19. Set forth the facts or information that you think should enter into an inspection report on the kinds of livestock above indicated by you when inspected for loan purposes:

Actual number of stock offered as collateral, its breeding, age and grade; the brand, ear mark and title. The inspector should also satisfy himself that the land and equipment of the applicant is suitable for the running of the livestock inspected, that there is an ample supply of feed and water and that the applicant understands the business. The character and financial responsibility of the applicant should be investigated along with the record of his past experience in the livestock business. The applicant's cost of operation over a period of years, his usual annual losses during this time and his gross returns from the livestock should all be considered in judging the risk of a livestock loan.

20. State the usual diseases and other conditions that affect the value of the kinds of livestock that you are qualified to inspect for loan purposes:

Haemorrhagic septicemia, black leg, lice and ticks, foot rot, blow flies and scab.
