# HISTORY

of

## XI DELTA PI SORORITY

Though the Xi Delta Pi Social Sorority had its founding in the second month of 1932 when La Verne Stephenson Everett entertained a group of girls at bridge, the Kansas State Charter Board did not issue the charter until one year later on the 6th of February, 1933. CONSTITUTION  
of  
XI DELTA PI SORORITY

---

ARTICLE I—Name.

Section 1. The name of this organization shall be the Xi Delta Pi SorORITY.

ARTICLE II—Purpose.

Section 1. The purpose of this organization shall be to promote social intercourse, friendship and good will among the members.

ARTICLE III—Membership.

Section 1. All members of the SorORITY must be graduates of high school.

Section 2. Bids for membership shall be issued to only those girls who have been selected by a vote of the active members. Two opposing votes are necessary to prevent the issuance of a bid.

ARTICLE IV—Officers.

Section 1. The officers of this SorORITY shall consist of a president, vice-president, secretary, treasurer, and a member of the inter-chapter council.

Section 2. Officers shall be elected from those who have been officially recognized by formal initiation.

Section 3. Officers shall be elected by active members of the SorORITY and shall hold office for one year.

Section 4. The president and one person so-elected shall be members of the inter-chapter council which shall have charge of all matters pertaining to the SorORITY as a whole.

ARTICLE V—Meetings and Quorum.

Section 1. Regular meetings of the SorORITY shall be held each Tuesday evening.

Section 2. Special meetings may be called by the president or on application of at least five members; the president shall call such meeting.

Section 3. Any number of members over one-half of the active membership in the SorORITY shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

ARTICLE VI—Songs and Devotional.

Section 1. The songs, "Star of Our Loyalty," "Xi Delta Pi, Hail to Thee," and "Xi Delta Pi Hymn" by Marguerite Schrenk McMahon shall be the official songs of the Xi Delta Pi Social SorORITY.

Section 2. The SorORITY prayer as written by Ina Carlson Frymire and Thelma Lee Davis shall be a part of the devotional at each meeting.

AMENDMENTS TO THE CONSTITUTION

AMENDMENT I—Amending Art. 4, Section 4.

All past presidents shall automatically become inter-chapter council members at the termination of their presidency, with the privilege of tendering their resignation.

AMENDMENT II—Amending Art. 5, Section 1.

a. Regular meetings of the SorORITY shall be held one evening each week for a period of one hour and fifteen minutes.

b. Regular business meetings shall begin with the second meeting day in September and close with the second meeting in June. Summer meetings shall be optional with the membership of respective chapters.

## BY-LAWS

### ARTICLE I—Duties of Officers.

Section 1. The duty of the president shall be to preside at all meetings of the Sorority, to appoint committees, and to perform all the duties usually pertaining to her office.

Section 2. In the absence or disability of the president, the vice-president shall perform all duties of the president. The vice-president shall also have charge of newspaper publicity and the scrap book.

Section 3. The secretary shall keep the minutes of all proceedings and record the same. She shall give notice of all meetings.

Section 4. The treasurer shall receive and safely keep all funds of the organization and shall pay out the same only on the order of the president, who is subject to the wishes of the members. She shall make a monthly written report of receipts and disbursements.

### ARTICLE II—Election of Officers.

Section 1. Officers shall be nominated by a nominating committee consisting of three members of the Sorority elected at the last meeting in April. The names submitted by the committee shall be voted upon by the members in secret ballot. A majority vote of all members shall be necessary for election to office. The candidates shall be announced by the nominating committee at the second meeting in May.

Section 2. A two-thirds vote of the entire membership will be necessary to nominate anyone besides those nominated by the nominating committee.

Section 3. Officers shall be elected at the last meeting in May and shall be installed at the first September meeting.

Section 4. No person may serve more than two terms in succession.

### ARTICLE III—Membership

Section 1. All active members shall be permitted to invite guests to all rush parties, the number of guests to be invited to each party to be determined by the members.

Section 2. Before a girl can be elected to membership in the Sorority, she must first serve a period of pledgeship—this period to continue for four months from the date of pledge service. At the end of that period, she is either accepted or rejected for membership in the Sorority. Two opposing votes are necessary to disqualify her for membership.

Section 3. Resignation from membership shall be in writing and no resignation shall be accepted from a member not in good and regular standing.

### ARTICLE IV—Dues.

Section 1. Pledge fee shall be \$5.00 (including pin).

Section 2. Initiation fee shall be \$5.00 and approximately \$10.00 for pin.

Section 3. Annual dues shall be \$6.00.

Section 4. Any member three months arrears in payment of dues shall be automatically dropped from the Sorority.

### ARTICLE V—Meetings.

Section 1. A member shall be fined fifty cents (50c) for an unexcused absence.

Section 2. Any member absent for three consecutive meetings without excuse shall be automatically dropped from the list of members.

Section 3. The secretary of the chapter must be notified of the absence before meeting if the absence is to be excused.

