MANY FINE EFFORTS PUT FORTH IN ODING GREAT THINGS FOR THE KINGOOM.

OUR WOMEN'S ORGANIZATIONS HAVE DONE MUCH TO MAKE OUR WORK TO BE MORE EFFECTIVE. THE NEISHBORHOOD CANVASS CONDUCTED BY THE WOMEN OF DUR CHURCH WAS VERY HELPFUL IN SEGUR-ING INFORMATION THAT WILL ENABLE THE SESSION AND PASTOR TO PUT FORTH A PROGRAM OF EVANGELISM THIS YEAR, THAT WITH GOD'S HELP WILL BE THE WINNING OF MANY FOR THE LORD.

OUR MARINER CLUBS, BOTH THE CLIPPER AND CRUISER CLUBS HAVE BEEN VERY ACTIVE DURING THE PAST YEAR. BY TAKING GARGO THEY HAVE BEEN ABLE TO DO THINGS FOR THE CHURCH THAT NEEDED TO BE DONE.

OUR WESTMINSTER FELLOWSHIP GROUPS HAVE BEEN ACTIVE, HOLDING MEETINGS EACH WEEK AS WELL AS MONTHLY BUSINESS MEETINGS. ATTENDANCE HAS BEEN GOOD OR BETTER PERCENTAGE WIBE AS IT IS FOR BUCH GROUPS IN MOST OTHER PRESSYTERIAN CHURCHES. PERHAPS SOMETHING SHOULD BE SAID ABOUT THE YOUNG PEOPLE'S SPENDIO GOOPERATION IN REGARDS TO THE EVENING SERVICES. IF OUR EVENING SERVICES HAVE BEEN SUCCESSPUL IT HAS BEEN DUE LARGELY TO THE EFFORTS OF OUR YOUNG PEOPLE PUT FORTH IN THEIR WORK IN THE GOSPEL CHOIR.

PERHAPS SOMETHING SHOULD BE SAID ABOUT THE OVERALL MUSIC PROGRAM IN OUR CHURCH. WE HAVE SEEN SLESSED WITH EXCECDINGLY GOOD MUSIC AS OUR ORGANIST AND CHOIR DIRECTORS HAVE WORKED TIRELESSLY TO BRING US GOOD MUSIC, AND HAVE GIVEN US FAR MORE THAN THEY HAVE RECEIVED AS THEY HAVE GIVEN MANY EXTRA HOURS TO THEIR JOBS IN ORDER THAT WE MIGHT HAVE A MUSICAL PROGRAM THAT HONORS OUR LORD AND MASTER.

THE BUILDING COMMITTEE HAS BEEN VERY ACTIVE AS WE CAN NOW SEE THE FRUIT OF THEIR LABOR IN THE FINE PLANS THAT WE HAVE. THE BROCHURE COMMITTEE HAS ALSO DONE A FINE PIECE OF WORK IN COMPOSING A FINE SHOCHURE WHICH ADEQUATELY DESCRIBES THE PLANS AND MAKES US TO SE CONSCIOUS OF OUR GREAT NEED FOR SUCH A BUILDING.

OUR JUNIOR CHURCH HAS FUNCTIONED SMOOTHLY AND WE WILL BE BORRY TO LOSE OUR PRESENT DIRECTOR, MR. FRANCIS SPEAR, BUT WE ARE GLAD THAT WE ARE LOSING HIM TO A LARGER FIELD OF ACTIVITY AS HE SEEKS TO ENTER THE MINISTRY.

THE SUNDAY SCHOOL HAB SHOWN A NEW SPIRIT AS ATTENDANCE HAS INCREASED AND NEW TEACHERS HAVE BEEN ENLISTED IN THE SERVICE OF THE LORD. ALL OF THE SUNDAY SCHOOL OFFICERS AND TEACHERS AS WELL AS THE SUPERINTENDENT DESERVES MUCH PRAISE FOR THEIR WORK AND UNFAILING DEVOTION TO THE CAUSE OF CHRIST.

THE CONGREGATION AS A WHOLE DESERVES MUCH CREDIT FOR THE WAY THEY HAVE RALLIED AROUND THE CROSS OF CHRIST. AS WE APPROACHED THE SEGINNING OF 1957 WE WERE GIVEN A GREAT IDEA. THAT WE NEEDED A NEW SUILING FOR CHRISTIAN EDUCATION PURPOSES. THIS IDEA COULD BECOME A REALITY OR IT COULD HAVE PASSED ON AS ONE SUI DREAMS OURING THE NIGHT. IT ALL DEPENDED ON WHAT WE WOULD DO IN OUR FIRST YEARS TRY AT FUND RAISING.

PASTOR'S REPORT (CONT'O)

BECAUSE OF THE FAITH OF MANY IN THIS PROJECT, YOU, THE CONGREGATION, PROVED BEYOND ANY DOUBT THAT WE CAN OBTAIN THIS BUILDING, THAT WE CAN RAISE THE NECED AMOUNT; AND FURTHER MORE, AS WE ENTER INTO THE YEAR OF 1958 YOU HAVE PLEOSED MORE, NOT ONLY FOR THE BUILDING FUND BUT FOR THE FIRST TIME THAT I KNOW OF YOU HAVE SUBSCRIBED OVER \$11,000.00 TOWARD OUR SUDGET FOR 1958. THE MINISTER YIEWS ALL OF THIS AS YOUR SINCERE INDICATION OF YOUR DESIRE TO PLACE YOUR CHURCH AT THE HEAD OF YOUR LIFE.

DURING FEBRUARY THE PASTOR WAS PRIVILEDGED TO ATTEND THE MCCORMICK SEMINARY FOR A THREE WEEK COURSE IN "INDUSTRIAL RELATIONS" THAT HAS PROVED TO BE VERY HELPFUL IN PROMOTING A SETTER UNDERSTANDING OF "EMPLOYER AND EMPLOYEE", RELATIONSHIPS; ALSO GIVING THE PASTOR AN INSIGHT AS TO YOUR PROBLEMS OF MAKING A LIVING.

DURING MARCH THE PASTOR HELD EVANGELISTIC SERVICES AT THE CORWIN PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH.

THE CHURCH WAS GROWDED EACH NIGHT AND WE HAVE GOME TO KNOW SINCE THAT THE GENERAL
SPIRITUAL TONE OF THE CHURCH HAS BEEN GREATLY IMPROVED. THEY NOW HAVE MADE KNOWN
THEIR DESIRE TO HAVE ANOTHER SERIES OF SUCH SERVICES IN 1958.

THE PASTOR ALSO CONDUCTED EVANGELISTIC SERVICES AT ASH GROVE, MISSOURI, DURING WHICH TWENTY-SIX PEOPLE RAISED THEIR HANDS UPON INVITATION, AND GAVE THEIR LIVES OVER TO THE CARE AND KEEPING OF THE LORD JESUS CHRIST.

DURING OCTOBER WE HELD OUR OWN EVANGELISTIC SERVICES INCORPORATING A NEW IDEA IN EVANGELISM. USING MEN OF DIFFERENT DENOMINATIONS TO BRING THE MESSAGE EACH NIGHT. OUR CHURCH RECEIVED MUCH SPIRITUAL FOOD FROM THESE GREAT MEN OF GOD.

SPECIAL LETTERS HAVE BEEN MAILED TO THE BOARDS OF THE CHURCH, THE SANGTUARY CHOIR, AND THE GUEST MINISTERS WHO MINISTERS TO US DURING THE EVANGELISTIC CAMPAIGN HELD IN THE FALL.
