The members of the Atton Cemiterial Corporation at Clearcreek School House when the following persons were elected as permanant officers President W. S. Johnson Treasurer Albin Minnick Secretary G. H. Rhoads. after which the following business was transacted by vote of the ^{majority of the} members present.

Annual meeting to held at Clearcreek School House on the same day of the annual School Election. The Cemetary was located on the North ^{west} corner of the North West $\frac{1}{4}$ quarter of Sec (12) Twp 28 of Range 28 West. The ground to commence 130 feet from or inside the north and the same inside the west line and run 19 sixteen rods east thence 10 ten rods south, thence 16 sixteen rods west thence 10 rods north to place of starting. In consideration of the fact that G. H. Rhoads donated the above ground in consideration of one Burial lot he G. H. Rhoads was allowed first choice of lots when said grounds should be platd. Committee on By laws. C. C. Bangison, Al Minnick and J. L. Smith who were to have the privilage of calling a lawyer to assist them. Committee on Plat of ground W. S. Johnson, Al Minnick & C. C. Bangison.

Corporation met as per call of the President when the following Business was enacted by a majority vote of the Members Present.

The lots to be (10) Sixteen feet square with a (5) five foot ^{border} on the North, a (2) foot Border on the East, (1) Seven foot Border on the west and ^{two} ~~one~~ foot space on the south for fence, and (8) eight foot walk running through the center each way East & west, North & South. Six five foot walks running east and west between lots and (10) Ten five foot walks running North and South between lots, that (5) five Hole lots & (5) five Half lots in the south east corner of the grounds and south east of lots & half lots be and are here by set a part as a Potter field, it was decided to sell the lots at a uniform price of \$500 - ^{if not come first offered} five dollars each. W.S. Johnson was elected to draw up plat of the grounds one for recording and one or more for reference.

it was decided to Build a Picket fence, the Pickets 3 1/2 feet long by 2 1/2 inches wide, with 8 inch Bass board, it was decided, to take a note from persons wishing lots who could not pay cash, the notes to run till Oct 1st with interest from date.

The Pres appointed C.C. Vangrison, of H. Pike & A. Smith as a committee to ascertain what the fencing would cost and what it would cost to have the wood work done by a carpenter, a motion prevailed that of H. Rhoads authorized to sell lots

Any Person may become a member of this association by buying and paying for a burial lot.

The Officers of this Association shall consist of A President, Secretary and Treasurer who shall be elected (at a regular annual meeting) for a Period of one year or till their successors are elected.

Also Seven Directors who shall be elected and at the same time and in the same manner and to hold their office for one year, out of which the Pres. Sec. and Treas shall be selected

Art 2nd Duties of officers

The President shall (when present) preside over all meeting of the Association. Preserve order and perform such other duties as usually devolve upon a Presidents officer. ^{Art 3rd} It shall be the duty of the Treas to receive any and ^{all} moneys of the Association, keep a true acct of the same and pay the same out, only, or upon a order signed by the President and secretary

Art 4 It shall be the duty of the Secretary to keep a true record of all Meeting and other Business of the ass. to care for all Papers belonging to the Association and deliver the same to his successor in office. ^{Art 5} The President may call a special meeting any time he may deem it necessary and it shall be his duty to do so when requested

to do so by any two Directors of the association
 art 6th Five Members of this association shall ~~also~~
 constitute a quorum for the transaction of
 business, art 7 A notice of a special meeting
 shall be give by Posting a written noti-