Section 4. The president and the secretary together shall determine whether or not a reason for absence is excusable.

Section 5. A member shall be allowed one unexcused absence each month.

Section 6. If it is found at any time that a member has given a false excuse for absence that member shall be immediately dropped from the rolls of the Sorority.

Section 7. Three consecutive excused absences shall count as one unexcused absence.

Section 8. Regular business meetings shall be scheduled from 8:00 P.M. to 9:15 P.M. Anyone leaving before that time without an accepted excuse shall be marked as absent without excuse for that meeting.

#### ARTICLE VI—Committees.

Section 1. The president shall be empowered to appoint such special committees as she deems needful at any time, or on vote of members at any meeting shall appoint committees they suggest. The president shall be ex-officio member of all committees.

#### ARTICLE VII—Amendments.

Section 1. These By-Laws may be amended at any meeting by a two-thirds vote—a quorum being present.

#### ARTICLE VIII—Parliamentary Authority.

Section 1. "Roberts' Rules of Order" shall be the parliamentary authority on all matters not covered by the Constitution and By-Laws of this organization.

#### ARTICLE IX—Suspension of By-Laws.

Section 1. In case of emergency By-Laws may be suspended by unanimous vote of those present at the meeting, if a quorum is present.

#### ARTICLE X—Black-Ball.

Section 1. Charges upon which a girl may be black-balled are misconduct, delinquent dues, or any specific charge which, in the opinion of the Inter-Chapter Council, would constitute a black-ball.

Section 2. Any chapter may submit to the Inter-Chapter Council the name of a member for black-ball, said name to be voted upon by secret ballot in the Inter-Chapter Council meeting.

Section 3. Any active member placed on the black-ball list may be notified by letter from Inter-Chapter Council at the discretion of the Council.

#### ARTICLE XI

If and when a Gamma Chapter is formed, each active chapter will contribute \$10.00 per chapter, and the charter members of the Gamma Chapter will be allowed \$2.50 per person from their respective chapters, toward the forming of a treasury for the Gamma Chapter.

The forming of a Gamma Chapter is subject to the approval of the Inter Chapter Council.

#### ARTICLE XII

Joint Officers' meetings shall be held the first Monday, every other month, preceding the joint meeting of all chapters.

#### ARTICLE XIII

The name of any Honorary Member who joins another local sorority shall be dropped from the list of Honorary Members.

#### ARTICLE XIV

Representatives of the respective chapters will preside in alternation over the Inter-Chapter Council Meetings.

## AMENDMENTS TO THE BY-LAWS

### AMENDMENT I—Amending Art. 1—Add.

Duties of the inter-chapter council representatives shall include those of:

Contacting new members, keeping history cards of all members, arranging calendars, black-ball list, compiling of the Year Book, making a regular review of the Constitution, reporting on meetings held by the council and any other duties so imposed by the membership of the Sorority.

### AMENDMENT II—Amending Art. 3—Section 2.

Each candidate for membership shall be required to pass the Xi Delta Pi "Examination for Active Membership" before becoming actively affiliated with the Sorority.

### AMENDMENT III—Amending Art. 5—Section 8.

Regular business meetings shall be one hour and fifteen minutes—the set time to be that best suited to the needs of each particular chapter.

### AMENDMENT IV—Amending Art. 3—Add.

The term honorary member shall include any past president or charter member who has left the Sorority in good standing; an associate member includes any member, other than honorary or inactive members, who has left the Sorority in good standing, an associate member being required to pay one-half her dues and she, in turn, receiving all bulletins and invitations issued by her respective group. The term inactive member shall include those girls except honorary or associate members who have left the Sorority in good standing, who do not care to retain their membership nor pay half their dues; if, at any time, they decide to re-enter and become active members, they shall be required to pay a reinstatement fee of \$2.50. Any girl included in the above classifications automatically loses her vote.

## SPECIAL NOTICES

Tea and Coffee Services may be used free by members only, or they may be rented to non-members for a fee of \$4.00, to be returned in three days. Inactive Member in good standing may rent same for a fee of \$1.00. Rental Fee is to be divided equally between chapters. Individual who uses any part or all of services should see that they are cleaned before they are returned.

Tea and Coffee Services.

Printer's Cut of Sorority Crest.

Sorority Members are to pay for the following, whether present or not:

Rush Tea and all Rush Affairs.  
Founder's Day.

Rush Tea—Corsages for guests shall be paid for by their respective chapters, other expenses will be pro-rated on active membership of each chapter.

Fall Dance—Pro-rated on active membership of each chapter, pledges not included, whether members are present or not.

Christmas Dance—Pro-rated on active membership and pledges of each chapter.

Founder's Day—Pro-rated on active members and guests present.

Formal Initiation—Each chapter shall bear the expense for dinners of all their members and pledges present; each paying for the corsages of their respective pledges. Miscellaneous expense to be pro-rated on those present at the dinner.

No Christmas Bids are given to any member, if her dues are not up-to-date.
